EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Creating lasting change in Northern Nigeria, one life and one community at a time.



AFN officially began its operations in 2025 after completing its registration on the 26th of February 2025 as an Incorporate Trustee with Reg No. 8299000. Through targeted education, healthcare, and community development programs, AFN aims to directly addresses the region's most pressing socio-economic challenges. With a network of project ambassadors, transparent donation channels, and committed membership contributions, AFN aims to deliver sustained impact to underserved communities across the 19 states of Northern Nigeria. Our mission is to provide direct assistance to individuals and families in need while supporting other charitable organizations working towards similar goals.

Though we began just a month ago, AFN Foundation has already made a **tangible impact through financial aid for widows, orphans, and the elderly, scholarships for underprivileged students, Ramadan feeding programs, medical support, and vital water rehabilitation projects.** We believe that the smallest acts and effort are as significant, creating lasting ripple effects that transform lives and strengthen communities, one step at a time.

The Problem

Northern Nigeria faces critical challenges, including high poverty rates, inadequate healthcare, limited educational opportunities, and poor infrastructure. Vulnerable groups—especially Almajiri children, rural women, and low-income families—struggle to break the cycle of poverty without targeted intervention. Despite billions in funding, mismanagement and corruption within existing foundations also play a key role in sustaining this cycle. Personal interests and lack of transparency leave vulnerable communities without essential services, further deepening their hardships.

However, transparency is crucial—many foundations receive substantial funding, yet mismanagement hinders impact. Ensuring funds are effectively used will drive real, lasting change.

