The Discipline of Joy

Joy permeates the Scriptures from Genesis to Revelation. At times we are commanded to be joyful, as the Israelites were commanded during the Festival of Tabernacles. This festival lasted for seven days after gathering the produce of the threshing floor and the winepress. Here the command to rejoice is given in conjunction with the command to celebrate. God said, "Celebrate for seven days! Feast, eat, drink, and be merry!" (Deuteronomy 16:15)

In 1 Chronicles 16:33 even the trees are commanded to sing and be joyful before the Lord. Jesus told his disciples, "*I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete.*" To have the joy of Jesus within us, now that is something to contemplate and to celebrate! Because our God is a joyous God. Joy and celebration is found all throughout the Old and New Testaments

When we read about joy in the Scriptures it often accompanies celebration. And in December there are multiple opportunities to celebrate making it a fitting time to practice the discipline of joy.

What is joy? As Dallas Willard sees it, joy is who God is. Joy is at the center of God's being. Willard writes, "We should, to begin with, think that God leads a very interesting life, and that he is full of joy. Undoubtedly, he is the most joyous being in the universe. The abundance of his love and generosity is inseparable from his infinite joy. All of the good and beautiful things from which we occasionally drink tiny droplets of soul-exhilarating joy, God continuously experiences in all their breadth and depth and richness."¹

Often, we think of joy in connection with something or someone. A beautiful sunset or the giggles of a small child, these are events we connect with joy. Yet Dallas Willard expands this and states that "joy is a pervasive sense of well-being." Even in a difficult situation joy is connected to a sense that I am okay. We see this in 2 Corinthians 6 where Paul lists many paradoxes. One of which is, "*sorrowful, yet always rejoicing.*"

"Joy is consistent with sorrow because it is a realization of what really is going on in the world at large under God. It's joy and joy is one of the hardest things we have associated with God because we think He has so many things to worry about. But if we do not have a joyous God, what do we have? It is a joyous God that fills the universe. God is joyful and everything will be okay under his reign."¹

Joy is the ultimate word about God and his world. Creation was an act of joy and delight in the goodness of what was done. The act of creating also brings us joy whether we are creating a quilt or putting in a new faucet. We go back again to admire what has been created as creation brings joy. ~continued on page 3~

As we live in the kingdom of God right now each time, we enact Jesus' teachings and obey His word we usher in joy in the kingdom of God. This afternoon I had a meeting with several people connected with Community for Christ. We talked and planned about how to help those in need and though it could have been a sad meeting, it was not. There was much joy in being part of a group committed to Mt. 25:40. This is part of how Jesus has called us to live in his kingdom now and it brings joy.

We can be a people of joy, because joy comes from a deeper part of our being that knows God is with us and all will be well even if it is not well right now. Advent is a joyous time even as sorrow awaits at the cross because joy is tied to God who loves us and beckons us to come to him,

John Ortberg made an interesting comment about Dallas Willard which is my prayer for each one of us. John said that he, himself could be anxious, but when he is in the presence of Willard the anxiety dissipates, and is nowhere to be found because Willard radiates the kingdom of God so completely that what flows from him is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness and self-control. This calm is felt in such a way that one is in the kingdom of God in a profound way while on earth when in the presence of Willard. That friends, is a pervasive sense of wellbeing. That friends, is joy. May we radiate the kingdom of God in such a way that when people are in our presence, they have stepped into God's kingdom here on earth.




