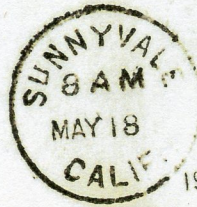

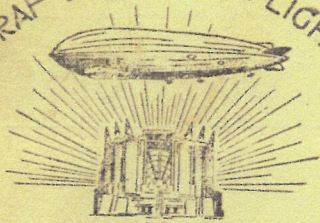

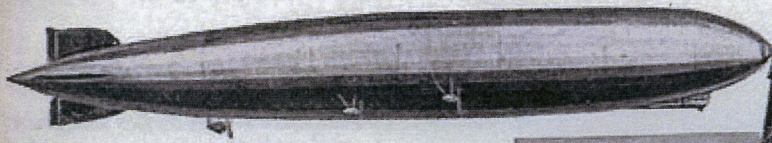

Building Provides Mooring Masts for Zepps



NEW YORKERS may soon become accustomed to the sight of giant lighter-than-air liners moored to the tops of downtown skyscrapers, for the Empire State Building, now under construction at 34th Street and Fifth Avenue, when completed will be topped by a mooring mast of the latest type.

This new building, which will rise to a height of 1100 feet will top the Eiffel Tower of Paris by 174 feet and will be the tallest structure in the world. It is planned to make this building the western terminal of trans-Atlantic airships.

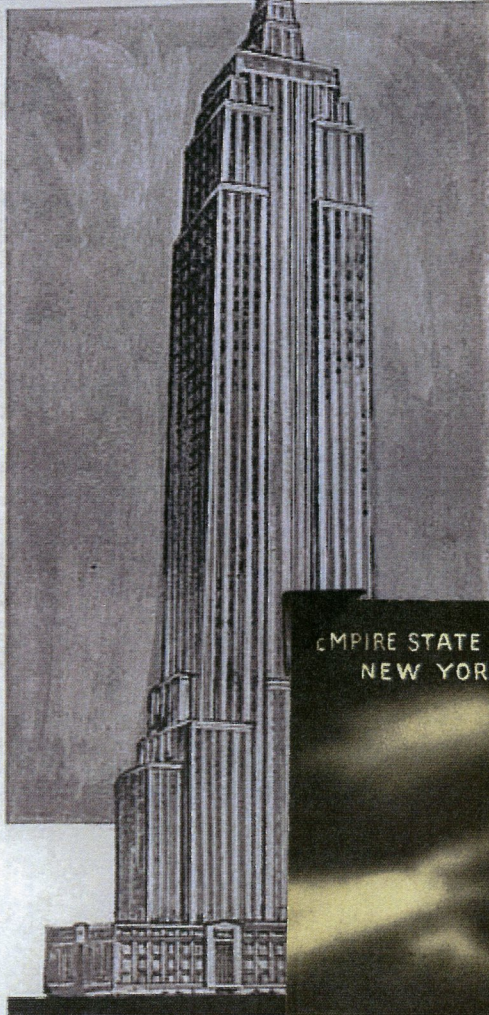
Fast Burning Tear Gas Candle

THE successful use of tear gas in quelling prison riots has resulted in great interest by prison authorities in this chemical agent which does its work without causing injury. The Chemical Warfare Service of the army, as a result of requests for a tear gas device that will produce a gas cloud immediately of high concentration, recently has shipped to Governors Island, New York, two dozen of the new universal fast burning tear gas candles for test there.

These candles were developed in order to meet the demand for a tear gas weapon that will produce an effective gas concentration so quickly that a rioter will be made helpless immediately. The fast burning candles are used in the same manner as a grenade but differ from the latter in that they have a larger capacity, and the tear gas is generated with almost explosive violence. Thus the gas gets into the air with no delay and in great volume.

The older grenades were somewhat slow in ignition and the gas was generated slowly. The fast burning candle ignites so rapidly after leaving the hand that by the time it hits the ground it is giving off its fumes in great quantities. The test of these candles will be watched with great interest not only by the army but by civil authorities, who agree that tear gas is a most effective and humane method of quelling disturbances.

