# Big Kandiyohi Lake Association Directors Meeting Minutes Max's Grill – Fireplace room Wednesday, April 16<sup>th</sup>, 2025 @ 5:30 pm

#### Agenda Approval

Motion made by John B. and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Greg E. Carried.

#### Minutes Approval

- Motion made by Jerry B. and 2nd by Jerry N. to approve the March 20th mtg. minutes.
- All in favor, motion passed.

# Treasurer's Report

- Checking account balance: \$20,377 (with two outstanding checks: \$30 to Pat Schmoll and a check to Dale Tonsfeldt that hasn't been cashed).
- Jerry N. met with Kelly from Saunders regarding the 5013C report.
- The report is ready for signing.
- There will likely be a fee for the report preparation.
- If there isn't a large donation, a longer form will not be required next year.
- Motion to approve the financial reports was made by Janet W., seconded by Jerry B., and passed.

#### AIS/I-LIDS report

- The Als task force did not meet.
- Dave will update the "I-lids report" to "AIS task force" or "AIS in general".
- AIS refers to Aquatic Invasive Species like curly leaf pondweed and zebra mussels.
- The county AIS committee, which Jerry B. and another member are on, hasn't met since January.

#### **CLP Harvester Discussion**

- John B. is responsible for the harvester.
- Request to include a curly leaf pondweed update from PLM.
- PLM is contracted for chemical treatment areas.
- The contract is worth \$20,000.
- John B. should check with PLM on how many individuals took them up on the offer to have their properties treated.
- DNR will conduct the delineation survey soon.
- There are concerns that curly leaf pondweed may be more invasive this year due to clear ice.
- John B. hasn't contacted Dallenbach regarding interest in the harvester.
- Weed harvester use is restricted to those who have paid their dues.
- Members can contact Jerry N. to determine who has paid their dues.
- There is \$7,500 in grant money from the AIS task force.
- The group discusses matching funds for harvest, chemicals, and harvesters, clarifying that hours spent equate to dollars, at a rate of approximately \$100 per hour.

- Someone offers to contribute additional hours if needed to secure funding.
- The group discusses the logistics of harvesting, including potential dumping locations.
- One member offered their island lot for dumping through the channel.
- They acknowledge the challenges faced last year due to high winds, especially when pulling the raft across the lake.

#### Inlet needs: new structure update

- Commissioner Anderson contacted Margaret Johnson regarding the inlet structure.
- Margaret Johnson stated that the State determines elevations on the basin and they have zero jurisdiction.
- The group wants a carp barrier to prevent carp from entering Johnson Slough to lay eggs.
- The group is waiting for the results of the hydrological study.
- A member has been trying to contact Margaret Johnson but has only reached her voicemail.
- The group discusses the importance of reminding Margaret Johnson that their main concern is a carp barrier on the inlet, not just water levels or other study findings.
- They consider contacting Dwayne, who sits on Margaret Johnson's board, for assistance.
- The group will give Margaret Johnson a chance to respond.
- The group discusses plans for carp management this year, assuming the inlet structure project will take another year.
- They discuss contacting Jason George to potentially come out and help with carp management.
- The group needs to contact Jason George to see if he is interested in coming out.
- A fisherman lost his catch due to a hole in his net, motivating the need for a secure structure to contain the fish.
- The plan is to build a permanent structure to make it easier to convince him to trap carp.
- The structure at the inlet would ideally hold the fish back, with nets across the lake opening.
- The outlet already has a gate for control.
- Last year, 30-40,000 pounds were taken out, including buffalo fish, which are more profitable.
- Buffalo fish were 56 cents a pound, while carp were 18 cents last year.
- The fish need to be shipped live, usually to the East Coast (Boston or New York).
- The carp pricing fluctuates, and other lake associations have had to subsidize carp removal due to low prices.
- Jason George may return for trapping if allowed by new land owner, depending on access to the inlet.
- The person who bought the end spot owns part of the road now.
- If access through that property falls through, they would have to access from the lake.

#### **New Business**

# May 24th Annual Informational Meeting

- Janet and Paul are thanked for handling the mailings.
- A notice regarding chemical treatment needs to be emailed to everyone and published on the website. Janet will send email.
- Landowners can opt out if they don't want treatment within 500ft of their property.
- The website is being updated, and the notice should be added to the old website ASAP.
- It was thought to be published by May 1st.

- It needs to be published before the chemical treatment.