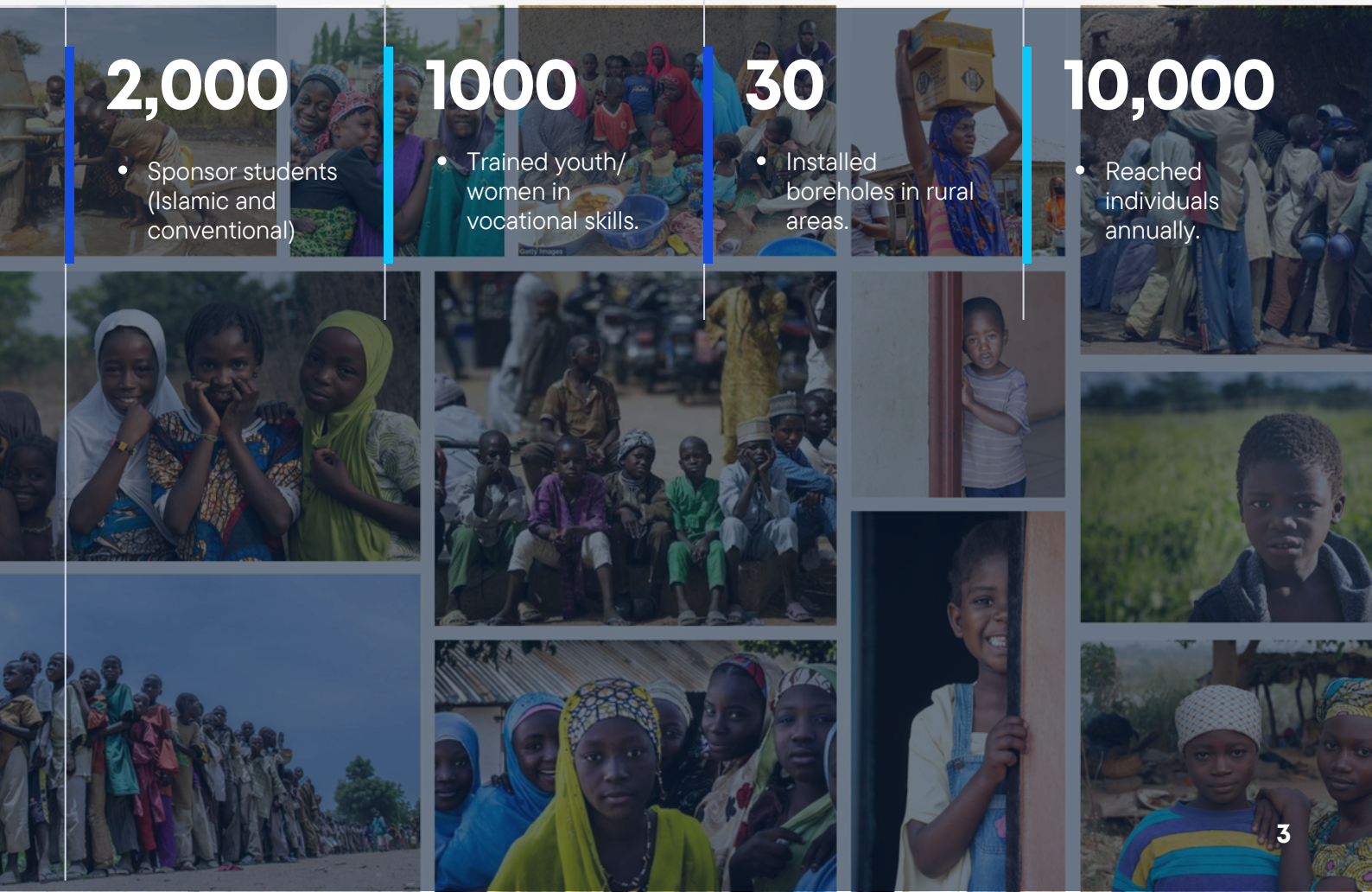

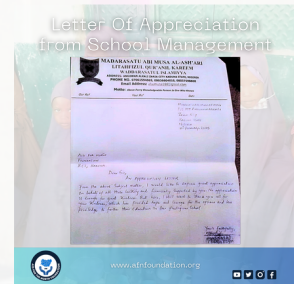

IMPACT SO FAR

1. Education Sponsorship in Kaduna State

AFN Foundation has fully sponsored the school fees of 23 orphans and less privileged students (16 girls and 7 boys, aged 5-15) at Madarasatu Abu Musa Al-Sh'ari Litahfizul Qur'anil Kareem, located in Anguwar Alkali, Zaria City, Kaduna State. These children were at risk of being sent home due to unpaid fees.



2. Well Rehabilitation in Niger State

AFN Foundation has restored clean water access to over 800 households in Niger State by rehabilitating two wells. The Dutsen Kuran Hausa Well, serving 300+ households and the Rijiyar Masallaci well in Bosso are fully operational, benefiting 500+ households and a mosque.

FUTURE OUTLOOK

The AFN Foundation has a bold vision to transform Northern Nigeria by addressing critical issues in education, healthcare, and economic empowerment. Through a phased approach, the foundation aims to create lasting impact and drive systemic change creating a lasting legacy embedded in national poverty-alleviation policies. Together, the foundation is building a future where no one in Northern Nigeria is left behind.

PHASE 01

Foundation

The initial phase will focus on testing and refining core programs, including outreach efforts for vulnerable children, clean water access through boreholes, and educational sponsorships. This stage is essential for building trust within communities, improving operational systems, and gathering data to shape future initiatives.

PHASE 02

Scaling

With a strong foundation, the next phase will expand the reach of AFN's programs. More individuals will benefit from our programs and will become more frequent. This stage will emphasize measurable impact, ensuring that more students receive support and that communities have greater access to essential resources.

PHASE 03

Sustainability

At this stage, sustainability becomes the priority. AFN will formalize educational pathways, ensuring structured learning opportunities for vulnerable children. Long-term water infrastructure will be expanded, and financial empowerment programs, such as microloans, will be introduced to strengthen economic independence within communities.

PHASE 04

Advocacy

The final phase will focus on driving systemic change. AFN will advocate for policy reforms to support and expand its models to new regions in the continent, and set a standard for best practices in social development. By this stage, the foundation aims to influence global strategies and position itself as a leader in poverty alleviation and community empowerment.



PLANNED INITIATIVES

Koyarwa Initiative (KI)

Recruit, train, and deploy youth volunteers (particularly university students, fresh graduates, and NYSC members) to underserved schools in Northern Nigeria. The program seeks to improve literacy, numeracy, and life skills among children and youth who currently receive inadequate or no formal education.



PLANNED INITIATIVES

Zakat Initiative (ZI)

Channels Zakat obligations from Muslims into sustainable projects supporting underserved communities across the 19 states of Northern Nigeria. This initiative will be Shariah-compliant and structured to meet the needs of both donors (zakat givers) and beneficiaries through a transparent and accountable approach.

Joint Impact Initiative:

Collaborates with other foundations and nonprofits whose missions align with AFN's focus on education, healthcare, and community development. By pooling resources and expertise, we can amplify positive outcomes and optimize resources.

Almajiri School Model

A transformative pathway for children historically marginalized by conventional schooling systems. By harmonizing traditional Islamic education with modern academic and vocational instruction, the pilot seeks to empower Almajiri learners with holistic skill sets, bridging cultural integrity and 21st-century readiness.

Heritage Initiative (HI)
