3 Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes (11th August 2025)

4 Matters Arising from Previous Minutes and Agenda

LA discussed that Dumfries and Galloway Council (DGC) had asked if the CC could buy a 50 inch screen to put on the wall in the Town Hall so that DGC could rent it out for groups making some money. There was great discussion regarding why DGC could not buy the screen themselves as they would be the ones making the money from it. In the end it was agreed that the CC should not buy the screen as CC needs to focus on raising funds for the pond.

Painting the interior of the Town Hall

LA said that DGC had run out of money to complete the internal painting of the Town Hall, it was discussed if the Dalbeattie Clean up group would be able to carry out the work or the Community Payback.

This was discussed with RW who said he would get in touch with the group and ask if anyone was prepared to carry out this work. It was then discussed about materials LA has asked Brian Gowans who has no money but then said he would contribute to the materials.

The upstairs room, bottom wood to be re-painted, and the downstairs woodwork, which would require undercoating and glossing.

DS informed the meeting that after all the work to the Town Hall there was a leak under the Bell Tower which has now been repaired.

Band Stand

WW reported there have been discussions about putting a square plaque on a round post now looking at putting the plaque around the post, more information to follow.

The Steps on the Bandstand are not defined for Visual impaired persons. It was discussed that Dumfries and Galloway Council will do this. (we did not discuss what was happening with the steps for meeting 8th Dec)

Pond Regeneration

Update on Phase 1

Only one contractor has tendered Parc Construction who can do it within the budget, the tender is £36, 227.06. Work has not started as yet and this does not seem likely now until Spring 2026. CC have not got a copy of the tender / scope of work and are in the process of procuring this.

DGC have plugged the inlet pipe to divert the water into the burn to allow the work to commence, unfortunately the bung did not work, the diversion pipe has been put in too high the bung has now been completed by a member of the community, as no work is going to commence until 2026 LA is going to get in touch with the council and ask for the water to be put back into the pond as it makes the park look better.

<u>Phase 2</u> will be discussed at a meeting in the New Year but serious fundraising needs to be done as the cost of this phase will most definitely be over £200,000 and any members of the public who want to fundraise for this phase would be very much appreciated.

RS to Meet Kimberley Philips on 18th August to discuss Ideas and fundraising for Phase 2 of the pond. (No update on this discuss on 8th December meeting)

Clean up Dalbeattie

The cleaning of the side of the Burn by the bridge has not been completed before the Winter, this will now take place in the new year as it was deemed unsafe for people to work because of the storm, which raised the water level.

Resilience

It was discussed setting up a Neighbourhood Watch group, as this goes hand in hand with the place plan, there is a neighbourhood watch group in Kippford this is going to be looked into.

Community Engagement including Local Place Plan

Newsletter EP asked if people still wanted him to produce the quarterly newsletter. If so he would need contributions to it as he cannot do it by himself.

JD/RK to do a piece on the year of the Royal British Legion Scotland.

MC to do a piece on Local Charities.

Placeplan needs a team to take 15 Ideas which is on the surveys and put them together, then take 4 and put them forward and decide which ones go through into the plan for the next 10 years, there is a 6 week window in order to carry out this work, EP asked for people to help EP is happy to co-ordinate it. PP and RS have said they will have a look at it with EP.

DS advised the group that the Blair centre had been broken into doors, had been damaged which have now been repaired, it is now going to be looked at as a place to rent out for groups.

DS discussed buses being taken off after 6pm in the evening and leaving some communities isolated, SNP are making budget decisions in the next year.
