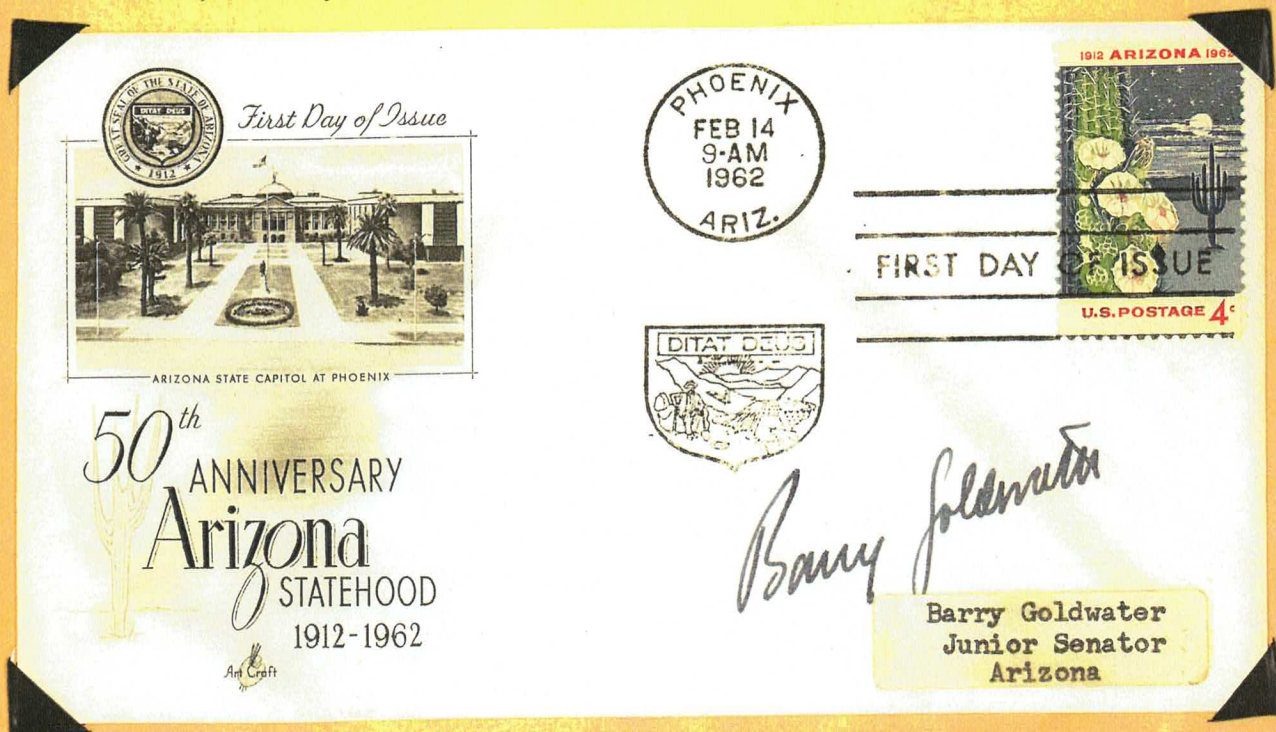




AUTOGRAPHS

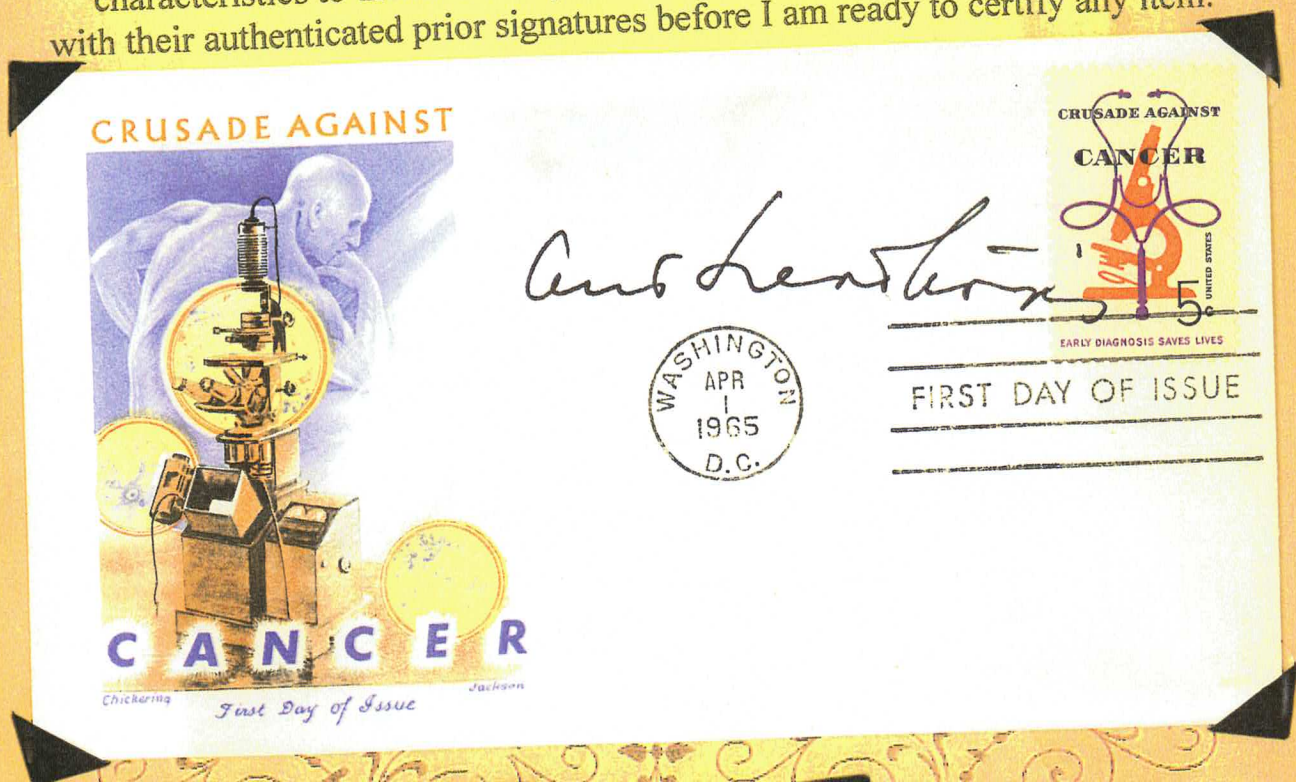




Autographs may be obtained through the mail; in person at events; at collectible shows; internet sales or from reputable dealers.

Acquiring autographs in person is the safest way to ensure that the item was indeed signed by the subject. Securing autographs by any other method has some potential risks as to the authenticity of the signature which can be mitigated by obtaining a solid Certificate of Authenticity (C.O.A.) for the item.

Authenticating signatures is akin to identifying fingerprints since there are similar characteristics in any person's signing patterns. Even though signatures are affected by how they were obtained, was it signed in a rush at an event or did they have the time to sign more leisurely at a collectible show, or has age or an injury affected the signature, there still will be some common characteristics to them. I always must have 5 – 7 points of commonalty with their authenticated prior signatures before I am ready to certify any item.
