As part of the PM SHRI School initiative, a Education session Financial Literacy conducted under the major component "Curriculum, Pedagogy & Assessment", and the sub-component "Project Innovation" at PM SHRI KGBV, Dambuk on 31st January 2025. This initiative aimed to enhance the understanding of financial concepts among adolescent girls and empower them with practical knowledge of money management, savings, and basic financial decision-making.

The session was facilitated by three resource persons with expertise in education community development:

- Miss Sopeto Linggi
- Miss Sukiti Pomoong

Their interactive and student-friendly approach ensured active participation and deeper understanding among the students.

Session Highlights

- Interactive Learning Modules: The experts used real-life examples and storytelling to explain the importance of budgeting, saving,
- and spending wisely.

 Digital Literacy Introduction: A brief demonstration was given on digital payment methods, including UPI and ATM usage,
- highlighting safety precautions.
 Role Plays and Group Discussions: Students actively participated in role-plays about running small businesses, managing household budgets, and understanding value-for-money concepts.
- Feedback and Reflections: Students were encouraged to share their understanding and reflect on how they can apply these lessons in daily life.
- Over 70 students of PM SHRI KGBV, Dambuk,
- participated in the session. Students demonstrated improved awareness of saving methods, budgeting principles, and importance of maintaining financial records.
- Several students expressed interest in starting small saving habits with the guidance of their teachers and parents.

"Nothing Like Voting, I Vote for Sure"







The dustbins have been painted in vibrant colors—green for biodegradable waste, blue for non-biodegradable waste, and red for hazardous/reject waste—to make segregation easy and visually identifiable. Each bin features fun and educational characters such as cartoon animals, superheroes, or classroom mascots to make the practice of waste disposal more engaging and child-friendly.

The objective of the program was to educate women, adolescent girls, and the local community on legal rights, women-centric laws, and available protection mechanisms under the Indian legal framework.

Program Highlights:

- Expert Sessions conducted by local legal professionals and representatives from the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), covering topics such as:
 - The Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005
 - POSCO Act and Child Rights
 - Cyber Laws and Safety for Women
 - Free Legal Aid and How to Avail It
- Open Interaction Session where participants asked questions and shared their concerns.
- Distribution of pamphlets and booklets on women's rights and helpline services.
- Vote of Thanks offered by the organizers, with special acknowledgment to APSCW for their continuous efforts in promoting gender justice and empowerment.
- Over 100 participants, including women, adolescent girls, teachers, and community members, benefitted from the session.
- Participants gained better knowledge of legal protections and avenues for support.
- Several women expressed interest in forming or joining community-based women's support groups.
- Strengthened collaboration between community members and district legal services.

This Legal Awareness Program played a vital role in empowering the women and youth of Dambuk by equipping them with essential legal knowledge and confidence to seek justice. The support of APSCW, Itanagar, and the District Administration made the initiative a resounding success.

Pariksha pe charcha








Awards & Certificates
