Strategic Executive Narrative Design

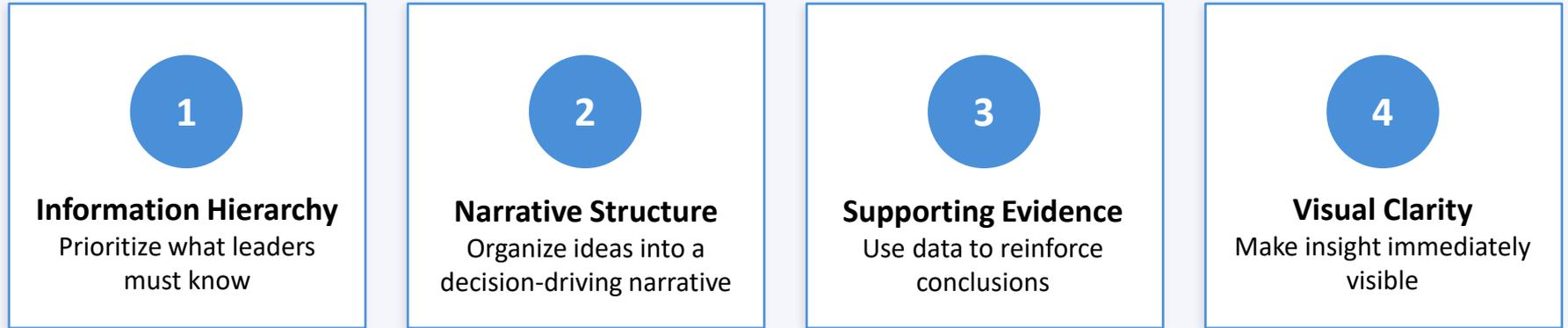
Complex strategy fails when communication doesn't drive *decisions*.

Executive narratives turn complexity into decisions.

