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INTRODUCTION

TO THE TAROT

The tarot has had a long and complicated journey. The earliest iterations of playing cards recognizable to today's readers were beautifully hand-painted playing cards from western Asia and northern Africa. First created for use in card games, then popularized as a means of divination around the turn of the twentieth century, the tarot has been more recently regarded as a tool for interpersonal reflection. Each deck functions as a many faceted storybook designed to help you assess your life and circumstances in new ways.

The deck is roughly divided into five segments. The Major Arcana speaks to big life themes, while each of the four suits in the Minor Arcana corresponds to distinct regions of your life. The Chalice center the heart, the Swords center the mind, the Coins refer to material resources, and the Wands refer to creative resources.

Western interest in the Occult and a generous dose of Orientalism greatly informed much of the iconography of the most recognizable tarot decks. At the turn of the century, European tastemakers and artists would often misappropriate imagery from Africa and Asia to convey a superficial sense

of mystery and exoticism, and even the classic Rider-Waite-Smith deck is no exception. The *Star Spinner* is meant to evoke iconography that is less deeply rooted in that esoteric visual language and challenge the imperialist trappings of that time. The images draw from children's stories, myths, and fairy tales that might already be familiar to the reader. You will find mermaids with hearts abundant as the ocean, fairies playing between dreaming and waking. You might find the fruit of knowledge hinting at a transition between naivety and knowing, and you'll discover old goddesses of the moon and the sun in a new light.

Forgoing the promise of cosmic insight, the *Star Spinner Tarot* trusts that you know your own life best. It is a medium by which you can illuminate the threads that connect seemingly disparate pieces of your day-to-day experiences. Each reading is a gentle reminder to carefully examine those connections and figure out how to make the most of your discoveries. It is created to be a gentle guide, like softly twinkling stars over a particularly long stretch of night.

THE MAJOR AND MINOR ARCANA

The Major Arcana is comprised of twenty-two cards representing the major moments or lessons in your life. Numbered 0 to 21 (XXI), these cards have a bit more gravity to them than the Minor Arcana, and they can strongly affect the greater themes present in a reading. Chronologically, the cards cast the figure of the Fool, an allegory for the the reader of the cards, as the story's protagonist, and each card in the Major Arcana corresponds to part of the Fool's Journey.

The Minor Arcana is divided into four suits of fourteen cards each, ten of them numbered, and four court cards. The numbered cards refer to small moments or specific instances in your life, while the court cards tend to represent people of different temperaments at different places in their journeys.

The Suit of Chalices is primarily concerned with emotions and relationships. It is about love and kinship in all its forms, as well as all those things a close relationship can build. Associated with water, the Chalices can be both nourishing and tempestuous. This deck's Chalices roughly follow the journey of Hans Christian Andersen's *The Little*

Mermaid. Themes of longing, desire, sacrifice, and fulfillment are at the heart of the deck.

The Suit of Swords represents intellect. It deals with matters of the mind in frank and occasionally brutally honest ways. Though the mind is a beautiful thing, it can also obsess and become self-destructive. The Swords are associated with the element of air, and they signify action, decision, direction, and consequences. Here, the cards tend to skew closer to more traditional tarot imagery.

The Suit of Coins deals with material resources. The Coins are associated with the earth, and they are concerned with money, livelihood, and wealth. The motif of the rabbits implies good luck and proliferation on the surface, but it also connects the Coins to the Moon card, emphasizing the relationship between our resources and our emotions.

The Suit of Wands represents passion, energy, and creative motivation. The Wands are connected to fire, and they deal with the things that spark a sense of purpose within us. The Wands speak to matters of spirituality, creativity, and passion. Fairies guide the imagery of this suit, signifying the twilight space between inspiration and action.

INSTRUCTIONS

FOR YOUR READING

It is common practice among tarot readers to get to know each deck they use. Recommended methods vary, but it is generally agreed that a stronger relationship with a deck makes for smoother and more precise readings. The simplest means of getting to know your deck is through continued use.

