introduction

Dreams are magical and they have meaning. They are mystical messages, whether it is foreshadowing ar event or a simple reminder.

Dreams Within Dreams Tarot started as a way for me to express and reflect on the early beginnings of my journey through art. After all, art is healing too. This tarot was inspired by my own experiences and learning how to heal for and with my inner child. She led the way for us and has made it a lot less scary. Hence, the deck includes comforting imagery from cartoons and anime, mythology and folklore, my cultural influences, and of course, my own dreams.

While this guidebook includes my own interpretation of each card's meaning, this deck is meant to be read intuitively with fluidity and flow, by tapping into your own experiences and inner voice.

I hope you find comfort in this deck as you continue dreaming.

dream journaling

If you often have dreams and don't remember the details when you're awake, I highly recommend you to keep a dream journal. The moment you wake up, jot down any details you remember: people, colors, smells, tastes, animals, sounds, words, etc. It doesn't have to be full sentences either. Make note of the date as well. That way, you can always go back to review and interpret your dreams and decipher its meaning. Perhaps you'll notice a theme or pattern?

0. the traveler

Life's an adventure. What awaits you along the journey? The young rabbit may be a little naive, but they are excited for new beginnings. A white rabbit generally symbolizes good luck, hope, and longevity.

Keywords: new beginnings, wanderlust, innocence Reversal: naivety, too trusting, beware of rushing, watch where you're going, reckless



1. the magician

Sometimes we forget how talented or capable we truly are. The Magician here is holding a wand, burning brightly, and looking up with eagerness and a little bit of hesitation. On a wooden table, lies tools needed to do what needs to be done. Once you start working, don't hold back!

Keywords: potential, manifestation, skill, alignment, creativity, willpower Reversal: off track, self-doubt, lost, illusion, deception



2. the high priestess

The High Priestess knows all. Nothing can go past her eyes. She sits in between everything – good and evil, negative and positive, dark and light. She holds a book of knowledge and signifies spiritual wisdom. Perhaps it's time to listen.

Keywords: secrets, mysteries, connection to the spirit world, intuition Reversal: lack of understanding, blocked inner power, repressed feelings



3. the empress

The Empress is everything. She knows her worth and understands her time and presence is a privilege to those she chooses to spend her time with. She is not in any rush and people go out of their way for her. She brings blessings and abundance to those who are worthy. She is seen here resting and being still with the beauty of nature.

Keywords: abundance, nurturing, self-expression, universal knowledge, beauty of nature, motherhood Reversal: dependence, lack of self-reliance, overbearing, creative blockages, missing connection with nature



4. the emperor

The Emperor may seem stoic, but rest assured, he is observing with strength and wisdom. He represents vast experience and the patience needed to rule with practicality and structure. He sits on a throne along with flowers as well. There is softness in strength and force as well.

Keywords: ambition, discipline, structure, leadership Reversal: controlling, abuse of power, rigidity and no room for flexibility, coldness



5. the teacher

The Teacher (The Hierophant) represents tradition and knowledge. He is seen here standing in ceremonial attire, but is still approachable. He is not sitting but standing on steps. Tradition may seem intimidating or even infuriating, but there is always room to ask questions – and room especially for your own interpretation of things.

Keywords: tradition, ethics, societal norms
Reversal: rebellion, questioning, new approaches, mix
things up



6. the lovers

Protected and blessed, two people are embracing one another with love and gentleness. Also, the two look similar and mirror each other. In addition to love with another, this portrayal also represents the importance of truly loving oneself. Arguably, the strongest power out there is unconditional love; to love yourself unconditionally is powerful.

Keywords: connection, love, romance, passion, partnerships
Reversal: frustration in love, distrusting, unreliability in relationships, unrequited



7. the chariet

The chariot is pulling you towards a direction. There are ropes to guide the griffin, but the hand is gripping onto the chariot instead. Do you know where you're going or are you passively sitting by? To the cultures that often reference the griffin, this creature is referred to as a divine guardian and it can be symbolic of enlightenment, independence, wisdom, strength, vengeance, and loyalty.

Keywords: know where you're going, focus, goals, overcoming challenges
Reversal: aimless, focusing on the wrong things, disorganization, opposition



8. strength

Sometimes, we struggle with strength – especially in the face of fear or when we get in our heads or even when we hold ourselves accountable. The person here is seen half asleep while a white tiger is wide awake. Strength is a process of trust. The white tiger symbolizes power, awe and fear, and more than just beauty and majesty. In some cultures, white tigers are thought to ward off evil spirits.

