Empowering Ambassadors Through Peer-to-Peer Support

Monarch Circle of Impact (MCI) is a peer-to-peer mentoring program designed exclusively for the Foundations' sponsored students (ambassadors) providing weekly tutorials and conversations to enhance their leadership and community skills while navigating university life.

The MCI mission is **to empower and guide the Monarch Effect Foundation ambassadors** on a transformative journey of self-discovery, purpose identification, and personal growth. Through mentorship, thoughtful activities, and a supportive community, the program aims to foster resilience, instill a sense of purpose, and cultivate the skills necessary for a successful and fulfilling academic and personal life.

Preparing Students for Academic Success



The College Prep Mentoring program equips students with essential tools to successfully transition to university and living away from home.

Volunteer experts provide insight into key areas such as goal setting, financial literacy, developing of productive habits, and basic life skills like laundry, shopping, and cooking. Additionally, the program focuses on enhancing study skills, fostering problem-solving abilities, and encouraging students to step outside their comfort zones and embrace new

Facing the Future: Junior Ambassadors Mentoring Program

Thanks to the support of Mentors Foundation, we goal pilot a new mentoring program this semester that targets students in grades 7-9 with the skills, values, and mindset to excel academically, make positive life choices, and grow into future leaders—all guided by an MCI Ambassador, who is working one on one with students and develop its next phase.

This program helps young students develop essential skills that will keep them **engaged in school**, **build strong relationships** with family and peers, and **make positive life choices**.

Through interactive activities, mentorship, and community engagement, Junior Ambassadors will learn:

- How to develop self-discipline, confidence, and strong study habits.
- The importance of respecting parents, teachers, and peers.
- Strategies to avoid peer pressure and make good decisions.

The goal of this program is to prepare students for the College Prep Mentoring Program, ensuring that they enter high school as motivated, goal-driven, and high-achieving individuals who are ready to take on future challenges.