This deck features multiple variants of the Lovers card. For the most faithfully traditional readings, remove all but one of the Lovers. Select the one that feels best suited to you, and lay the rest aside before each reading. Having multiples of the same card may have an adverse effect on readings, especially if the reading requires fewer cards. Once the deck has its intended seventy-eight cards, you may begin.

First, the deck must be shuffled. You may choose to do this yourself, or, if you're reading for someone else, you may ask if they would like to shuffle the deck instead. (The "querent" is the person for whom the reading is being conducted.) Once the cards are shuffled, focus on your intentions, your questions for the Star Spinner, and lay the cards in the spread that best meets your needs.

SPREADS

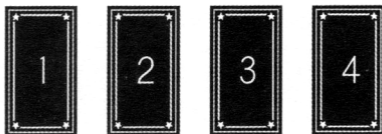
SINGLE-CARD DRAW

Ask a simple question, draw a card, and consider the card's relationship to your question. The strength of the cards is in their relationships to one another, so this method won't answer all your questions.

However, a single-card draw can be a great way to get acquainted with each individual card and make it easier to navigate more complex readings.

FOUR-CARD SPREAD

This is an easy spread for beginners, and it can be used for quick and elegantly simple readings. The answers it yields are usually broad and straightforward, with the card's position representing the following.



1. The querent
2. The past
3. The present
4. The future

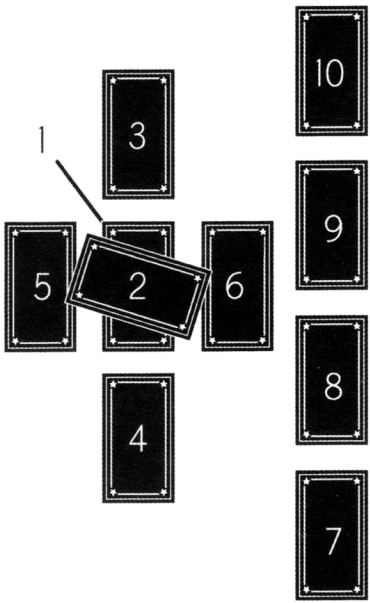
THE CELTIC CROSS

The Celtic Cross is one of the most widely used spreads. Though it looks complex, the Celtic Cross progresses in a rather intuitive pattern. This spread requires a more confident handle on the meanings of the individual cards as well as their relationships to one another.

The Celtic Cross is divided into two segments. On the left is the querent. This portion makes sense of the person for whom the reading is conducted. It places the querent in a place on their journey and illustrates their priorities, both intellectual and emotional. On the right is the advice column. This portion suggests actions and consequences.

The tenth and final card in the spread reveals the eventual outcome of the situation, should the querent choose to stay their course.

UPRIGHT

The Fool indicates one who is ready to take the first steps in a new direction and explore previously untapped potential. There is a deep naivety about the Fool, representing someone who lives in the moment and looks ahead only to positive possibilities. The impetus to move forward is only done on a whim, plain and simple. The optimistic nature of this card is buoyed by a bit of good luck and a predilection for adventure.

REVERSE

What are the areas in your life where you are reticent for no reason? In this position, the Fool cautions us to check our stubborn, petulant side. Take responsibility for your own missteps. Uncharted territory can be anxiety-inducing. Do not let this fear make you afraid of new opportunities. Do not be afraid of growth.

UPRIGHT

The Magician makes efficient use of all available tools. While the Fool daydreams of grand possibility, the Magician takes the steps necessary to realize those dreams. There is planning and intentionality involved, as well as resourcefulness and a clarity of purpose. While the Fool relies on luck, the Magician knows luck favors the prepared.

REVERSE

The Magician in this position is a reminder that desire for control can be stifling or even destructive. In this case, the inclination to plan is almost solely motivated by fear. Even the best laid plans can be upended, but it is still possible to move forward after stumbling. Beware of those subtle manipulators who seek to wrest control of your fate out from your own hands.

