

South Monterey County Training Net Control Script (WedNet)

Net Announcement (5-Minute Warning)

This announcement should be made about five minutes before the start of the net.

“This is the South Monterey County Training Net Control.

The net will begin in approximately five minutes at 1900 hours local time.

A clear frequency would be appreciated. Thank you.”

(Pause to allow early check-ins.)

Preamble (Net Start)

“The South Monterey County Training Net is now starting at 1900 hours local time.

Good evening, area residents and guests.

This is [Your Call Sign], [Your Name], serving as your Net Control Station for this session of the net.

I am operating from [Your Location].”

“This training net meets every Wednesday at 1900 hours local time on the KR6JE repeater, located on Williams Hill — frequency 443.800 MHz, PL 127.3. This repeater is linked to KR6JE VHF and UHF systems on Fremont Peak.”

“This is a directed net. Please do not transmit unless instructed to do so by Net Control.”

(Pause briefly)

Purpose of the Net

“The purpose of the Wednesday Training Net is to help new operators gain on-air experience, learn the capabilities and limitations of portable and fixed equipment, and understand how to operate effectively using the KR6JE repeater system linked with Fremont Peak.

We thank the Fremont Peak Repeater Association for allowing us the use of their repeaters. This net also provides training in radio procedures and serves as a means to exchange information related to community and amateur radio activities.”

Transmission Reminder

“Please remember to hold your push-to-talk (PTT) button for about three seconds before speaking to allow all three linked repeaters to synchronize. Failure to do so may cut off the beginning of your transmission.”

“When checking in, please speak slowly and clearly so Net Control can record your call sign, name, and location accurately.”

"All licensed operators are welcome to join the net. We also encourage everyone to take a turn at Net Control in the future."

Emergency Traffic

"Before we begin check-ins, is there any emergency or priority traffic? If so, call signs only please. Go ahead."

(Handle any emergency or priority traffic before continuing.)

Check-Ins

1. Area Residents:

"We will now begin check-ins for area residents. Please state your call sign, name, and if you have any announcements or traffic for the net.

I will now call the roll."

(Acknowledge each check-in and record it on your roster.)

Optional Roll Call Procedure:

- "Let's start with members whose call sign suffixes fall between ALPHA through HOTEL. Please go now."

- "Now we'll take members with suffixes INDIA through PAPA. Please go ahead."

- "Finally, any members with suffixes QUEBEC through ZULU, please check in now."

(Net Control repeats and confirms all copied call signs.)

2. Announcements or Traffic:

"Are there any announcements or traffic for the net? Call signs only, please. Go ahead."

3. Late or Missed Check-Ins:

"Are there any late or missed members wishing to check in? Go ahead."

4. Visitors:

"Any visitors are invited to check in at this time. Please give your call sign, first name, and general location."

Closing the Net

"I am pleased to report a total of [Number] check-ins for this evening's net.

This concludes this session of the South Monterey County Training Net, ending at [Time] hours local time.

This is [Your Call Sign], thanking everyone for their participation and support. Good night, and this frequency is now returned to normal amateur use."
