Have Only Positive Expectations (HOPE) is a community-based organization seeking to advance the human rights of socioeconomically disenfranchised groups in Pakistan. The organization began its operations in 2018 with the founding team envisioning a safe space for people discriminated against based on their body, gender, and sexuality. This became a cornerstone to HOPE's work- looking ahead to a future that was envisioned to be safe, free, and compassionate for everyone.

This exhibition is showcase of HOPE's mission, making people aware of gender based biases that still exist in our society today .












Not limited by the formalities of education in the field; they have experimented their way in to creating their artistic pieces; allowing them to branch beyond the contemporary.






