

Festival Stays



A Festival Stay is like a modern, micro family festival — music, fire, story, and celebration — but instead of lasting just a weekend, it unfolds across days or weeks.

Each stay is anchored in the rhythms of traditional seasonal festivals: harvest feasts, rituals, ceremonies, and woodland folklore.

Children join our Nature Club (Mon-Fri) with foraging, crafts, building, and river play, while parents reclaim time to rest, co-work, or join workshops. Every stay builds to a Village Celebration, where families gather around fire, food, and story.

What's included in every Festival Stay?

*Daily Nature Club for children (Mon-Fri, 9:00-16:00)

*Access to gardens, river, and salt pool

*Grow-Make-Eat' sessions woven into the rhythm

*3 Workshops a Week and one off site trip

*A family-style celebration at the end of each stay

6-Night Festival Stays → Fully catered Breakfast, lunch, and dinner every day.

Two-Week Festival Stays → Mostly catered

Daily breakfast and lunch + 3 shared evening dinners

each week.

Month-Long Festival Stays → Evening Table Edition Self-catered apartments, with 3 shared dinners each week around long tables.





Autumn in the valley is all colour and warmth. The hills blaze red and gold, wood stoves burn in the apartments, and candlelit dinners fill the sous sol.

Families join the harvest rhythm — pulling squash and root veg from the garden, roasting chestnuts on open fires, and gathering at chestnut festivals across the valley.

Children take part in daily Grow-Make-Eat sessions, cooking and crafting from the land as the season deepens.









Month Long Stay

13 Sep - 11 Oct 2025

> 13 Sep - 11 Oct 2026

Children design and construct domes, dens, and forest of playstations. They map the land, make signs, dye flags, and tell stories through what they've built — a month of hands-on rhythm, soil, and story.

Immersive Theatre Special

Children follow clues, craft potions, and build the story together through riddles, woodland missions, and apothecary making. Parents join in with cooking, crafts, and fireside gatherings, as evenings close with original song and shared meals.




Spring



Spring here is something you notice day by day.

Orchards burst into blossom, the chestnut woods turn green, and rivers run fast and clear with mountain snowmelt. Mornings can still be cold — most families keep the wood stove going — but afternoons are spent outdoors in the garden or walking the valley.

Local life shifts too: markets fill with goat cheese, wild garlic, and the first strawberries, and villages gather for Arbre de Mai traditions with music, dancing, and seasonal food. Children take part through daily Grow-Make-Eat sessions — planting in the garden, foraging wild greens, and helping prepare simple spring dishes.

Eestival Stays

28 March - 4

April

5 - 12 April

Families step out of winter's hibernation and into a rhythm of light, growth, and connection. Mornings open space for parents to breathe — time for rest, work, or simply being — while children dive into garden planting, foraging, and seasonal crafts.

Afternoons draw families back together through shared workshops and spring rituals that remind us how good it feels to rise side by side.

Month Long Festival Stay

28 March - 4 April 5 - 12 April


Children spend the month sowing seeds, foraging wild greens, and turning harvests into crafts and preserves. From hand-dyed cloths to jars of wild pesto, each project builds toward the finale: a family-run market day with stalls, music, and shared food.

The Spring Market Festival — children host stalls, share performances, and welcome families and neighbours for a seasonal feast.













Families join a week of foraging, crafting, and kelebration. Children gather wild herbs and flowers for wreaths and teas, help prepare spring feasts, and make costumes and props for the final procession. Original live music, fire, and shared meals weave the story into a festival of the coming of summer.




Summer




Summer here is warm and consistent, but never overwhelming. Where the mountains meet the Mediterranean, the river keeps the valley fresh and the forest offers shade and breeze when the sun is high.

Our old silk factory stays cool through the heat of the day — wide, open apartments with original stone and cement floors give families space to breathe. Children spend hours in the river, swimming, rafting, or adventuring upstream, while evenings gather everyone at outdoor tables under the trees.







Month Long Festival Stay

31 May - 28 June

* Children turn water into a playpround for creativity - *
building bamboo water parks, making music with water,
and experimenting with river-inspired art.

Afternoons bring dance, rhythm, and movement games, leading toward a final performance. Original music is created together, with local musicians joining to make the celebration come alive.


