

## THE LIBATION

The Life of the Apostle Paul was totally dedicated o Christ. All his strength was to be used to make Christ known to the whole world. All must know Jesus Christ and attain the salvation promised by Him-this was the driving force in Paul' life. It was his ardent love for Christ that carried him through trials and tribulations. After his conversion in 36 A.D., Paul spent about thirty years spreading the message of Christ all through the Roman Empire.

Paul visited the Churches he established as often as possible. He remained in constant contact with the elders and Deacons he had appointed in each of the Churches. A good portion of his time during the second and third journeys was spent in visiting the Churches, strengthening them and helping them to grow in their faith.

As years passed, the Christian communities confronted numerous problems. They were faced with opposition from the Jews as well as the gentiles. At the same time there were internal conflicts. In the face of mounting oppositions, people began to question their faith. They needed directions in the areas of faith, morality and administration. In response to these needs of the various local churches, Paul wrote many letters of which we have got thirteen as part of the Bible.

The first two missionary journeys of Paul started and ended in Antioch, capital of Syria. The third journey also started in Antioch but ended in Jerusalem. There is much in common between the "Jerusalem Journey" of Jesus and Paul. Jesus went to Jerusalem, seeing the Cross ahead of Him. The Jews arrested and handed him over to the gentiles who crucified him. Paul was warned many times that he would be persecuted in Jerusalem but he proceeded with more fervor to suffer for the Lord and to

become one with Him. Just as Jesus, Paul too was eventually killed by the Romans.

Upon reaching Jerusalem in 58 A.D., Paul had the same kind of experience as Jesus. The Jewish leaders arrested him, put him on trial and tried to kill him. He too was accused of misleading the people. Just as Jesus, Paul was handed over to the Romans. The trials that followed and the journey to Rome provided Paul many more opportunities to proclaim the Good News.


Apostles Peter and Paul offered their lives as an acceptable sacrifice to the Lord. This book is called "Liberation" because it depicts their martyrdom in Rome. From the human point of view, the death of the martyrs may seem to be foolish but it is the fulfillment of Christian life. Through martyrdom one enters into the joy of the resurrection of Jesus Christ who has attained victory over death.









Paul returned to Antioch and after some time started his third missionary journey. He visited all the Churches he had started in the province of Asia and reached Ephesus.









They were baptized in the name of Jesus and when Paul laid hands on them, the Holy Spirit came upon them.










Paul rented the lecture hall of Tyranus and continued to preach there from 11:AM to 4:00 P.M. The rest of the time he worked for a living.














Everybody in Ephesus heard about this and believed in Jesus Christ. A number of people who had practiced Magic burned their books in public.




## Timothy returned from Corinth.


































Paul went to Troas by Ship. On the first day of the week, in the evening, the brethren gathered to break bread.













They all rejoiced that Euthychus was alive. At day-break Paul took leave of them. He reached Caesarea by sea and stayed with Philip, the deacon.

























Just as Paul was being taken to the Fortress Antonia, he asked permission to speak to the people.









## The tribune kept Paul in the fortress and the next day brought him before the Sanhedrin.








Upon hearing this, a dispute broke out between the Pharisees who believed in the resurrection and Sadducees who did not.




Hearing about a conspiracy of the Jews against Paul the tribune transferred Paul to Caesarea.








# After another trial before Herod Aggrippa, Paul was sent to Rome by ship.



Because the wind was against them, the ship sailed at a slow pace. A hurricane burst on them.















While in prison Paul wrote to the Churches in Ephesus and Philippi. After being released he visited the Churches he had founded in Philippi.

My life is almost over. Time has come for me pour out my blood as a Libation over the sacrifice you offer to the Lord.








Paul wrote to Thimothy and Titus reminding them of their pastoral responsibilities. One day in Troas.





### Paul was imprisoned in Rome. After the first trial:
