



Every night in New Delhi, Uday Kumar (UK) answers panicked calls to the Goldmine Crypto GB Helpline fantasising about being British himself, filling his YouTube channel with visions of a sophisticated new life of affluence, fish and chips and tea with the royals. Then a chance conversation one tea break reveals how he might make it all a reality. And At dawn a mere week later, he leaves the call centre for ever and boards his first ever flight, to take his place amongst the English.

What happens next is the subject of Mohit Mathur's hilarious and poignant one- man- play of high hopes humbled in Hounslow and an Influencer stripped of influence amidst the brutal reality of the UK care sector, asking how and why, each year, hundreds of young men like UK vanish without trace.

A rare chance to rethink much you've assumed about those who hope to live amongst us in a first piece from an exciting new playwright and west end performer, in collaboration with one the UKs most experienced theatre makers.






Mohit Mathur

Mohit Mathur is a neurodivergent Indian actor/dancer/theatre maker, and has performed extensively in the West End in the UK, as well as throughout multiple international tours. He will be touring NMACC in December with the show Life of Pi. He is a part of the Flute Theatre Acting Company in the UK, A project aiming at pushing the boundaries of performing Shakespeare to audiences and participants with autism. Recently he performed in the Craiova Shakespeare festival and Serbia with their Main Stage show of Midsummer Nights Dream.

He has worked with Welsh National Opera's new opera "Migrations" as a consultant and dance captain with the theme of Indian migrant doctors in the UK in the 1970s.

Phil Willmott

Phil Willmott is a highly regarded British director, playwright, composer, dramaturg, and arts journalist known for his versatility in theatre. His work spans classical and modern plays, musical theatre, and new writings. He has a reputation for directing both well-known classics and innovative productions, often with an international perspective. Notably, he is also a former co-head of musical theatre training at ArtsEd, one of the UK's prominent drama schools. As an award-winning theatre maker, Phil has been particularly influential in London's theatre scene and has directed numerous productions across different genres.



WHY THIS SHOW?

Writer's personal statement

Growing up in India, I always believed that moving abroad would transform my life. Dial 1 for UK explores this hope, shared by millions who see the West as the answer to all their problems. Yet the reality, once you arrive, is often far from the dream.

This story, rooted in my own experiences of racism and resilience, demanded an authentic voice, one I could only capture by writing it myself. Through Vital Exposure's Writing Program, I began shaping this piece to share that journey.

Dial I for UK opened at the Edinburgh Fringe this year ahead of its planned UK tour. As part of its development, it was also showcased in Canada, Mumbai, and London to explore how audiences connected with the story. The project has since received support from Arts Council England's NLPG to further develop the production with enhanced lighting and sound design, while also reaching out to local communities.
