Profile: I am a social scientist with 8 years' experience of tackling health inequalities linked to race, gender & sexuality, particularly among migrant & ethnic minoritised communities. I conduct socio-cultural analysis using qualitative methodologies, especially participatory & creative research methods, & draw interdisciplinary knowledge from sociology, public health & migration studies.

My portfolio includes sexual & reproductive health, mental health, genomics & physical activity across the UK, Australia & Indonesia. I also have track records in managing lived experience/community health worker program, evaluation, grant writing & storytelling-based health promotion.

Project highlights: I currently lead a Bristol Biomedical Research Centre-funded qualitative project titled [A community-led exploration to improve access to green spaces for adolescents girls in Bradford](#), United Kingdom. The project involved local community organisations, interdisciplinary research team, and a lived experience advisory group.

Out of my Queensland Health-funded Australian PhD project on sexual health literacy among Asian-born gay men, I developed a new interview method called **race-conscious conversation**. A paper is planned to be published in 2025.

I led the development of audiovisual animated videos to promote sexual health and HIV literacy among diverse migrant communities in Queensland called [Have Fun Butt Play Safe](#). The project used peer research methodology.

I have developed a teaching and training podcast about mental health among refugees called [Health Without Borders](#). This podcast has 3 episodes with a duration of 30 mins each.

Grant capture: Since the beginning of my PhD in 2020, I have generated a total of **139,070 euro (150,395 USD)** in research and community development funding from agencies in Australia (e.g., Queensland Health), Asia Pacific (e.g., Asia Pacific Network of Refugees) & the UK (e.g., Bristol Biomedical Research Centre).
