Gratitude is Foundational

When one thinks about a foundation, what springs to mind? Brick, mortar, something strong and durable, able to withstand all kinds of weather without crumbling. Houses with cracked foundations are in trouble. Foundation cracks will worsen over time and if one has an inspection on a perspective house and it is determined that the foundation is cracked the deal is usually off. No one wants to mess with a cracked foundation.

When we think of a foundation in spiritual terms the verse Isaiah 28:16 comes to mind.

"But the Master, God, has something to say to this: "Watch closely. I'm laying a foundation in Zion, a solid granite foundation, squared and true. And this is the meaning of the stone: a trusting life won't topple."

The essential idea from this verse is that the Lord's people are invited to build their lives upon the promises God has made. These promises are a sure foundation, trustworthy and true.

What do you think is a good foundation to lay for your life? What is your cornerstone, your foundation? For the Christ follower Jesus is our cornerstone, our sure foundation. And with him securing the building of our lives what is to be our response?

It seems to me that gratitude is the foundation of our response to Jesus. With gratitude as the response to Jesus a host of other strong and life-giving responses will follow gratitude leads to love, joy, peace, patience etc. If gratitude is not present love will turn to resentment; generosity will turn sour; joy will be more conditional etc. One's heart rather than remaining soft will become hardened. Gratitude can transform common days into days of thanksgiving and ordinary opportunities into blessings.
