CHAPTER 5. HOW TO WRITE A REPORT FOR THE FCE EXAM

As part of your FCE exam, you may be required to write a report on a topic for your manager, teacher or for a peer group. The goal of a report is to state factual information and to give suggestions. The report should be written in a semi-formal register.

Remember that the examiners will be looking at the 4 main criteria.

Content (5 marks)

- Does your report cover everything it needs to?
- Communicative Achievement (5 marks)
 - Does your report follow the conventions of a report?
- Organisation (5 marks)
 - Is your text organised and coherent?
 - Do you use a variety of linking words (not just 'and' or 'but'!) and cohesive devices?

Language (5 marks)

- Is the everyday vocabulary you have used appropriate?
- Do you use a range of simple and complex grammatical structures?

Example Question:

The president of the English club has asked you to write a report on the advantages and disadvantages of studying English in the United Kingdom. Your report will be part of the final decision to organise a 2 week language immersion course in Oxford. You should include the views of people whohave studied English in the United Kingdom. All in all, do you think this 2 week immersion course would be a good idea?

Write your report in 140-190 words in an appropriate style.

In a report you will be expected to use a clear layout with headings and bullet points where appropriate. However, be warned that you also want to demonstrate the high-level structures and vocabulary that you know, and too many bullet points will not allow you to do this. Find a happy medium between both.

Naturally, you will not be expected to actually know this information. Feel free to invent it. The examiners are looking for content, but this content does not have to be true. 92

Structuring the report

You will want to have a clear layout for your report:

- The purpose of your report.
- How you conducted your report. 1.
- Headings (one for each point you are making). 2.
- Bullet points/numbered lists (but not too many). 3.
- A summary of the situation. 5.
- Make a comment or suggestion, depending on what is required from you.

In our example, we know the following:

- 1. The purpose of our report is to talk about benefits and the disadvantages of studying English in the UK to be part of a decision on organising a 2 week language immersion course in Oxford.
- 2. That we will have interviewed people who have studied English in the United Kingdom.

Let's think about the advantages and disadvantages:

Advantages of learning English in the United Kingdom

- You are constantly immersed in English-speaking surroundings.
- You experience the culture of the United Kingdom on a daily basis.
- You hear a wide variety of accents.

Disadvantages of learning English in the United Kingdom

- Hearing and communicating in English all the time, even outside of classes, can be exhausting.
- The United Kingdom is expensive (the course as well as the cost of living).
- You can get homesick.

What do these advantages and disadvantages tell you? You could say that the disadvantages are quite weak and you can offer a solution to the price by having a group booking that may be cheaper.

Advantages

Here it is a good idea to make a paragraph about your advantages, so that you can demonstrate a wide range of grammatical structures. Try and build on your advantages.

Many students I interviewed believed that being immersed in an English-speaking environment helped them to improve their English through media and hearing different accents. They also noted that they learned a lot about English culture this way and that it was exciting opportunity for them to experience the United Kingdom.

Below are some other phrases that you could include:

In your conclusion, summarise the points made. Balance the good with the bad and decide which side you are on, offering a solution to some of the disadvantages that you came across.

Although certain students mentioned feeling homesick, the overwhelming response was that the students found that their English greatly improved whilst studying in the United Kingdom. I would therefore suggest that the English club organises the 2 week English language immersion course in Oxford. In order to keep costs low, the English Language course should look at discounted group bookings to lower this cost.