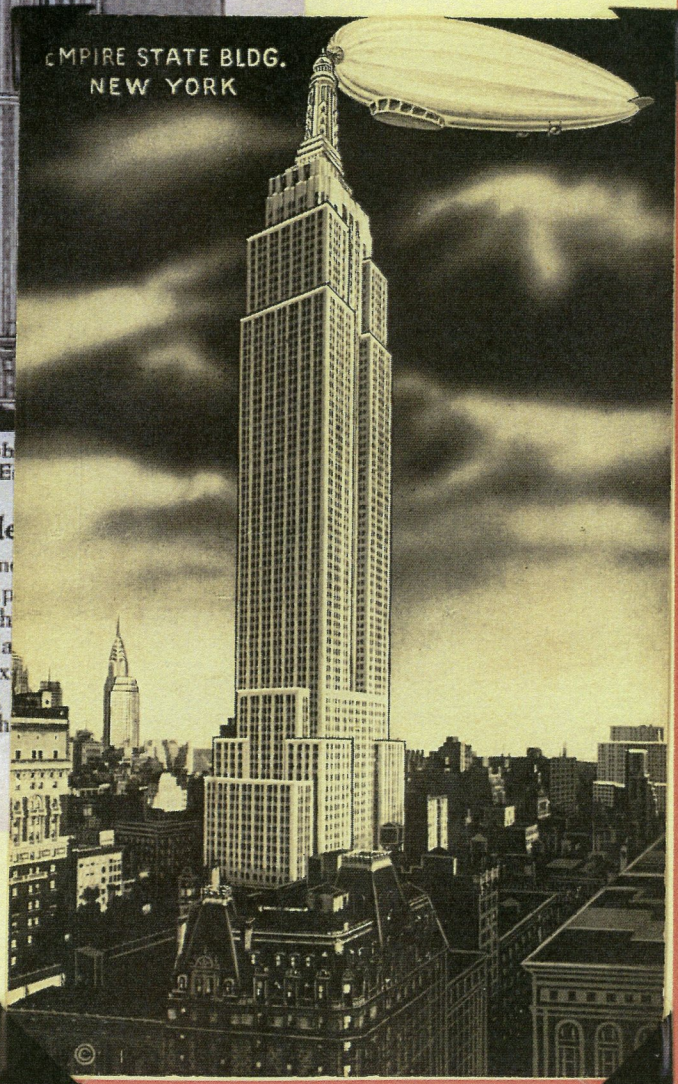
Inventions for August

Oval Auto Cylinder

U.S. Navy Vice Admiral

Charles Emery Rosendahl

May 15, 1892 - May 17, 1997

He was a U.S. Naval Academy grad and in 1921 he was appointed to his first command the destroyer USS Claxton.

He later volunteered for rigid airship duty at Lakehurst (N.J.) Naval Air Station and in 1929 became commander of the Rigid Airship Training Experimental Station there.



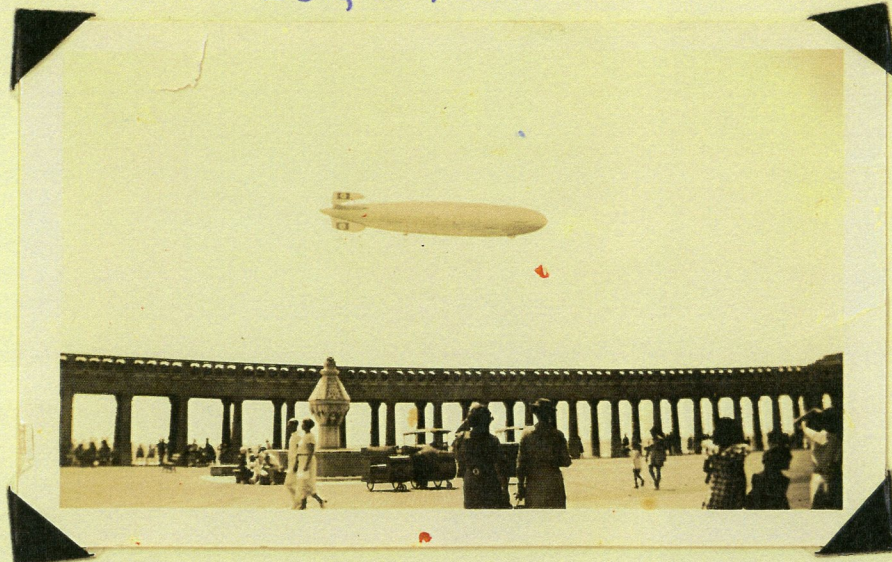
Autograph of Vice Admiral Rosendahl on Hindenburg over NYC

Rosendahl was the mooring officer on the dirigible Shamrock when it broke up in the air and successfully guided the aft section to the ground and was awarded the Distinguished Flyer Cross.

In July 1928 he traveled to Britain and Germany to observe their airship activities and traveled as an observer on the first crossing to Lakehurst at the Graf Zeppelin.

He was also on board the Graf Zeppelin on the 1929 flight "Round the World" (see page 1 of the newsletter)

