

At the end of January, the Holy Spirit urged me to visit Sister Young (lung & breast cancer). Her daughter called, "Mum is very uncomfortable. Her PO2 is 92. What should we do?" Since no network in the tube, so I stopped and said, "Sit her on a chair and lean slightly forward. Rest her arms on a table to open her chest. Gently rub her back." Half an hour later, her daughter texted: "Thank you. Mum's PO2 has risen to 96." The next day, Sister K drove me, cutting my travel time in half. An hour later, we gave thanks for her 3 children caring for mum wholeheartedly. I prayed as they requested, ending with: "Let us live happily and joyfully return to our heavenly home." Six days later, Sister Young passed away during sleep. Pray for her family to reunite in heaven.

Sister Wisdom, who had recovered from cervical cancer, is on antidepressants long-term. Recently, her depression worsened due to watching online dramas every night. At home visit, I suggested she copy the Bible daily. I started a WhatsApp group of Bible copying for cancer friends, so that God's Word could speak directly to those who write it. Most elderly participants were happy to pick up a pen again and some even use a Chinese brush, which inspired me to practise calligraphy again that brought me peace and focus. (Proverbs 11:25) "A generous person will prosper; whoever refreshes others will be refreshed." Wisdom shared copying the Bible settles her mind at night.

Last Sunday, I called Brother Shell reminding his booking on that day. He had not checked WhatsApp for ten hours nor answered his phone. After the English service, I passed through 3 gates to reach his door but found no one, I called 999, "He lives alone, nearly 80 years old, has liver and lung cancer, often suffers SOB..." The ambulance control replied: "The hospital replied he had not come for the MRI. So many emergency calls, officers can attend in one & a half hours." Just before their force entry, he appeared saying that he hadn't taken his mobile. Brother Shell finally agreed to apply a key safe outside his door and a personal alarm to carry with. Thank Jesus!

Recently, I was tired with low motivation. I prayed for the energy to write this prayer letter. 4 days later, I saw Sister F's CNY family photo reminding me late Sister Oi. She had dementia but always greeted visitors with a smile, "Do you remember me? Thank you for visiting!" and then continually offer fruits to her guests. Before entering the care home for more than 20 years, she often waited at the Chinese supermarket for free pork bones, pulled them in a trolley to share with church friends. Sister Oi's constant gratitude and selfless sharing, never wasting even a little food, inspired me regain a joyful heart, face difficult people with patience, and complete this prayer letter. Thank you all for walking alongside cancer patients through your prayers.

1. Brother Y, aged 80, fell during his hospital stay, the 4th falls within six months. He finally agreed to move into a nursing home. At every visit I read (John 14:1-5) to him. He says Jesus is in his heart and he is waiting for Jesus to receive him, but he is not yet ready for baptism.
2. A social worker interviewed Mr Like and referred a mental health nurse to follow up his daughter's depression. The Like couple have occasionally attended church with me for ten years, but their daughter has made little progress and still has not accepted the gospel. Please pray.
3. Brother Defender was hospitalised again. Two pastors visited and both thought he had entered his final day, and the doctor expected him to pass away that night. Unexpectedly, he revived, saw his close relatives who rushed from HK, and his life extended more than 10 days. Jesus fulfilled everyone's wishes, and all gave thanks.
4. Cancer friends do not believe in Jesus: Mr Tree (adrenal gland), Mrs Wash (lung and breast), Mrs Great (lung), Ms Corner(stomach), Ms Wheat (blood), Mrs Like (cervical cancer, her daughter F has depression for 20 years), Mr Full (prostate), Mr Circle (a hernia), Ms Silver (bowel cancer), Ms Gamble (lymphoma & breast), Ms Farmer (thyroid), Ms Sweet (breast).
