

Situation Report #1: 2025 Texas Flooding

July 6, 2025

OVERVIEW

Severe flash flooding across Central Texas- including Kerr, Kendall, Burnet, Llano, and Tom Green counties- resulted from intense rainfall (10 to 12 inches in a matter of hours). The Guadalupe River exceeded 29 feet, causing widespread infrastructure damage and multiple fatalities. Emergency operations remain active.

POWER AND UTILITY STATUS

There are **no widespread power outages** in Kerr County or surrounding areas. Electricity services remain stable, with only isolated disruptions reported by the Kerrville Public Utility Board in Southeast Kerrville, Center Point, and Hunt. No utility-related disruptions to medical operations have been reported (Kerr County Lead).

HOSPITALS AND ACUTE CARE

- Peterson Regional Medical Center and the broader Peterson Health system, which operates 18 facilities across nine counties, remain fully operational.
- HRA has spoken directly with Peterson Health, which confirmed no change in
 operational status across its facilities. Emergency, inpatient, outpatient, and specialty
 services continue as normal (<u>Peterson Health</u>).
- No licensed hospital or clinic closures have been reported in the region.

COMMUNITY CLINICS AND OUTPATIENT SERVICES

- Peterson Community Care Clinic continues to serve uninsured and underinsured patients.
- Peterson Urgent Care and the Medical Plaza remain open.

- Pevehouse Ambulatory Care Center is fully operational, offering outpatient imaging, rehabilitation, surgery, wound care, and lab services.
- The Cailloux Professional Building continues hosting specialty services including cardiology, women's health, and vascular surgery.
- The **Raphael Community Free Clinic** at 1807 Water Street is presumed operational but not yet directly confirmed; outreach is ongoing (<u>Raphael Clinic</u>).

VETERANS AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES

- Kerrville VA Medical Center remains open and is providing full services including primary care, mental health, geriatrics, dental, and dialysis (VA South Texas).
- Kerr County Mental Health Center and Kerrville State Hospital continue psychiatric and crisis stabilization services with no reported disruptions.

FEDERALLY QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTERS (FQHCS)

There are **24 FQHCs within a 50-mile radius** of Kerrville serving low-income, uninsured, and underinsured patients.

- Operational status for these centers is still being assessed.
- HRA is coordinating with regional partners, clinic associations, and public health agencies to confirm access and capacity.

Feeding operations are supported by the Southern Baptists of Texas. Medical care at shelters remains limited. Triage, behavioral health, and chronic care needs are being evaluated in coordination with EMS and NGO partners.

POPULATION AND DEMOGRAPHICS

Kerrville (City)

RESCUE AND CASUALTY FIGURES

- Over 850 individuals have been rescued across affected counties.
- **59 confirmed fatalities**, including 21 children.
- 12 individuals remain missing, including 11 campers and one counselor from Camp Mystic.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND ACCESS

Road closures are significantly affecting access to medical care and shelters. Confirmed impassable routes include:

- Arcadia Loop
- Guadalupe Street
- Thompson Drive (most sections)
- Rio Robles
- Riverside Drive

These closures are confirmed by local emergency services and city authorities. Bridge inspections are ongoing, and travel remains hazardous in several rural zones.

WEATHER OUTLOOK

July 6-7:

- Heavy thunderstorms with localized downpours and renewed flash flood risk.
- Forecast conditions may further restrict access to affected areas and delay recovery operations.

July 8-12:

- Weather expected to stabilize.
- Partly sunny with daytime highs in the low 90s and overnight lows in the low 70s.
- Conditions favorable for expanded assessments and mobilization of resources
