Family values - mission statement

Have an end goal on what you want your child to be in the next few years.
This allows you as the parent to hold yourself accountable as well as your child.

“does this align with my values?”

”Why am I doing this?”

“is this the right course for my child?”

Time management

Common struggles

- Lack of structure
- Over-scheduling or under-planning
- Children's resistance or procrastination
- Parental burnout
- Distractions (screens, chores, etc.)

 ***Prompt reflection:*** "What is your current rhythm like? What's working, and what feels heavy?"



Time management

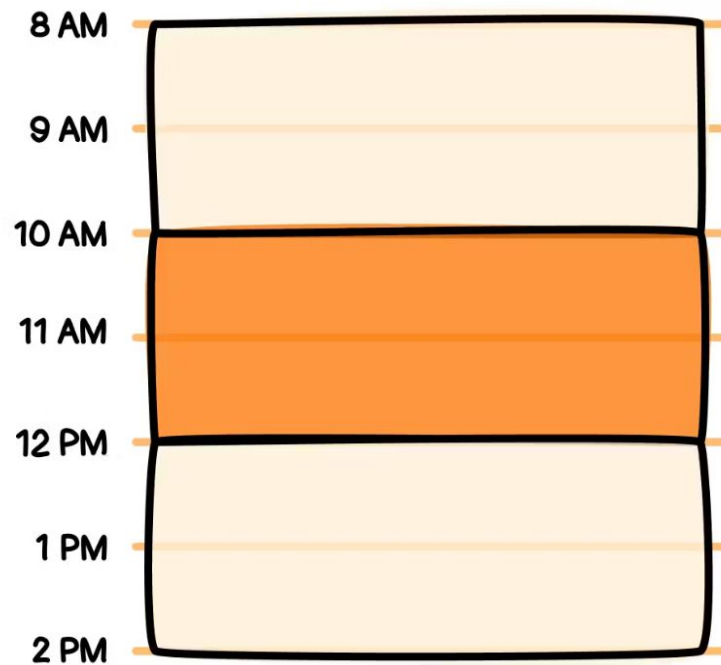
For Parents:

- **Time blocking** (Morning lesson, after lunch outdoor time, personal breaks)
- **Batching tasks** (prep meals, group subjects)
- **Visual planners** (wall schedules, whiteboards, weekly planner)
- **Habit stacking** (pairing tasks: e.g. dhikr while folding laundry)
- **Digital detox hours**

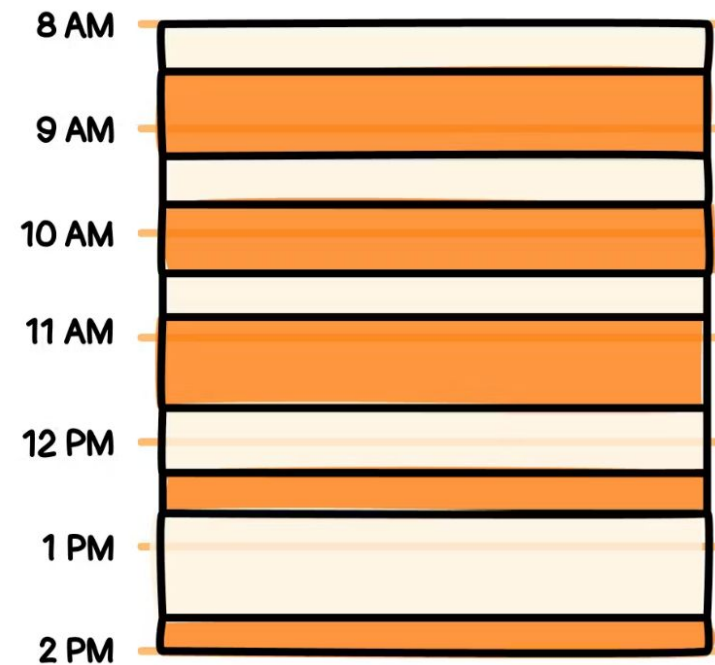


Time management

Time management

- Use timers (Pomodoro-style: 25 mins work / 5 mins break)
- Visual schedules (especially for younger or SEN learners)
- Weekly goal sheets (What I'm working on this week)
- Create **"I do / We do / You do"** learning structures to foster independence

What does a successful curriculum look like?

Skill	Description
Reading Comprehension	Understanding and analysing texts, Qur'an, and stories
Writing Skills	Expressing ideas clearly through stories, reports, reflections
Math Fluency	Applying number sense, problem-solving, and reasoning
Scientific Thinking	Asking questions, experimenting, observing the world around them
Research & Inquiry	Learning how to find, evaluate, and use information

How can you ensure your child stays socially connected.

