

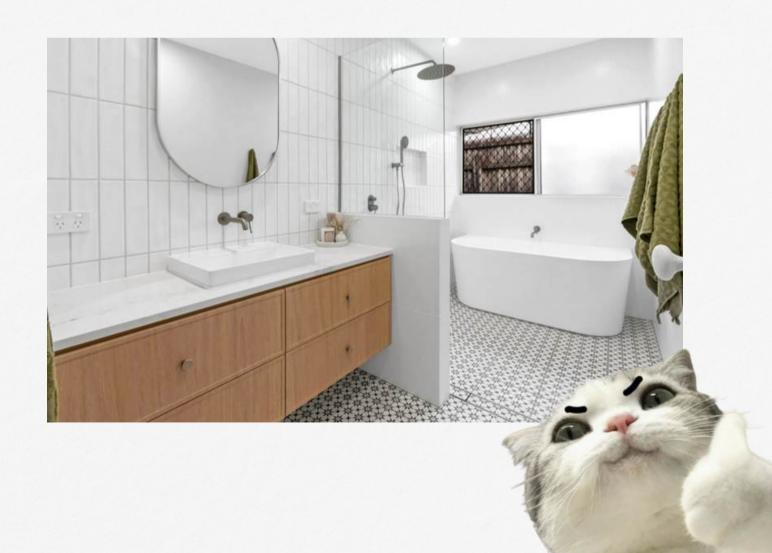
Guide: 6 Tips for Winning Clients with Visual Proposals

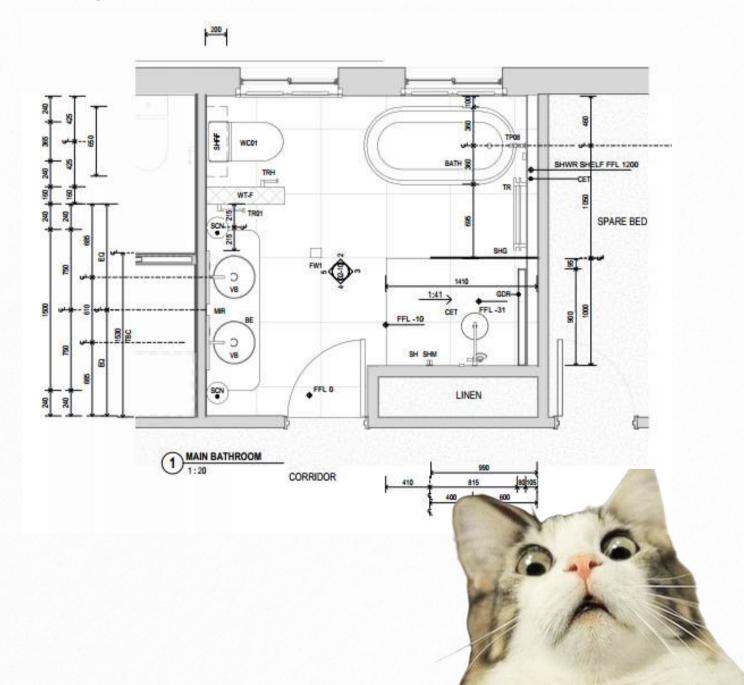

- Helps builders stand out against competitors who rely only on plain drawings.



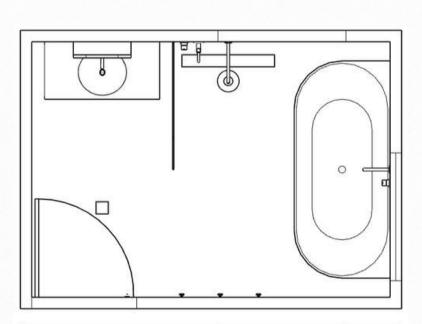


1. The Power of *Colored Plans*

- Helps you stand out from competitors who only provide 2D drawings.

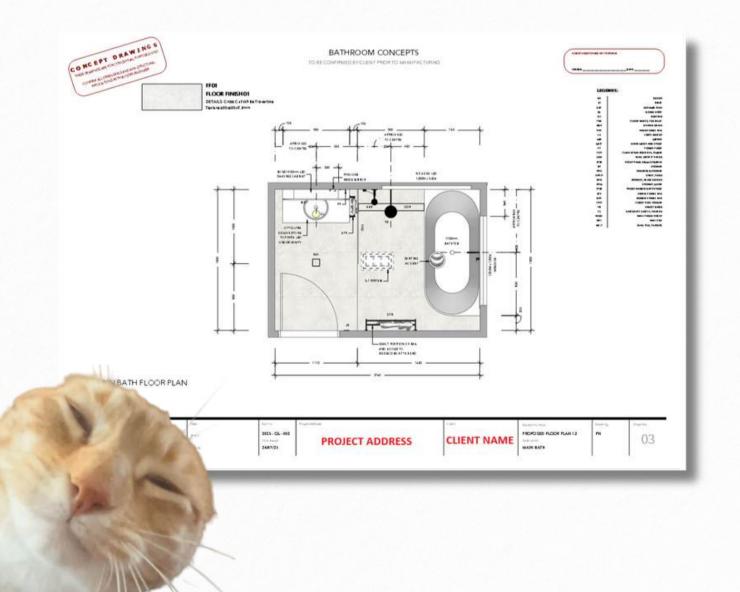


4. Presenting with a

A properly branded title block not only keeps information clear but also reinforces your credibility every time your plans are shared or printed.



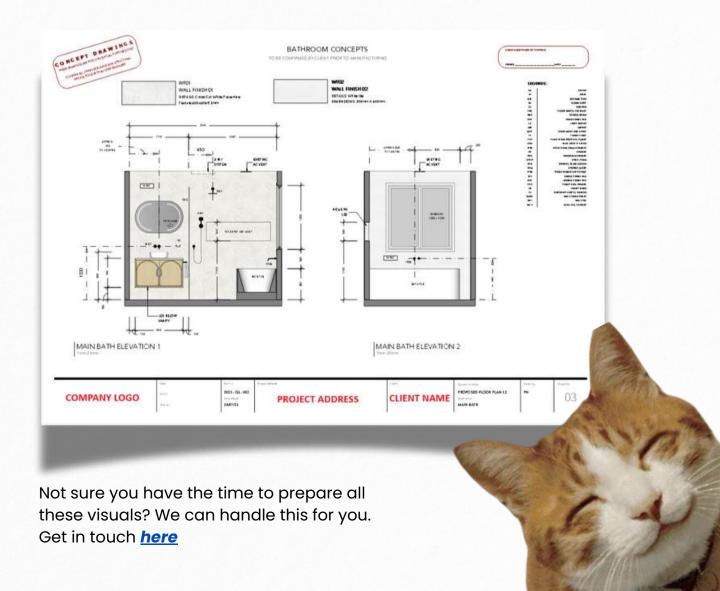

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6. Follow a Quick *Pitch Checklist*

Here's a reliable structure to follow:

- Include a floor plan plus a colored layout that highlights finishes.
- Add 1-2 realistic render of the most important views.
- Provide a short walkthrough or animation if available.
- Keep the package simple, clear, and centered on the client's priorities.
- End with a summary of inclusions to avoid hidden assumptions.