UPRIGHT

The High Priestess is a symbol of wisdom and introspection. The moon and the sun held up by the pillars illustrate how both clarity and mystery can support the same essential truths. While the Magician makes use of the known world looking outward, the High Priestess turns inward. When the observable truth presents more obstacles than solutions, it may be appropriate to trust the things you know but cannot yet name. Trust your heart.

REVERSE

In this position, the High Priestess encourages us to discern the difference between a mystery and a lie. Trusting your intuition must be tempered with a healthy degree of skepticism. Are you unable to name your challenges because they are new? Or is it because the full scope of the truth has been concealed from you? Who is keeping secrets?

The Empress is representative of generosity and comfort. The Fool wishes, the Magician plans, the High Priestess ponders, and the Empress provides. This card indicates the satisfaction of natural desires through careful cultivation and mindful stewardship.

REVERSE

Priorities must be reassessed. You may have neglected to attend to those things that are essential to your happiness. Attempts to convey care and thoughtfulness have twisted into something smothering and overbearing. If you overwater your plants, their roots will rot.

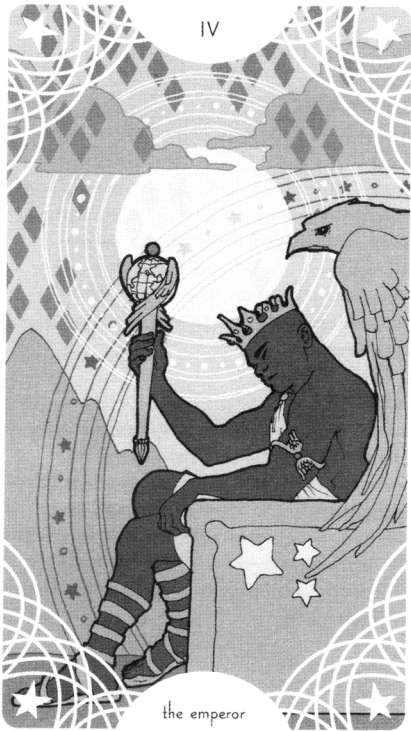
UPRIGHT

The Emperor brings steady leadership and direction, and represents reliability and organization. Under the Emperor's leadership, there is a protocol at the ready for every possible challenge. The world is represented on his scepter, tying the Emperor to the suit of Coins. The eagle indicates a sharpness of mind, a connection to the suit of Swords. You find yourself confident in your capacity to make responsible decisions for yourself and others. You have done as much preparation as is necessary, so move forward with your plans.

REVERSE

In this position, the Emperor is a tyrannical figure. Power is abused and corrupted. Institutions are rigid, unmoving, and unfair. The tallest fortress walls are only a veneer, and they will crumble under the slightest scrutiny. Beware of those who feel entitled to your loyalty, your labor, and your livelihood. Likewise, be careful not to overstep your sense of authority.

UPRIGHT

While the High Priestess represents our internal spiritual workings, the Hierophant is a figure of benign externalized spirituality—a representative of spiritual authority, guidance, and tradition. The keys mark the Hierophant as a gatekeeper. Though there may be some preparation and commitment necessary, it may be worthwhile to seek an organized outlet for a shared expression of spirituality.

REVERSE

The Hierophant in reverse is a dogmatic figure who must be questioned. The systems and traditions from which the Hierophant's authority is granted might be oppressive, bloated by corruption, or twisted with hypocrisy. Interrogate whether your expressions of spirituality are hollow displays of piety or truly meant to serve the greater good.

Before the first shuffle, remember to add only the lovers card or cards that call to you the most to your deck.

UPRIGHT

The Lovers represent mutual desire. They herald healthy partnerships, unions born of consent and enthusiasm. There is attraction and passionate exploration fueled by a mutual curiosity, signified by the apples. The presence of the apples in this deck serves as a symbol of curiosity fulfilled and of maturity. The relationship feels like paradise, and all parties seem to be getting what they want and need. A healthy balance is struck between desire and promise, wishing and fulfillment.

