## NEWCASTLE SCD FESTIVAL

## REGULATIONS

- 1. There will be a maximum of 50 entries with no more than ten entries in classes 3 and 4. As soon as the maximum is reached no further entries will be accepted. A waiting list will be used in case any entry withdraws.
- 2. Entry is by online form via the Registration page of the Newcastle Festival website. Payment of the entry fee is required to secure entries. Entries which cannot be accommodated due to capacity will be refunded in full. Entries withdrawn by teams will be entitled to a 50% refund of entry fees. Entries must be received on or before **16 November 2025.**
- 3. Restrictions
  - i) Competitors should not take part in more than one team in each class
  - ii) Teams in two classes with an overlap of dancers must perform different dances.
- 4. Teams should normally consist of four couples, except in the Display Class. Teams of three couples may be accepted if the Organising Committee is informed in advance and space is available.
- 5. For all classes except the display
  - i) All dances are to be chosen from RSCDS publications as listed in the latest edition of the RSCDS Index to Formations and Movements
  - ii) Dance choice must be made by online form via the Newcastle Festival website by 21 December 2025
  - iii) Dances will normally be performed four times through
  - iv) Each chosen dance must show both setting and travelling steps.
  - v) The level of difficulty of a chosen dance will be taken into account.
- 6. Competitors should provide their own music. If using recorded music, this must be emailed to info@thenewcastlefestival.co.uk at least two weeks before the Festival, carefully annotating which entry the recording applies to. A keyboard will be made available to those wishing to use one.
- 7. The Organising Committee will decide the running order of the classes and the order of teams will be decided by ballot. The final programme will be published at least two weeks before the Festival.
- 8. Competitors who fail to appear at their designated time will forfeit their right to compete.
- 9. In all competitive classes, the Adjudicators will place the first three competitors in each class and announce their marks. Marks and general comments will appear on the adjudication sheets for each team and these may be collected at the end of the festival.
- 10. In non-competitive classes, general comments will appear on the participation sheet for each team and these may be collected at the end of the festival.
- 11. The decision of the Adjudicators shall be final.
- 12. The Organising Committee reserves the right to alter, modify or cancel any of the arrangements for the Festival if this is deemed necessary or expedient.
