Getting in Touch

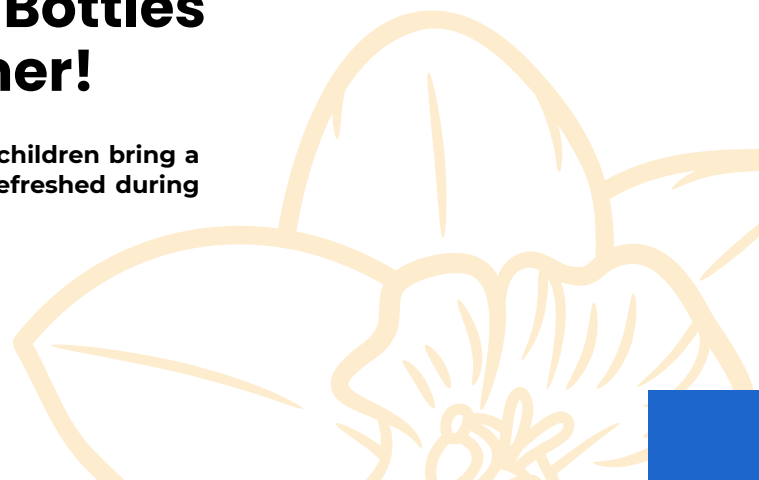

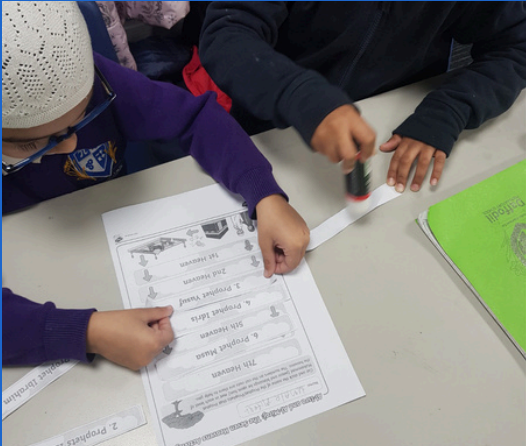