REVERSE

The Lovers reversed warns of broken unions. A cycle of mutual desire and beneficence is broken, leaving one or all involved parties feeling incomplete and bereft. The card may also indicate that a partnership has stagnated and begun to fester without proper care and attention. Can Eden be forever?

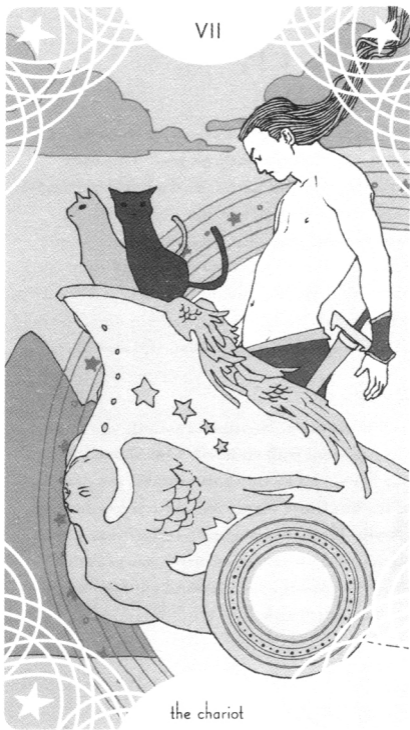
UPRIGHT

The Chariot is a card of steady progression and clear goals. It represents healthy motivation, willpower, and practical application of wisdom. The Chariot represents certainty. There is a definitive sense of direction that propels the journey. Challenges are considered, addressed, and overcome. The black and white cats indicate duality, and they look in two different directions. The Chariot has no reins and is propelled by force of will.

REVERSE

The Chariot reversed asks you to interrogate your goals and means of achieving them. Check for undue ruthlessness and question honestly whether the ends are worth the current means. There may be better ways forward. The Chariot may also be telling you that you are being pulled in several different directions, but you can only chart one way forward. Take a step back and figure out what your motivations should be before you continue your journey.

UPRIGHT

Fortitude is the representative of courage, and there is no courage without fear. This card indicates that you have found a healthy measure of patience for yourself. This is a reminder to acknowledge your shortcomings and all the anxieties that accompany them, and then work your way forward. The lotus flower represents the way that strength is cultivated. Out of the mud and through the water, a beautiful flower rises.

REVERSE

In this position, Fortitude reminds you to be more patient with yourself. Our shortcomings, our flaws, and all our past mistakes are parts of us, but those things should not hinder our growth. If we are not gentle and patient with ourselves, how can we cultivate our growth? Progress requires risk; remind yourself that you are worth that risk.

UPRIGHT

The Hermit is similar to the High Priestess with an emphasis on seeking the truth, but the Hermit is most concerned with assessing everything that has happened to inform your place in the world. Perhaps difficult decisions were made, but you have largely made peace with the outcome. The Hermit represents a need for introspection and retreat. Sometimes it is difficult to be in the world, so it is necessary to step back and affirm yourself. The Hermit uses a sounding staff to gently alert those around you that you are moving through a space.

REVERSE

In reverse, the Hermit lacks certainty. Did you do the right thing? You may have withdrawn into yourself out of fear of irreparable mistakes. Your confidence is broken, and you are unable to forgive yourself. You self-isolate to hide from the world and turn your eyes away from the choices that led you here. It is time to come out of hiding and face your fears.

UPRIGHT

The Wheel of Fate is a reminder that things are as they are meant to be. There are good turns and there are bad turns, but so long as the Wheel turns, life proceeds. It is a reminder that, despite all its highs and lows, life continues. The Wheel of Fate generally heralds a certain amount of good luck.

REVERSE

The Wheel has hit a snag, unable to move forward. Sometimes challenges can slow you down, but it's important not to let them stop you altogether. Things cannot get better if you dwell on your lowest points. In this position, the Wheel encourages you to keep going, or else your poor luck will never change.

UPRIGHT

Justice reminds us to actively course-correct those instances of institutional bias. It is not simply a matter of what is fair. Justice interrogates which lenses are corrupted by structures that value a concentration of power. Regardless of whether or not it benefits you personally, value and pursue what is right instead of, or perhaps despite, what is popular.

