1. The approximate gardening season runs from mid-April through October depending on weather -gardeners will receive an email with plot assignments

2. Gardeners are responsible for the weeding and maintenance of their plots to prevent weeds from spreading to adjacent plots. If you are not able to maintain your plot, please enlist the help of others and notify the Garden Stewards.

3. Material to be composted must be placed in the designated areas.

4. All paths must be kept clear.

5. All plots must be in active use by May 30. Please notify the garden stewards if you cannot make that deadline or do not think you will be gardening this season.

6. multiple hose connections are on site to provide water.

7. Gardeners are asked to help keep the common areas of the gardens tidy and may be asked to participate in a Community Garden workday.

8. Only organic fertilizers may be used. No chemical herbicides, pesticides or fungicides. Please familiarize yourself with proper organic farming methods or ask the garden stewards for advice before applying any remedies

9. there are plenty of wood chips for the walkways around your plot

10. Structures over 6' are not permitted in the garden.

11. a two-week quarantine is placed on all store bought bagged garden soil

12. Do not discard, store, or plant anything outside your plot

13. The Town of Bellingham is not responsible for stolen or damaged personal property from the garden.