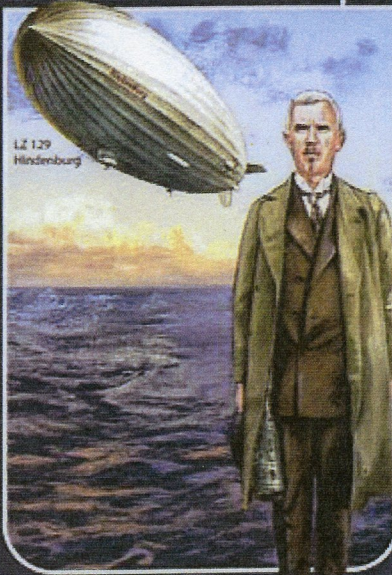

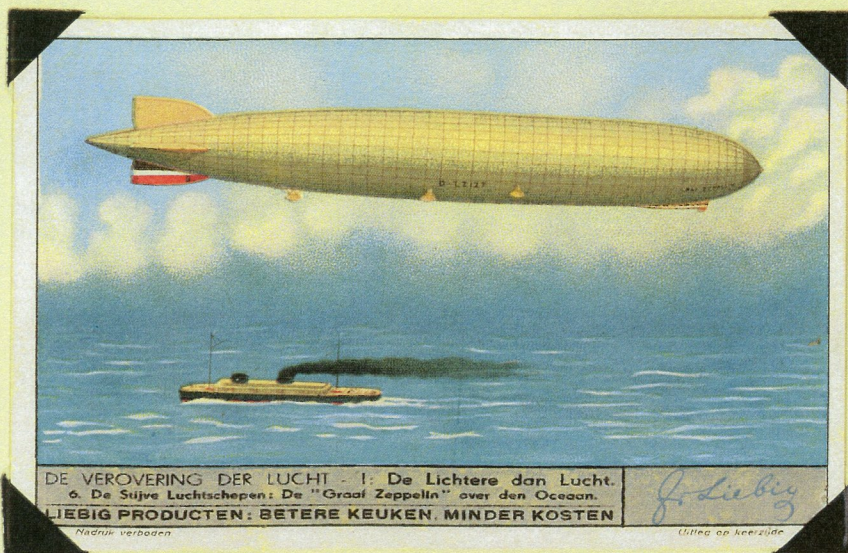
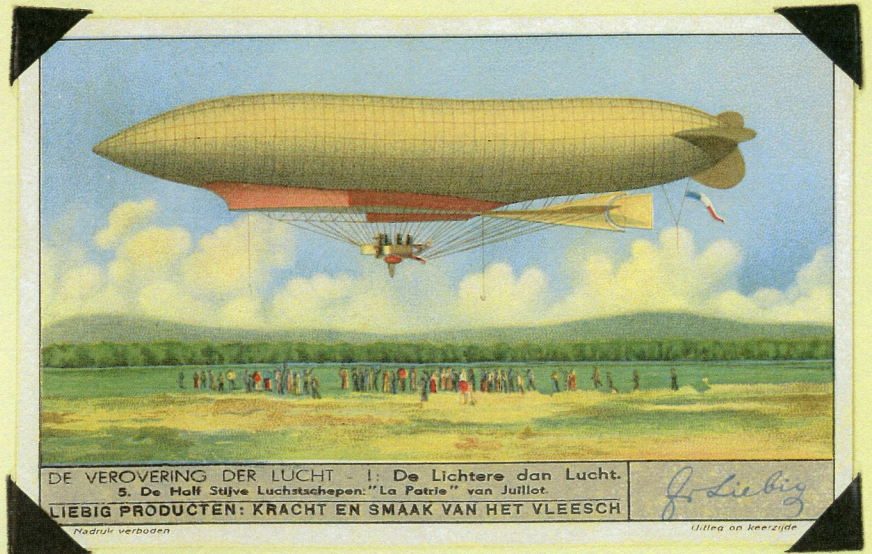
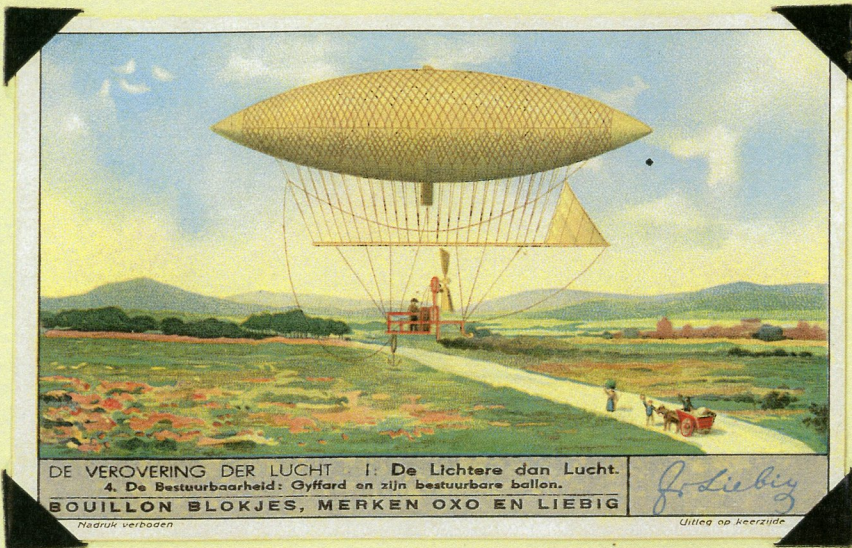




KNABENSHUE'S PASSENGER AIR SHIP
