ONE LAST DIVE INTO CHURCH SPEAK

As we continue in our last month of looking at words referred to as church speak we have seen that "church" has its own language and customs. When you are "in" or a "part of" this culture they seem normal, but to someone walking into church for the first time they are often foreign. As Christians we live in a very familiar subculture and we speak the language fairly easily. After all we understand what it means to repent, to be saved and to call God holy. We know that 3-in-1 refers to the Trinity and not a bargain and that this vocabulary is to help communicate sometimes difficult often tricky concepts. Sometimes those on the "inside" struggle with describing the meaning of words that are familiar but difficult. It was many years before I understood the difference between Catholic and catholic, after all they are the same word! Today we will look at Catholic vs. catholic; Doxology; Docetism; and Homiletics. Let's dive in!

Catholic vs. catholic: This can be confusing especially when we say the line in the Apostle's Creed; "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting." The term "catholic" when used with a lower case "c" refers to the broader, universal church. When Catholic is used with a "C" it refers to the Roman Catholic Church. Both terms refer to Christians, however, the lowercase "c" "catholic" signifies the universal church of all Christians, while the capitalized "Catholic" specifically refers to the Roman Catholic Church.

Doxology: Each Sunday we sing a doxology which is a short hymn used to give praise and glory to God. Typically, a doxology will encompass all three persons of the Trinity (Father, Son, Holy Spirit). The one Presbyterians sing most often the Gloria Patri.

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost. As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end Amen, Amen.

This short praise hymn acknowledges God's glory, affirms the doctrine of the Trinity, and is a proclamation of God's enduring presence and everlasting glory.

Docetism: This is a doctrine or belief that denies that Jesus had a body. His body was an illusion as Jesus was pure spirit. Docetists are people who believe that Jesus' physical existence was not real. Jesus did not suffer. Jesus did not die. Early on in the Christian church this belief took hold because of gnostic thought. This thought had disdain for the body and all things material. Because only the spirit mattered, Jesus only appeared to have a body, to suffer and to die. In docetism there is a dualism that sees matter as evil or imperfect therefore how could God become incarnate with a physical body? God would be imperfect then. The gospel of John actively opposes docetism. This thought is present today when Christians emphasize the spiritual to the neglect of the physical. God made us with bodies and it is through our bodies that we understand who God is and how he calls us to live. God's creation of the body raises it up. Our bodies need care just as our spirits do. And when we die, we will be given a glorified body - we will not be spirit only. (See 1 Corinthians 15).

Homiletics: This refers to study of preaching and refers to the art of both writing and preaching sermons. The emphasis on homiletics is understanding and interpreting the scriptures to ensure that the message is rooted in the Word. One theologian said that it is important when putting a message together to hold the bible in one hand and the newspaper in the other. That way all that is said about the world today is interpreted through the lens of the worldview based upon the sovereignty of God.
