



Thank you so much for volunteering as a guest speaker for our Bible Camp!

We know how valuable your time is, and your willingness to spend it teaching the amazing kids who come to our camp, is greatly appreciated!

This year's camp theme is "Warriors Arise". We are excited about this theme and will be aligning our craft times and many of our activities with it.

As a guest speaker it may be helpful to you to understand what each day's activities and crafts will be highlighting for the kids, as far as the theme goes, but we also want you to focus on receiving from God what you feel that He would have you to share. It is expected that the messages being shared will be age appropriate and biblically sound lessons that will impact the campers in their life now and into the future!

The theme for this year is designed to encourage all who come to the camp to be active warriors for what is right and what God through scripture tells us is the truth! All of us have lived in the shadow of compromise and spiritual insecurity, even though we have the powerful Spirit of God living inside of us and have been given a new life in Christ.

Becoming a Christian is more than saying a prayer, it is accepting a commission to become part of a family that is also part of an army. We are all warriors joined together to fight for each other and for the truth and for our amazing King.

2 Timothy 2:3-4 NIV (3) Endure hardship with us like a good soldier of Christ Jesus. (4) No one serving as a soldier gets involved in civilian affairs--he wants to please his commanding officer.

To teach the campers about warrior life, we will be using the life of David in scripture.

The Life of David in the Bible is a significant one.

David is the second most mentioned person in the Bible. Second only to Jesus! He is described as a shepherd, poet, intense worshipper, King, and fearless warrior. In God's own words, he was a man after God's own heart.

Camp Teaching Outline (Juniors, Intermediates, Teenagers)

Day One - Choosing the right King in our life.

David's Life:	David decides as a boy, who would control his life and who his King was
Scripture:	Psalms 74:12-17, Psalms 15, David declares his desire to live and move in God in all that he does. Out in the wilderness he declares his desire to put the Lord first.
Craft:	Slingshot
Camp Goal:	Teach kids about salvation through the Lordship of Jesus and His sacrifice for us. Make Jesus King.

Day Two - We need to slay the giants in our life

David's Life:	David slays Goliath because he knew who God was and who he was
Scripture:	I Samuel 17 and the story of David and Goliath
Craft:	Slingshot
Camp Goal:	Teach about baptism and our victory over sin and self and any problem confronting us

Day Three - We need the supernatural Spirit of God

David's Life:	David is anointed and filled with the Spirit of God. He listens to and is led by the Spirit of God.
Scripture:	I Samuel 16:11-13
Craft:	Slingshot
Camp Goal:	Teach kids about the role of the Spirit of God in their life.

Day Four - We need to be part of the family of God

David's Life:	David goes to war against God's enemies and protects and fights for God's people - even when they do not reciprocate.
Scripture:	I Samuel 18:13-16; I Samuel 13:1-13
Craft:	Slingshot
Camp Goal:	Teach the kids the importance of being part of a church where they participate, not just spectate.

Day Five - We need to be overcomers, not victims of our circumstances

David's Life:	David is unfairly targeted by those who should help him. He chose to be an overcomer, not a victim.
Scripture:	I Samuel 23-24
Craft:	Slingshot
Camp Goal:	Teach the kids that we are overcomers due to the Spirit of God living inside of us. Warriors not captives.

Day Six - Fiercely pursue God and seek to know Him

David's Life:	David wants to bring God close to where He lives.
Scripture:	Story of David bringing in the Ark and David dancing unashamedly before God. 2 Samuel 6:1-15
Craft:	Slingshot
Camp Goal:	We are given much by God! We should pursue Him and love Him and be God seekers and worshippers.

Accommodations

It is our hope that you will be able to stay at the camp and enjoy the amenities that are there along with the kids. We will be happy to provide your own guest room at the camp, if you desire to stay, and you are welcome to eat and play with the kids and staff during the day as you see fit.

Driving Directions

We are located on the beautiful shores of Ootsa Lake.

- From Burns Lake, travel south on Highway 35 for 23km to a T-Intersection at Francois Lake.
- Turn right at the T-Intersection and go a short distance to the Francois Lake Ferry on your left.
- Travel by ferry (no charge) to Southbank (The ferry takes about 15 minutes to cross)
- When you come off the ferry, go straight and follow Keefe's Landing Road for 18km.
- When you reach the junction of Keefe's Landing Road and Eakin Settlement, turn right onto the road that continues to Keefe's Landing Road (Signs indicate Ootsa Lake and Wisteria).
- Follow Keefe's Landing Road for another 18km
- Turn left onto Ootsa Hill Road and travel 1.4km
- Turn right at the junction of Ootsa Nadine Road.
- Travel 2km and the camp is on the left side of the road.

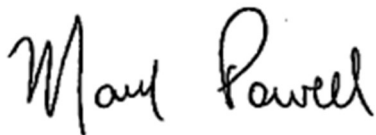