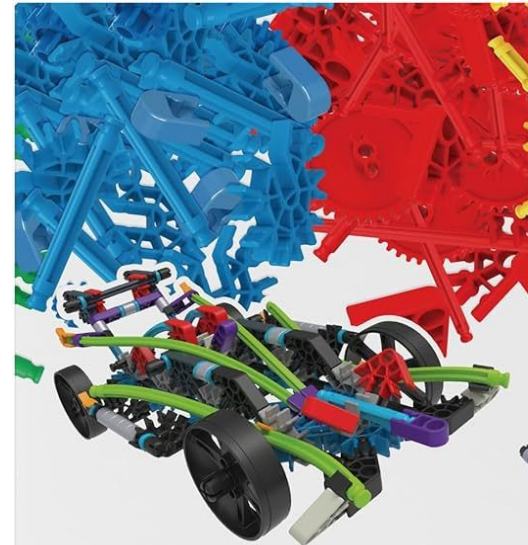
- Have family learning sessions especially for presentations and projects

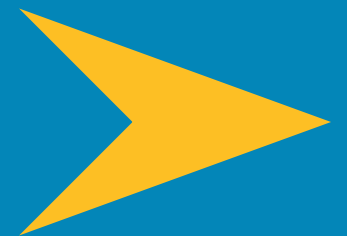

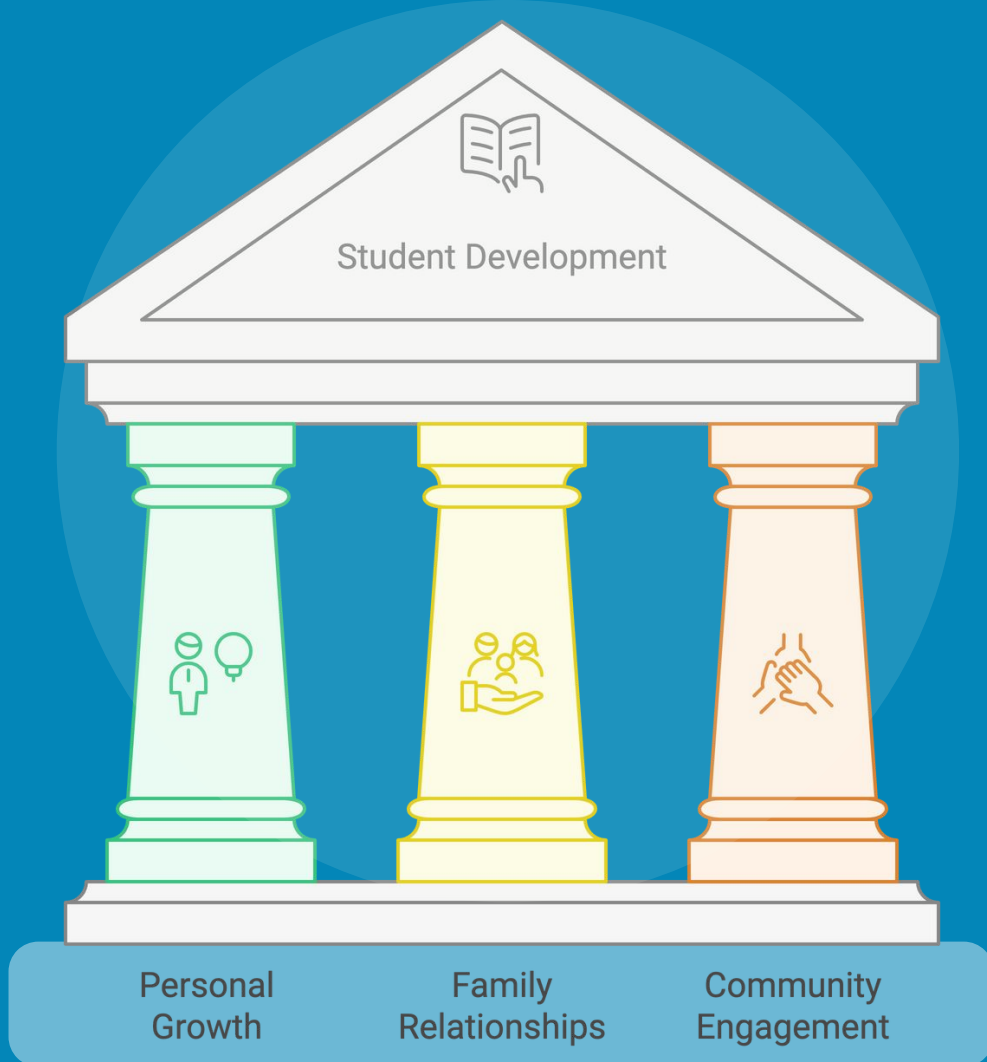
