## **Pond Regeneration**

### **Pond**

Phase 1, only one contractor replied and can do it within our budget, to date we do not know who they are or the cost as it hadn't been awarded yet, we asked for the cost of removing the vegitation to be removed as Dougal the council worker has already done this, when awarded it is hoped the work will be completed By the end of October 2025.

Removing the mat at the landing area and replacing it with cement as no boats are likely to be back on the pond. To do this work the Council will pay for this work and plug the inlet pipe and divert it into the burn to allow the work to commence, water will be put back into the Pond to allow pressure washing the base before work starts.

Phase 2 will be discussed at a meeting in the New Year but serious fundraising needs to be done as the cost of this phase will most definitely over £200,000 and any members of the public who want to fundraise for this phase would be very much appreciated.

Dougal has strimmed around the pond so this can now come off the list praise was given for his work on keeping Dalbeattie clean.

Old Stepping Stones were discussed for some to be put back into the pond as a feature. They are in the river at the moment in LA to discuss with D&GC. This was put forward by Jim.