Keywords: inner power, courage, confidence Reversal: vulnerable, doubt, arrogance, fear, avoidance



9. the hermit

Does being a hermit mean complete isolation? Not necessarily. In fact, the Hermit is here to remind us about the importance of being in our own space – even if it means to simply relax in the bathtub. Also, notice that there are candles all around. Candles may symbolize a protective space. It also represents the light amid the darkness of life, bright future, vitality of the sun, or uncertainty of life and transience.

Keywords: self-reflection, soul searching, introspection, solitude Reversal: loneliness, hiding yourself



10. wheel of fate

Is there one wheel of fate or are there many? What does it mean to do what you're meant to do? The personification of destiny and universal order appears across many cultures, such as the Norns in Norse mythology, and Maat in ancient Egyptian religion. The threads of fate in this depiction are inspired by an ancient Chinese legend, where the Red Thread of Fate is considered invisible and ties all those whose lives will intertwine

Keywords: flow of life, cycles, lessons, fate, progress Reversal: delays, stagnation, disruption



11. justice

What is the difference between law and order and fairness? Justice is here to ensure that the fairest decision will be made. A blindfolded person is holding up a sword and the scales to demonstrate authority and balance.

Keywords: truth, honesty, law, cause and effect Reversal: lies, corruption, prejudice, unfairness



12. the hanged one

The Hanged One is upside down and can be seen with spiders and its web. When things feel stagnant, it's like you can't move, no matter how hard you try. Now, is it necessarily a bad thing? Spiders symbolize patience and persistence. The spider's ability to spin webs may also mean balance, interconnection, evolution, and transformation.

Keywords: let go, pause, new perspectives, you are where you're meant to be
Reversal: stalling, stuck, resistance, re-evaluation



13. death

Death doesn't have to be so scary, now does it? Are we afraid of death or are we afraid of the unknown? Here is a skeletal figure, dressed in a white and blue robe. Nuestra Señora de la Santa Muerte is a personification of death and is associated with healing, love, safe passage to the afterlife, prosperity, good health, fortune, and protection. Like her, death is so much more.

Keywords: endings and new beginnings, rebirth
Reversal: fear of change, refusal to move forward,
resistance



14. temperance

A creature with horns and dark wings is looking at its reflection in the lake. Who looks back? The element of water has been associated with rich meanings, ranging from being the source of life to intuition and dreams. The creature looks at itself in a different light in the water. Temperance is here as a gentle reminder in finding balance in your life. Too much of anything can be bad for you.

Keywords: balance, peace, patience, moderation Reversal: neglect, excess, lack of balance



15. the devil

Inspired by Lilith, this interpretation of the Devil sits on her throne confidently with judgment in her eyes. She sees everything: the good, the bad, the ugly, and the beautiful. Behind her are mirrors, some are shattered. Who do you see when you look at her? Or in the mirrors behind her? Is it a warning or a reminder? Or both?

Keywords: desire, addiction, bad intentions, restrictions, playfulness
Reversal: release, freedom, restoring control, detachment



16. the tower

A person is looking up at the tower, contemplating. In this depiction, the tower is not on fire, but rather the few moments before the fire. While we may not always know what is coming up next in life, sometimes we just get a feeling that something is coming. What you do when the tower is here is up to you.

Keywords: chaos, unexpected major life event, revelation, spiritual awakening, uncomfortable but necessary release Reversal: disaster avoided, rebuilding, reflection



17. the star

Why swim when you can fly? Why not both?
Humphack whales are magical creatures and are often
related to spiritual matters. They signify the ability to
move forward, important communication, and to not
lose sight of what is yours and what you want from
life. This whale is flying towards a specific star while
the lights are dancing in the sky.

Keywords: healing, hope, faith, renewal, direction Reversal: despair, pessimism, boredom, lack of inspiration



18. the moon

Inspired by Isis, the goddess of life and magic. The Moon here is shown twice - the full moon offers an opportunity to reflect, given that it is about endings, not beginnings. The waning crescent moon encourages you to evaluate old habits and relationship. It also is a reminder of the importance of reflection - especially when things are hidden on purpose.

