How to become certified:

1

Implement a management system that meets the requirements of international ISO standards.

2

Submit an application to the certification body

3

Sign a certification services agreement for a period of three years

4

Provide an opportunity for auditors to conduct a certification audit

5

In the event of a positive decision by the certification body, **a certificate is issued** confirming compliance with the management system standards.

6

Provide an opportunity for surveillance audits in the second and third years.

7

After the three-year certification period, the terms of cooperation are discussed again.
