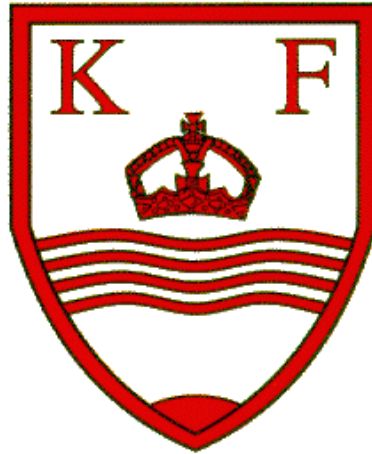

Home - School Agreement 2025 to 2026

A home-school agreement is a statement explaining the school's aims, values, policies and procedures, its responsibilities towards its pupils, the responsibilities of the pupil's parents, and what's expected of pupils.

At Kingsfleet Primary School, we recognise each pupil as an individual and aim to give all pupils every opportunity to realise their full potential. We believe that a close partnership between the school, parents and pupils is essential if we are to achieve this aim.

The aim of our home-school agreement is to encourage consistency, equality and fairness in all matters pertaining to the school. This can be done most effectively when all staff, parents and pupils understand their responsibilities and work together towards the same goals.

We require all parents and pupils to sign the home-school agreement and maintain an awareness that advice from the DfE states that refusal to sign the school's home-school agreement does not provide exemption for any pupils from the rules outlined by the school.

Agreement for School

The school will;

- Provide your child with a high standard of education through a broad, balanced and stimulating curriculum
- Provide a safe, nurturing and secure learning environment
- Promote positive behaviour choices as set out in the Promoting Good Behaviour Policy.
- Teach and encourage children to do their best in all areas of school life
- Communicate between home and school through the school website, newsletters, emails and meetings.
- Keep parents and carers informed about their child's progress and behaviour.
- Allow pupils use of the internet through a combination of site filtering, supervision and by fostering a responsible attitude in all pupils in partnership with parents/carers to implement a whole-school approach to online safety.
- Promote good attendance and punctuality
- Teach your child to respect the culture, race, feelings, beliefs and values of others
- Work in partnership with parents to address concerns; social, academic or developmental.

Agreement for Parents/Carers

To help my child at school I will:

- Accept the school's aims, values, policies and procedures to positively support the school.

- Attend parent meetings with teachers and other staff to discuss my child's achievements and progress.
- Work together positively, productively and respectfully with school staff to move my child on in their learning and social development
- Inform the school immediately of any changes to my emergency contacts details.
- support the school in maintaining good behaviour and discipline
- follow the Parent Code of Conduct
- listen to my child read regularly

Using technology

- Only use websites and apps and other online platforms that a member of staff has said I can use.
- Take care of school-owned devices when I am using them.
- Understand that the school will monitor how I use school-owned devices.
- Think about what I post about the school on social media when I am at home and make sure I do not post anything that could be harmful to any member of the school community.
- If I come across anything that makes me feel unhappy or uncomfortable, I will report it to an adult.