Keywords: illusions, deception, fear, subconscious, dreams, hidden secrets

Reversal: illumination, overcoming obstacles, clarity



19. the sun

Inspired by the sun god in different cultures, the sun is shining brightly behind the figure. The sun represents life, but it's also known to typify energy, power, positivity, and clarity. The sun is a natural force that's outside of our control, but it also illuminates the world around us. Sometimes joy and success is all around us, but we get wrapped in the messiness or busyness of life. Find happiness where the sun shines.

Keywords: happiness, success, joy Reversal: burnout, negativity



20. judgement

Judgement, also known as karma, appears here as a large reflection in the sky. Is it a mirror? Or is it a portal? When Judgement comes, who judges you and where do you go? What goes around comes around.

Keywords: reckoning, judgment, rebirth, blessings Reversal: difficulties, doubt, lack of self-awareness



21. the universe

A door opens to a vast sky filled with planets and stars. Our universe is so much more than what we may know, and it is an expanse of light and all the interconnectedness we cannot see. This represents a sense of wholeness and completeness. It will be necessary to celebrate and give back to the world, to learn and to share.

Keywords: fulfillment, celebration, completion, accomplishment

Reversal: lack of success, detour, incomplete, lack of vision

Keywords: planning, making decisions, new perspectives, waiting

Reversal: fear of change, playing safe, bad planning

3 of wands

Are your plans moving ahead? This fairy is considering her future as she gazes at the riveting body of water and nature below.

Keywords: looking into the future, rapid growth, expansion

Reversal: lack of ambition, obstacles, losing control, frustrations

4 of wands

There's a reason to celebrate! There are good things to come, but more importantly, a necessity to appreciate the good in the present.

Keywords: joy, home, community, appreciation
Reversal: lack of support, feeling unwelcome, lack of community

5 of wands

8 of wands

Keywords: progress, quick changes, sudden decisions, movement Reversal: delays, loss of momentum, bastiness

9 of wands

When reality hits you hard, it is incredibly tempting to just give up.

But will you? Taking your time to get back up is fine too.

Keywords: persistence, getting close, almost there, last stand

Reversal: exhaustion, tired, giving up

10 of wands

Sometimes, life gets so hard and you carry so much burden that you just want to destroy everything - like the sea monster here.

Keywords: burden, overworked, burn out, heavy responsibilities
Reversal: breakdown, doing too much, not receiving help

queen of wands

Pele is the goddess of volcanoes, fire, and the creator of the volcanic landscapes known today as the Hawaiian Islands. Like fire, she represents ambition, and leadership and just as flames offer warmth and light, she too offers generosity.

Keywords: confident, leadership, determination, ambition, generosity Reversal: vengeful, selfishness, insecurities, pushy

king of wands

The phoenix represents rebirth, life, growth, virtue, pride, regeneration, and survival. It is also seen as a noble bird that was able to judge the character of human beings and confer blessings to.

Keywords: leadership, risk taker, vision, optimism
Reversal: domineering, unachievable, powerless, ineffective

ace of coins

A gold coin glimmers behind the clouds. There is a new opportunity on the horizon!

Keywords: new opportunity, potential, unexpected offer Reversal: lost opportunity, missed chance

2 of coins

There is a need for a delicate balance. As you're dancing through
life, make sure you're not taking on too much.

Keywords: flexibility, balance, adapting to change
Reversal: overwhelmed, lack of organization, lack of resources

3 of coins

Collaboration may not always be easy because of differences, but no one can deny the importance of a united team.

Keywords: teamwork, planning, building, collaboration Reversal: disorganization, group conflict, competition Be careful! Don't get stuck in keeping things to yourself for too long.

2 of swords

Keywords: decisions, partnerships, balance, truce

Reversal: indecision, difficult choice

3 ef swerds

Daggers protrude through the heart, representing suffering and the long journey through grief in order to heal. How to hegin anew?

Keywords: suffering, grief, hearthreak
Reversal: healing, forgiveness, recovery

4 of swords

It is important to rest and restore your energy. If not, this can lead to mistakes in your work and life.

Keywords: sleepless, hopelessness, anxiety, troubles

Reversal: reaching out, hope, strength

10 ef swerds

An angel falls towards pointed swords. There is nothing to stop their fall as the end is their collapse. But there is room to recover and heal. Keywords: ultimate hetrayal, painful endings, collapse, failure Reversal: going up from here, can't get any worse, recovery

page of swords

There is an energy of passion and enthusiasm and as their curiosity leads them to learning and growing educated about the unknown. Keywords: curiosity, energetic, talkative, restlessness Reversal: all talk, manipulation, lack of ideas, broken promises

knight of swords

The knight symbolizes ambition, drive, and determination. Instead of a horse, the large serpent represents a creative life force.

