HOW DO WE ASSESS THE VIEW OF THE COMMUNITY

What sample size is needed to evaluate the views of the community? Using Slovin's Formulae estimating the total population at 4000

A sample size of 364 is required to give a chosen % confidence level of 95%, and the margin of error is 5%.

So we agreed we need a sample of at least 400 Residents.

How Do we know that the sample is representative of the whole community?

Divide the population into subgroups (strata) based on key demographics such as age, gender, area of Dalbeattie. Data sources such as the census are used to define these, and then cross-reference the survey results to find which are over- or underrepresented.

Apply statistical analysis to weigh the results accordingly and seek out underrepresented groups if required.

How do we collect the data?

Place plan survey – so we can compare with other areas though it can feel is too generic so add other questions to supplement it.

How do we get people to fill it out. There is a balance between resources and accessibility. In order to analyse the results the data needs to be electronic and manual analysis is too time consuming. Paper surveys results would need to be entered digitally for analysis there is no capacity for this.

So the best way would be an on line survey with a target of 500 responders (this would allow the potential to reach the 400 residents level (once adjustments are made for Strata etc.
