



Pol Petrino is an Italian artist currently based on Gadigal Land, Sydney. His artistic production, using stones and soils as mediums, is focused on the synergy between human being and Mother Nature.

Pol's artistic odyssey began in his university years, but it was post-graduation that his true creative resonance emerged. Influenced by architect and artist Bijoy Jain, he pioneered a unique technique using soil and stones from his travels, infusing his art with diverse landscapes' essente. Seeking harmony between humans and nature, Pol's art transcends aesthetics, conveying reverence for humanity's coexistence with the natural world. His creations share experiences, emotions, and reflections, inspiring viewers to connect with nature's universal language.

His art acts as a bridge between modernity and Earth's ancestral wi-sdom. Pol's pieces embody a timeless message, inviting contemplation of our place within life's intricacies and the planet's beauty. All colors originate from one palette, Mother Earth's. Each hue is natural, crafted through meticulous processes. Artwork genesis is an emotional journey, from stone collection to raw material transportation, culminating in canvas application. This ongoing process is a core aspect of his artistry. Shades find a home in a personal archive, a palette reflecting explored landscapes. 

Each paintin- gs has a soul, a vital surface perceived with all our senses, with our entire being. This is a vital layer is a living part that has experienced with me my same experiences, that has absorbed them and constantly transmits them.

Each piece have an imperceptible but constant change. Soil slowly detach from the canvas and fall as a testament of the passing of time and the exchange of energies between the viewer and the artwork. It will never alter the original drawing, meaning and soul of the artwork.

Along with the dust of the earth, we ritually ga- ther the fallen soil remember our connection to Mother Earth. It's an offering to our synergy, a reminder of the importance of stopping and thanking Her. Like the rain in Bali that falls every evening and purifies the Earth, collecting fallen soil is an action that encourages us to pause and reflect on our profound connection with Mother Earth.







Movement is an intrinsic expression of life, a dan- ce of energy that binds us to the rhythms of na- ture. Throughout my artistic journey, I've come to realize that movement, whether physical or metaphorical, serves as a profound means of connecting with the world that surrounds us.





It is innate, intrinsic to man, we cannot do without it.

A continuous and reciprocal exchange of energy that leads to the sublimation of the synergy. The physical effort is filled by the increasing perception of her. 