Keywords: confidence, quick thinking, seize the moment, sharp

Reversal: disregard of consequences, arrogance, impatience



queen of swords

With fierce determination and skill, Queen
Amanirenas led her people and Kingdom
of Kush to the successful defense against
Augustus Caesar and the Roman Empire.
She shows up here to give a nudge in the
right direction when it comes to strategy.
Keywords: fierce, independent,
constructive criticism, logic and reason
Reversal: rude, barsh, overly critical, lack
of empathy, poor communication

king of swords

The Kỳ Lân is a mythical creature known as the Vietnamese unicorn. The unicorn symbolizes peace, mercy, good fortune, intelligence, and goodness.

Keywords: intellectual power, authority, ethics, truth, self-discipline Reversal: abuse of power, lack of integrity, cruel

ace of cups

A goldfish watches as a cup pours a source of water into another."
There will be new beginnings and love, compassion, and luck.
Keywords: intimacy, feelings, compassion, new possibility
Reversal: anguish, cold, bad news, emotional loss, blocked creativity

2 of cups

Two people hold onto each other as teacups pour out their contents.

This represents a new partnership or connection between a pair.

Keywords: partnership, unity, connection, closeness, mutual respect

Reversal: separation, rejection, tension, mismatch, imbalance

3 of cups

Are you enjoying your friends' company? Are they enjoying yours? Keywords: friendship, community, gatherings, social events Reversal: imbalanced social life, isolation, gossip, loneliness

4 of cups

Your eyes may be closed, with dissatisfaction and apathy with your surroundings. But, you might be missing something. Keywords: apathy, contemplation, boredom, dissatisfaction Reversal: clarity, awareness, moving forward, taking action

S of cups

There's a sense of loss; a situation not being represented as expected. Keywords: loss, grief, sadness, disappointment, mourning Reversal: acceptance, finding peace, moving on

6 of cups

Two people look out towards a sea of butterflies, reminiscing on the
past. Are you appreciating the past or stuck in the past?
Keywords: memories, familiarity, comfort, playfulness
Reversal: leaving home, independence

7 of cups

The woman has options all around her, but she is focused on her reflection. There are options, yes, but where does she go from her? Keywords: abundance of options, opportunities, choices, daydream Reversal: bad decisions, no good options, feeling trapped

8 of cups

A mermaid beckons the stars as she reaches her hand out towards the moon and galaxies. Empty chalices lie discarded behind her, representing letting go, looking forward towards truth. Keywords: let go, leave behind, search for truth Reversal: stagnant, avoidance, fear, afraid to move forth

9 of cups

A person dances in the wake of spilling cups, representing success, and the enjoyment of their achievements. There is a feeling of being fulfilled in the presence of abundance.

Keywords: wish fulfillment, success, recognition, achievements Reversal: underachievement, shattered dreams, something's missing

10 of cups

There is a sense of domestic bliss and home as the family enjoys their time together, with a sense of completeness and satisfaction. Keywords: happiness, reunion, domestic harmony, homecoming Reversal: familial conflict, separation, isolation, unhappiness

page of cups

Sometimes, the unexpected inspiration comes to us from the unconscious, perhaps in ways that we may not truly understand. Keywords: surprising insight, creative opportunities, curiosity Reversal: creative blocks, emotional immaturity, doubts

knight of cups

Under the sea, a merperson is swimming alongside a large koifish, which symbolizes love, friendship, and peace. Is this a love offer? Keywords: romance, imagination, beauty, following the heart Reversal: unrealistic, jealousy, disappointment

queen of cups

represents compassion and a nurturing mother. But she does not only show motherbood as there is a sense of leadership in wisdom. Follow your intuition and remain observant. Keywords: compassion, nurturing, wisdom, perceptiveness Reversal: codependency, ignores issues, worries

Yemaya, the ocean mother goddess,



king of cups

A giant sea dragon imposes its presence above the sea, mountainous lies behind it. It bears control of the sea, strength, and empathy.

Keywords: control over emotions, diplomatic, empathy
Reversal: manipulation, withdrawn, selfishness, repressed