REVERSE

Justice reversed is a reminder to ask when and how we are complicit in perpetuating injustice. What do you omit from your personal narrative to protect your comfort? What stake do you have in maintaining the status quo? You currently benefit from someone else's loss, and you must take steps to correct this.

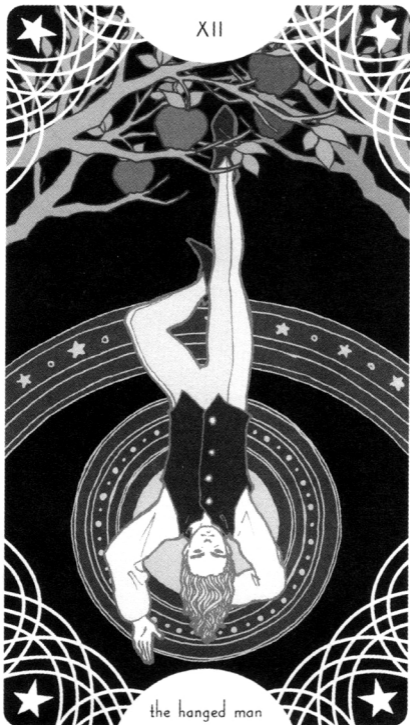
UPRIGHT

The Hanged Man is an appeal to patience. It might feel like too much is currently on hold, but perhaps this is for the best. The Hanged Man asks you to be patient with yourself and serves as a reminder that growth comes slowly. Be assured that biding your time is not the same as wasting it. There is no sense in picking a fruit before it has time to ripen.

REVERSE

In reverse, the Hanged Man warns that your personal stagnation might be due to an inability to articulate those frustrating things that give you pause. Are you giving yourself a reprieve, or are you clinging to this moment because change is difficult? The card asks how others might be adversely affected by your willful stubbornness.

The Death card portends change. Nyx holds her child, Thanatos, gently beckoning souls into the next life. Though it may initially read as a bad omen, Death simply refers to cycles of change in a broader sense. When an era comes to a close, a new one springs up at its heels. The figure of Death in this case signifies satisfactory closure and completion.

REVERSE

Death in reverse warns of ghosts. You may lack proper closure, and be unable to let go of the past. By dwelling on life as it was, you cannot proceed, and you forget to live.

Temperance signifies self-discipline and strength of character. As Death suggests an ever-changing world, Temperance represents the certainty that the most essential parts of ourselves will remain. Despite the challenges and the pain that often accompany change and growth, you may find that your strong personal and interpersonal foundations help keep you grounded.

REVERSE

The reversed Temperance card reveals that those things we cling to in times of upheaval are not as reliable as we once believed. Examine your personal and interpersonal habits and honestly determine which of those things perpetuate patterns that drain you of your resources, your energy, your compassion, and your creativity.

UPRIGHT

The Devil is the avatar of compulsion and desire. Though we are inclined to temper our indulgent impulses, it is sometimes healthy to seek an outlet for them. You might take the next opportunity to yield to your passions. It could be just what you need. However, the Devil also warns you not to lose yourself in your passions or they will become your vices.

REVERSE

Your penchant for self-restraint and discipline has become stifling. Though you are dutiful and responsible, you have denied yourself joy and satisfaction in your day-to-day living. When good behavior is its own reward, it might be difficult to find motivation. It may also be that your pursuit of pleasure has taken a turn for the worse, and what began as a momentary release has developed into a bad habit.

UPRIGHT

The Tower bodes upheaval, moments where you are shaken to your very core and can feel your foundations crumbling beneath you. You may wonder who you have become. REVERSE

The walls you have built remain strong, but you never leave them. In an effort to hide from the wind and cold, you have also shut away the sun and stars. You resist change because it may entail starting over. To your mind, a fresh start is more of a threat than a new opportunity.

The Star is the guardian of this deck. She represents hope and endless possibility. The Star gently nurtures the flowers, and the ibis, a steward of creativity and magic, circles about her. After the Tower has fallen and the light of dusk fades into night, the Star is there to help you make your way through the dark. All you have to do is look up.

