ADAM



First Appearance: Genesis 1–2

Summary:

Adam is the first human being created by God, formed from the dust of the ground and given life by God's breath (Genesis 2:7). He was placed in the Garden of Eden to work it and care for it, living in perfect relationship with God, creation, and his wife, Eve.

As the first man, Adam holds a unique place in Scripture. He was made in God's image (Genesis 1:27), designed to reflect God's character and steward His creation. Yet Adam is also known for his role in humanity's fall. Alongside Eve, he disobeyed God's command not to eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil (Genesis 3), bringing sin and death into the world.
