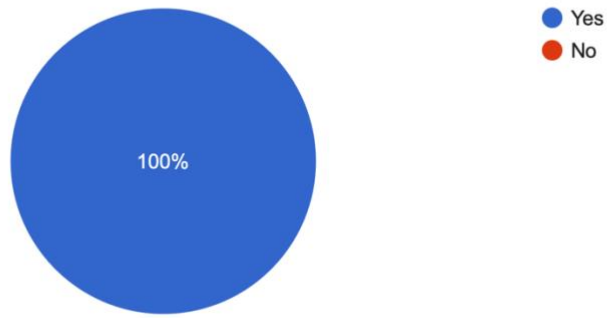

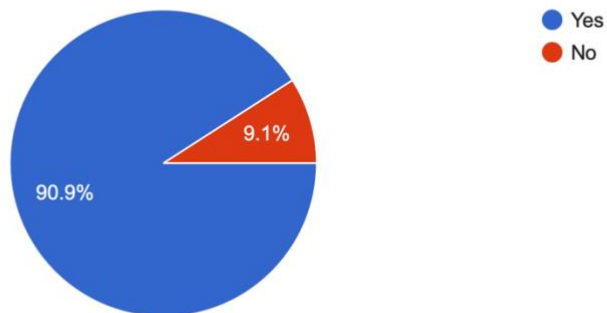
Knowing the purpose of this survey, do you volunteer to take it?

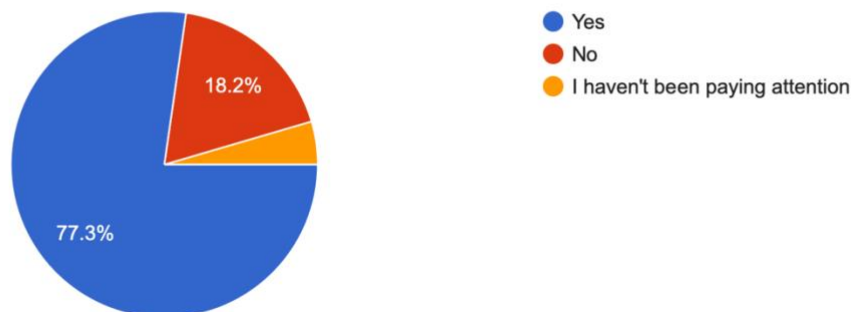
Do you currently attend Whatcom Community College?

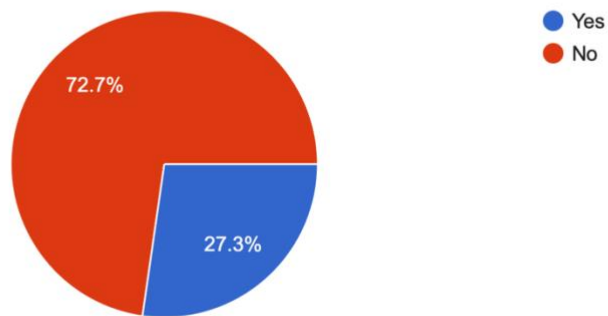
Have you recently seen someone near you using their phone while driving?

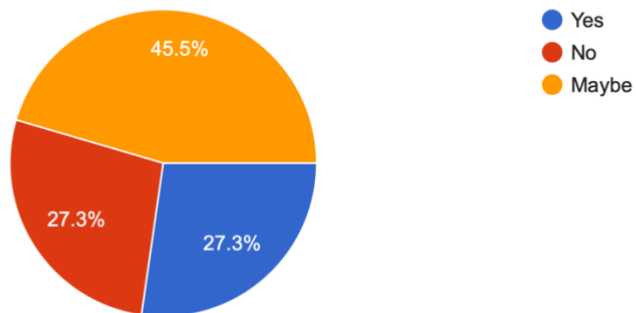
Did you know that a driver can get fined for texting at a red light?

