

AUSTRALIA

1. Education:

- Undergraduate: Usually up to 2 years gap after HSC without work or experience; more if you have relevant work experience or other justified activities.
- Postgraduate: Gaps of up to 5 years or more are sometimes accepted if you can show what you did during the gap (work, internships, courses, certificates) and that your academic qualifications are still recent/valid.
- **2. Financial:** Living expense proof (funds shown) 29,710 AUD (Approx.) proof of funds, health cover and basic associated fees, you might need at least around AUD 33,000-35,000 equivalent.
- 3. English Proficiency Test:

IELTS: Under Graduate 6.0 not less than 5.5; Post Graduate 6.5 not less than 6.0

PTE: Under Graduate: 50-58; Post Graduate: 58-65

- 4. Must have to show source of fund & source of income.
- 5. **Health Insurance:** 1(One) Year 2,000 AUD (Approx.)
- 6. **Embassy Fee:** 2,000 AUD [from 1 July 2025]
- 7. **Medical:** 8,000 BDT [From Wahab Medical] {HIV (707); HEP B (708); HEP C (716); TB Screening (719)}
- 8. **Biometric:** 2,700 BDT [VFS Global Dhaka]
- 9. Cost of living: 2,500 AUD (Approx.) {Cost can vary depends on city}
- 10. Intakes:
- February (Semester 1 Late February / early March [Main or Primary intake]
- ➤ July (Semester 2) Mid-July / early August [Secondary intake]
- ➤ November (Semester 3) November [Minor or third]


Process:

- 1. Choose your course and institution.
- 2. Obtain your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE).
- 3. Prepare necessary documents.
- 4. Purchase Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC).
- 5. Apply via ImmiAccount.
- 6. Pay the visa application fee.
- 7. Submit biometrics and attend a medical exam (if required).
- 8. Wait for the visa decision.

















AUSTRALIA

1. Key Requirements & Eligibility

- Offer of Admission & CoE: You must have a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) from an Australian education provider.
- English Language Proficiency: IELTS, TOEFL, PTE, or other accepted tests as required by your institution.
- Genuine Temporary Entrant (GTE) statement: to show that you genuinely intend to stay in Australia temporarily and return after study.
- Financial Capacity: You must prove you have enough funds to pay tuition + living expenses + travel + an amount for dependents if applicable.
- Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC): Mandatory health insurance for the duration of stay.
- Medical Examinations & Biometrics: Depending on your circumstances, you may need to undergo health checks (from panel physician) and provide fingerprints/photos.


2. Steps in the Application Process ~ Here's how things generally work:

Step	What You Do		
1. Choose a course & institution	Get acceptance and CoE. Research living cost in that city.		
2. Prepare documents	Passport, academic transcripts, English test score, financial documents, GTE statement, etc.		
3. Purchase OSHC	From an approved Australian insurer.		
4. Medical & biometrics (if required)	Book panel physician, attend health check; attend VFS / AVAC for biometrics.		
5. Apply online via ImmiAccount	Fill visa subclass 500 application; upload documents. Pay visa fee.		
6. Pay local service fees (if required)	Biometrics / visa application center service fee (VFS/AVAC) in Bangladesh.		
7. Wait for processing	Processing times vary; be sure application is complete		
8. Visa decision	If approved, you'll receive visa grant with visa conditions. If refused, you'll get reasons.		

3. Timeline (How Long It Takes)

For Bangladesh, student visa applications usually take 4-8 weeks on average. But since changes to regulations / seasonality / your individual profile can affect it, it's wise to apply at least 2-3 months before your course start date.
















4. Costs / Fees ~ Here are the relevant fees and other expenses:

Item

Estimated Cost / Notes

Visa application (Subclass 500) AUD 2,000 for the main applicant, effective from 1 July 2025.

 ${\bf Additional\ applicant\ charges\ (if}$

including dependents)

If someone 18+ or under 18 included, other charges apply.

OSHC (Health Cover)

Usually about AUD 500-600 per year for a single student; depends

on insurer and policy.

Biometric / VFS AVAC service

fee

In Bangladesh, there is a local service $\ensuremath{/}$ biometric collection fee in

BDT. Approx. BDT 2,600-2,700.

Medical examinations

Fees depend on what tests are required, age, etc. Could be a few

thousand BDT or more.

Proof of funds / living expenses

As of current rules, you need to show access to approx. AUD 29,710

per year for living expenses for a single student.

Other costs

Document translation/certification, passport fees, IELTS / English test fees, travel/flight, etc.

5. Approximate Total Cost Estimate (Initial Year) rates (\sim AUD 1 \approx BDT 80-85

Putting together the major items, here's a rough estimate for the first year (excluding tuition) for a single student from Bangladesh:

Item	Approx. Cost (in AUD)	Approx. Cost (in BDT)*
Visa fee	2,000	~ 160,000-170,000 (depending on exchange rate)
OSHC	550	~ 45,000-50,000
Living expense proof (funds shown)	29,710	~ 2.3-2.5 million BDT
Medical / biometrics etc.	Variable (say ~ AUD 300- 500)	~ 24,000-40,000
Local service fees / document costs etc	Variable (few thousand BDT)	~ 3,000-10,000

So just for visa, proof of funds, health cover and basic associated fees, you might need at least around AUD 33,000-35,000 equivalent in BDT (~2.6-3 million BDT) as your first-year cost of staying in a compliant manner (not counting tuition).

6. Tips to Improve Chances & Smooth Processing

- 1. Make sure your academic transcripts, English test score, CoE, financial documents are all correct, up to date, and well-organized.
- 2. Your GTE statement should clearly explain why you want to study, how course connects to your background and future plans in Bangladesh.
- 3. Apply early. Delays in any document or medical/biometrics can push back things.
- 4. Keep copies of everything.
- 5. Make sure OSHC is valid from the date you arrive in Australia.
