

### A BIT MORE CHURCH SPEAK

We have been looking at words that are spoken in church but that we have difficulty explaining their meaning. These short definitions are meant to help us understand and articulate words we hear but that we may not fully understand. The following is a little light reading to start off your summer!

Blasphemy - Taking the Lord's Name in Vain....Co-Opting the Name or Image of Jesus....Damaging a Church....Worshipping the Devil....Creating or Depicting Blasphemous Art.

Have you ever wondered why Jesus' name is used as an insult and a curse? Why not Buddha, Allah or Satan? Why are those names not used as curses? Only the triune God is used as mockery because our God is real and true. Our God is the One True God. Scripture says this about Jesus. Phil. 2:9-11

"Therefore, God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."

It is never okay to blaspheme or use the Lord's name in vain. Think about it the next time you or a friend uses the name of Jesus in a derogatory way. Think about what is really being said in the moment of anger and if there may be another way to express one's anger that does not blaspheme Jesus.

**Bread** - Bread has been a staple of life since ancient times and is associated with abundance. In the gospel of John, Jesus is referred to as being the bread of life because he is the ultimate source of sustenance both physically and spiritually. Just as bread sustains physical life, Jesus is the source of nourishment and sustenance for our spiritual life. During the last supper Jesus took bread and after giving thanks he broke it and said "this is my body broken for you," a symbol of his sacrifice for all humanity. Jesus as bread gives a powerful representation of his role as the source of life, the sustainer of life and the salvation of people.

**Deism -** Deism is a philosophical belief that believes in the existence of a supreme being while rejecting supernatural interpretations of religion. Deists rely upon reason and observation of the natural world as the primary sources of knowledge about that supreme being. Deists often believe in a benevolent, distant creator who created the universe but does not intervene in its workings. They typically reject the supernatural elements of Christianity, such as miracles, prophecies, and divine intervention. God is a being that set the universe in motion but one who doesn't personally invest in it or care for it. Reason is emphasized along with nature because God is revealed in nature not sacred texts or prophets.

Does it matter that we know these terms? Well maybe and maybe not so much, but in our pluralistic world, understanding the difference between a theistic view of the world (such as Christianity and Judaism adhere to) versus someone who is a deist versus someone who is an agnostic (there is no knowable God) helps us to understand where someone might be in their journey of faith. And yes, everyone is on a faith journey because we all believe in something.


