Mixes up letters like 'b' and 'd'

Has low reading fluency (reads slowly or choppily)

Read out loud together You read one page, they read the next. Model fluency!

Play word games -Rhyming, word hunts, and phonics games makes reading feel like play.


Use predictable books

#### Checklist: Reading Readiness

- Can recognize most letters and sounds
- Reads high-frequency words (like 'the', 'and,' is')
- Can blend sounds to form words

- Stays focused on reading tasks without shutting down