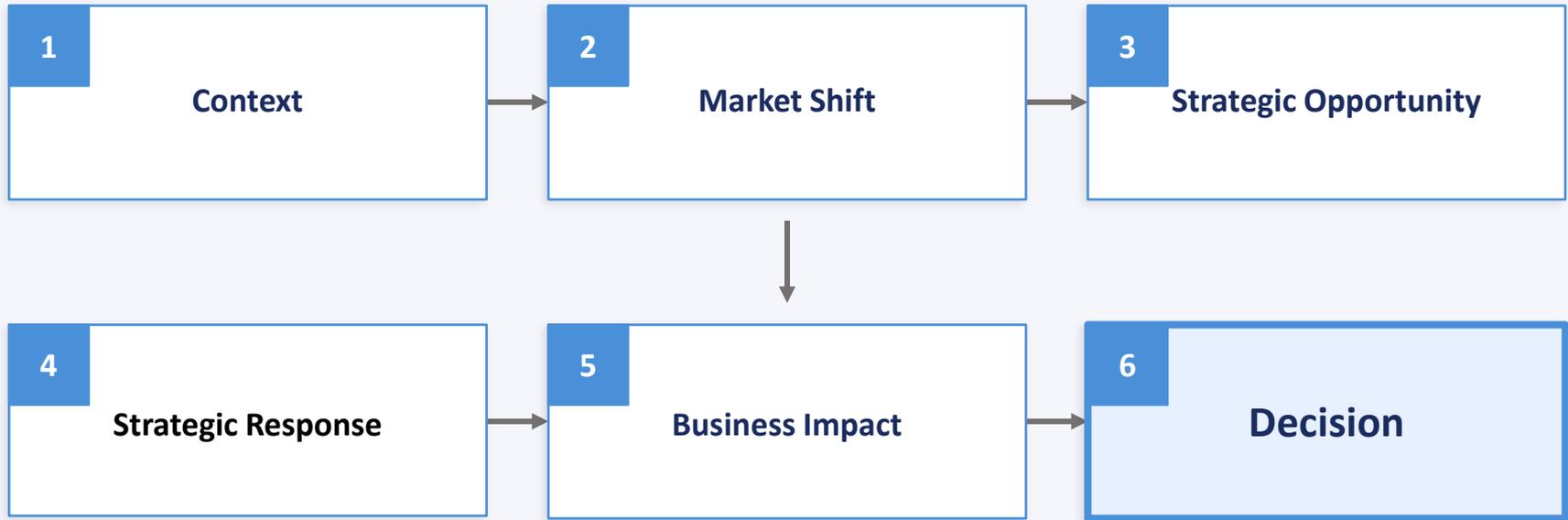

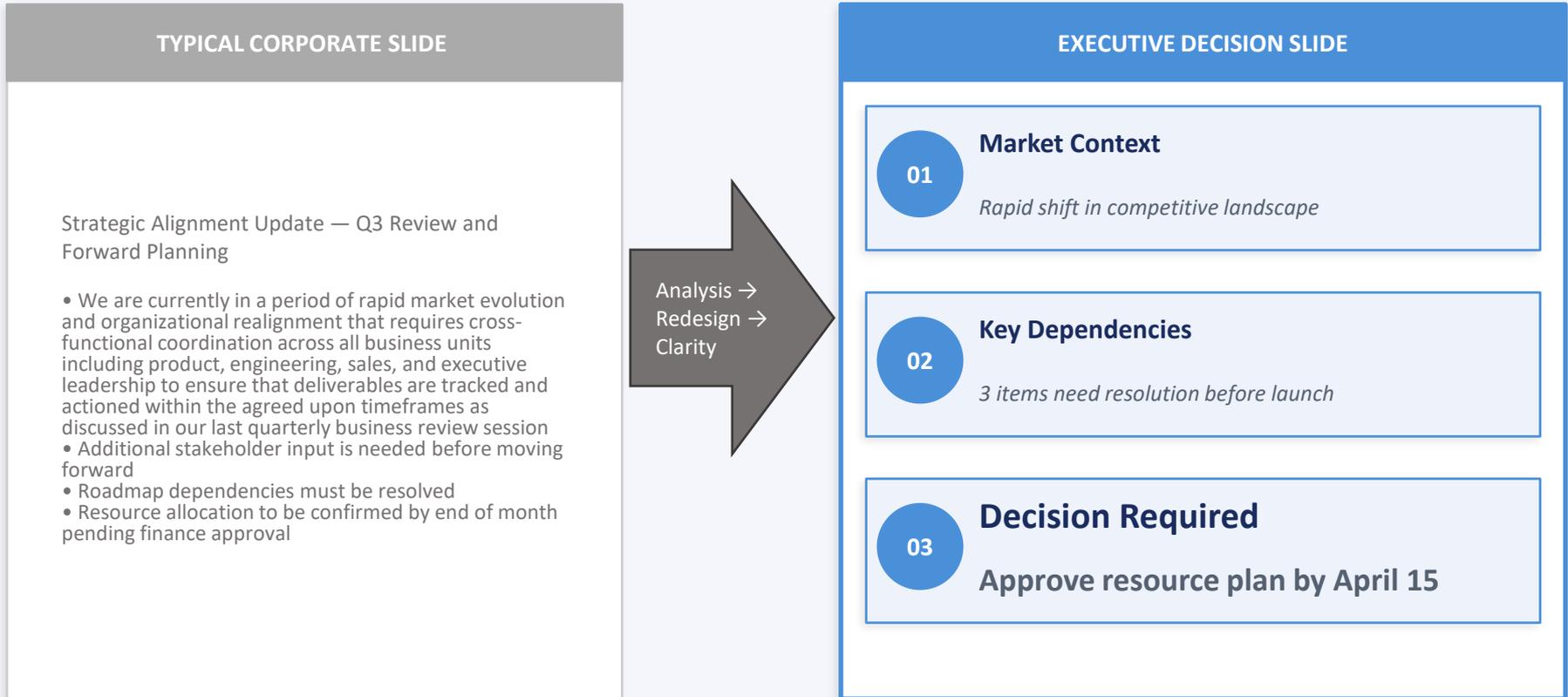
