### Cross Regional Collaboration - Taiwan Initiatives Missionary Prayer Letter - Kenneth and Vania Law

After Joshua led the Israelites to settle in Canaan, God said to him, "You are now very old, and there are still very large areas of land to be taken over" (Joshua 13:1). How much land was there yet to be taken over? From Joshua 1 and Genesis 15, we see that the land promised by God to the Israelites was from the Euphrates River to the east of the Nile River, as well as from the Mediterranean Sea to the Sinai Desert. The Israelites occupied less than one-tenth of the land promised by God.

I think that the achievements of the Jesus Christ's Church in worldwide mission is similar to that of the Israelites. Taiwan is a good example. According to the church leaders in Taiwan, only 2% of the population are true believers.

Several years ago, Evangelical Free Churches from several regions (Hong Kong, United States, Singapore, and Malaysia) jointly started the "Taiwan Mission Project", and I was appointed as the executive director. The program is being implemented in two phases. The first phase is to cooperate with two local churches in Taiwan to set up bilingual (English and Mandarin) ministries and church planting. The second phase is to plant our own Evangelical Free bilingual churches.

Wayne & Grace, a young American missionary couple, arrived in Taiwan last August and have since been studying Mandarin. They are also participating in a partner church in Hsinchu. There are also short-term missionaries who are currently working at a second partner church in Taoyuan.

Since the first phase of our "Taiwan Mission Project" is gaining traction, we have now started work on the second phase, for which we need to recruit more English-speaking missionaries, as well as to register with the government as a religious foundation. Additional funds are required for this registration. The government of the Taipei City stipulates that a religious foundation must have at least NT\$20 million in assets. As a result, our fundraising target for FY2026 (January to December) will increase from HK\$1.8 million in 2025 to HK\$2.4 million.

Last December, the Evangel Global Missions (EGM) invited me to take up an additional role, which is to serve as the Acting General Secretary for the organization (due to the resignation of the original Director). While this additional assignment will increase my workload, it will not affect my commitment to the Taiwan Mission Program. One of my important tasks will be to help recruit a new General Secretary for EGM.

For the next while, Vania and I will travel back and forth between Taiwan and Hong Kong. When we are in Taiwan, we will work with missionaries and partner churches. When we are in Hong Kong, we will undertake missionary recruitment and fundraising, as well as serving as the Acting General Secretary of EGM. As I think of my advanced age, I am grateful that the Lord still uses me. I also find God's promise fulfilling in my life: "Your strength will equal your days." (Deuteronomy 33:25).