## Minnesota Nonprofit Form

- A form from a bank lady in Lake Lillian indicated that the organization's nonprofit status is inactive.
- Janet was asked if she received renewal notices from the Secretary of State for the nonprofit corporation.
- The notices received stated that the corporation is inactive.
- There is a question of whether the federal 501C3 status supersedes the Secretary of State requirements.
- Kelly will be contacted to clarify if the federal status trumps the state form.

## **Boater Safety Permit**

- A new law requires boater education for those under 21, starting July 1st.
- The age requiring the permit will increase each year, reaching age 42 and under by 2028.
- Guides about the new law were ordered to hand out at the lake association meeting.
- The DNR is expected to promote this new law.
- A webinar was watched about wake boat regulations due to the problems they cause.
- Copies of the seminar will be sent out.
- The webinar was through "MN COLA."
- Regulations for wake boats can be implemented at the township level, followed by a petition to the DNR.
- Regulations could include distance from shore (500ft) and water depth (20ft).
- The township level needs to start the process.
- There was a previous attempt to establish a no-wake zone, but the township and county were hesitant.
- The sheriff was concerned about enforcement.

#### Website Updates

- The website updates are covered and expected to be completed by the first of the month.
- New board members' names and pictures are needed for the updated website.
- Information about who needs to be added or removed from the website has been shared.
- There is a to-do list to update the chair listing.

#### Benefit for Mike Junger

- Mike Younger has a rare form of cancer with no cure.
- Chad contacted the board to ask for help with a benefit for Mike.
- The benefit will be at the Horseshoe Bar on June 21st.
- They need help with serving the meal, the silent auction, and the bake sale.
- The Lake Lillian Sportsman's Club has volunteered.
- The board discussed whether to help as a group or ask the membership for volunteers.
- Jerry N. suggested people could work in two-hour shifts.
- The board agreed to find out what specific help is needed and then decide how to proceed.

#### Fishing Tournament

- Melges and Dallman are having a fishing contest on Big Kandiyohi Lake on May 17th.
- The lake will be staked off with nets.
- There will be a five-fish limit.
- The board is not involved in the tournament.

#### Mosquito Spraying

- Two anonymous paying members want the board to consider spraying the lake for mosquitos.
- They said a lake in Willmar that is sprayed by airplane for about \$8,000.
- A board member recalls that the board previously rejected a similar proposal.
- They suggest the members who are interested should put together a presentation with cost estimates for the board.
- Someone mentions that in the Minneapolis/St. Paul metro area, they use pellets in open water to prevent mosquitos from hatching.

#### Facebook Ads

- Someone on the Diamond Lake Facebook page suggested that people who are putting ads on the page should pay the lake association.
- Another person suggested that the person with the idea should come up with a fundraiser for the lake association.

# Community Septic Assessment

- The community septic assessment is two-thirds done.
- They did the island and Bonnie Beach two years ago, the northeast side last year, and hope to do Northern Lights Beach this coming year.
- The report gives three options: hooking up with Lake Lillian, doing a mound system half a mile away for everybody, or doing individual systems.
- The report found zero non-compliant septic systems that directly impact health and safety.
- The board is done with it unless they hear a groundswell from the community that wants to look at something.
- Because of the watershed, they wouldn't be able to hook up to the Blomkest sewer system.

# Walking Path

- Someone asked if there has ever been any talk of a walking path on the east side.
- There has not been any talk of a walking path.
- Someone suggests trying for a Safe Routes to School grant for trails.

#### Park East/2 Docks

- Park 2 is getting three new docks.
- Two floating docks by the store.
- One new normal dock by the access.

# Kandiyohi Soil and Water Conservation District Project

- Kandiyohi Soil and Water Conservation District worked with Kandiyohi public works department and

students with the Dream Academy to protect water quality on Big Kandiyohi Lake.

- The project to protect shoreline at county Park One included the planting of native vegetation by the students.
- The speaker says, "This is so minor compared to what plan is going to do."
- The speaker mentions that they were told that there weren't resources to do anything, but now things are happening.

#### Lake Lillian Outlet

- The lake seems to be getting a little higher.
- The outlet on Lake Lillian has about 8 yards of reed weeds plugging it.
- There is no water going out of Lake Lillian.
- It's dry on the other side of the fall.
- The county was called and was going to take care of it.
- The speaker says, "The weed that was. These are reed weeds. They go back about 8 yards and they're just packed in there."