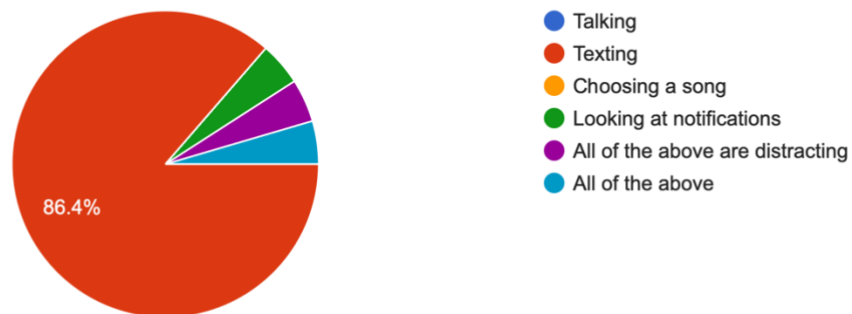
According to the Washington Department of Licensing, talking or sending text messages while holding a wireless device carries a \$124 fine. Does it deserve a heavier fine?

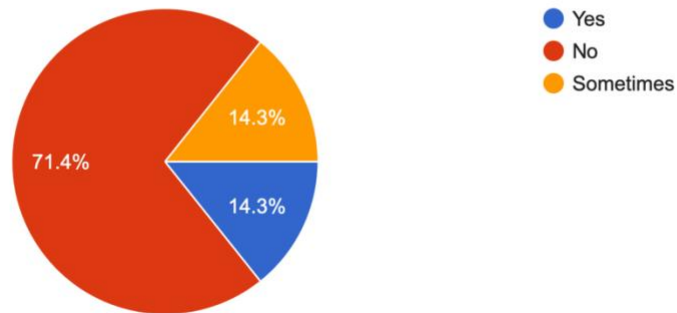

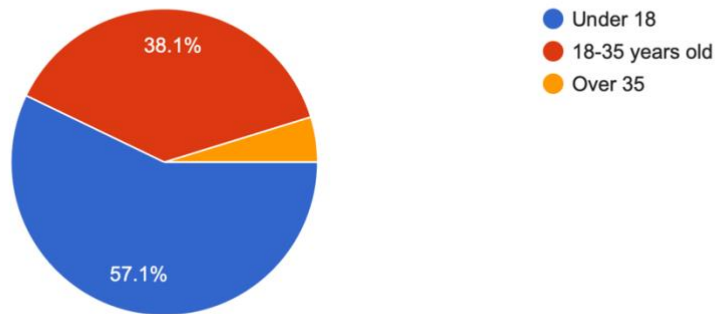
Do you use a phone application or feature that restrict or limit access while driving?

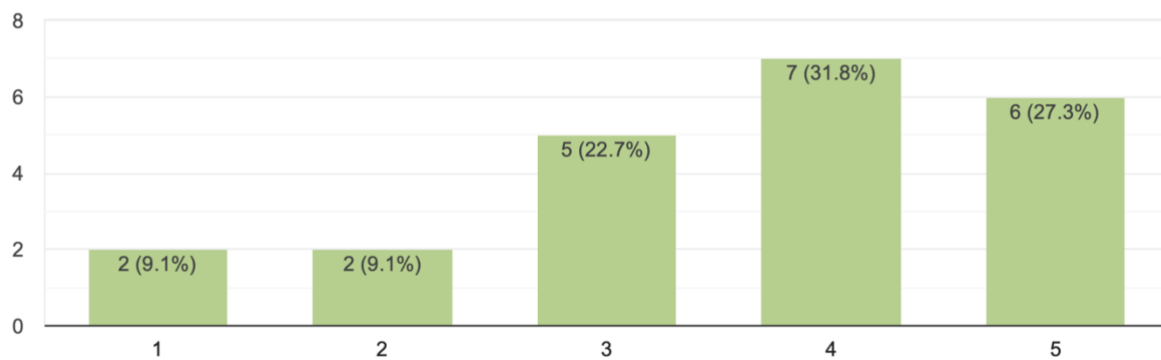
At what age did you start driving?

Even if you only use your phone for a few seconds while driving, how dangerous is it?

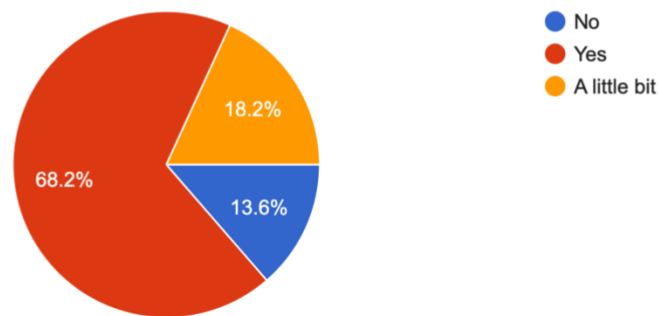
