

https://whc.unesco.org/en/list/ which provides an interactive world map showing
over 1100 locations of World Heritage sites that are searchable by country and by type.

CHANGES:

Due to a significant health issue that I experienced after the October Antique Auction

Genie Eaker & I were forced to cancel the Nov. 27 "Nostalgia Show" and to suspend all

future monthly Antique Auctions. Since these auctions were providing the funding

for the rental of our space for the TSC meetings we needed to develop a new plan

to meet this expense. A meeting of the TSC officers was held on Nov. 3 with the

following results: after receiving members annual dues and auction sales we have a

shortfall of about \$500.00 from the annual rental costs at the FOP lodge which can be

met by charging a \$10.00 dealer fee per meeting for the ten meetings per year that are

available after the two meetings that are dedicated for the TSC auctions.

Dealers who elect to participate will have a full table to sell their items at our monthly bourse times which is a minimum of two hours. We need five Dealers to participate in order to make this concept work. At the meeting Genie Eaker, Richard King, Jerry McNew, and I committed to be classified as Dealers and pay this monthly fee leaving us just one Dealer short to make this concept a success. This plan will be implemented starting with the Jan. 2022 meeting since Genie and I have committed to pay for the Nov. & Dec. meeting fees. This plan which was adopted by the club officers will allow us to continue to use this excellent facility and not have to request an increase in member dues.

RULES:

- 1) A member must register to reserve a space either at the Nov. meeting or by calling Edward W. Ejk at 520-574-5535 to allow us to provide ample tables for the event.

 There is no charge for members for this event.
- 2) Each participant will have ½ table space to display their entry. Entries may be Topicals, Countries, Post Cards, Postal History, or any other Philatelic related items.
- 3) Voting will be done by members at the rate of .25 cents per vote which will be placed in a tray at the members display. Bidders may bid on multiple displays and cast more than one vote of .25 cents per display. The "votes" can be placed from 10AM NOON at which time they will be added up and the awards will be presented with the three winners receiving both a ribbon award as well as all of the cash "votes" in their trays.