REVERSE

As the dust settles and the Tower lies in ruin, you may find yourself alone in the dark. Reversed, the Star cautions that you have fallen deep in despair and cannot move forward. Signs of hope seem too good to be true, and you feel more lost than ever. Take a moment to breathe and give yourself space to become reoriented.

The Moon is the card of dreams. Though you cannot know every bend in your path, continue to aspire and imagine. Precious little is illuminated by moonlight, and your fantasies can guide your impressions. This also means you may be led by your fears and anxieties. The Moon is represented here by a faithful wife who once guarded a seed of immortality for her husband. When a wicked man attempted to steal it for himself, she swallowed the seed and ascended into the heavens. The moon is her home; follow her guidance and trust your instincts.

REVERSE

In this position, the Moon suggests that you may find it difficult to trust yourself. Identify the things that make you doubt your own judgment. Are you motivated by obligation, or are you listening to your gut? You may need to examine when your decisions are informed by someone else's fears.

The Sun augurs a moment of sudden illumination. Truths are plainly observable, and there is joy and relief. The Sun brings warmth and the potential for growth as new patterns and habits are cultivated. This is a time to acknowledge and celebrate what makes you brilliant.

REVERSE

Though you may welcome an opportunity to bask in your own brilliance, it might be wise to assess the kind of space and attention you take. The ten crows rising in this card represent the sun goddess's ten children who, so impatient for glory, raced across the sky together and scorched the earth below. Do you seek to illuminate truth and beauty with your radiance, or do you simply burn too bright and too hot?

Judgment represents strength of character. Your journey has been long and difficult, and you have risen to the occasion at every challenge. You are ready to look back on your journey and assess your triumphs and failures. Judgment heralds a spiritual awakening. As one part of your journey comes to a close, a higher purpose calls to you. Heed that call.

REVERSE

Looking back on your long journey, do you notice that you have taken on too much? You may have overcommitted in an attempt to meet long-term goals, leaving you feeling overwhelmed and embittered. In this position, Judgment indicates a certain amount of unresolved enmity for the past. You have hidden away aspects of your journey out of embarrassment or regret, but now you must confront them before you can move on to your greater calling.

REVERSE

In an effort to have everything you want, you have spread yourself too thin and failed to see goals through to completion. You may remain within the confines of your comfort zones to protect yourself from the wider World, stifling your capacity to reach your full potential.

UPRIGHT

The Ace of Wands represents an initial spark that will lead to bigger things. There is creative energy brewing, and with it comes clarity and focus. You would do well to take advantage of this moment of invigoration in case it leads to more exciting opportunities.

REVERSE

Be wary of moments of hesitation due to laziness. This will stagnate growth and hinder personal progress. If you struggle to engage with your initial interests, passion will gradually turn into mere obligation. Your projects may lack inspiration.

From the initial spark of the Ace, take that energy and chart a course. Although you have a clearer idea of what your goals must be, there is still a good deal of planning to do. It requires a bit of willpower, but ultimately you understand how to apply your energies toward your goals.

REVERSE

You are caught at an impasse. Decision-making is difficult because you are still much too precious about your inspirations. If you do not fan those sparks, they will dwindle and dissipate. You must not lose out on grand opportunities because you are afraid of making the wrong choice.

You have been working a great deal, and there is plenty to celebrate. The Four of Wands indicates that you're approaching a point in your journey where you can afford to look back on all your hard work and congratulate yourself for it. Now is the time to celebrate

your accomplishments with your loved ones.

REVERSE

The foundations you have built feel unsteady. There has been a breakdown in communication somewhere in your closer circles, and it makes everyone feel ill at ease. Someone in your life might believe they are fully committed to something when they still have doubts. This could spell disaster down the line. It is time to sort out those variables and seek some measure of certainty.

The Five of Wands represents chaos and tension. There might be some compelling disagreements in your life, and nobody seems willing to compromise. A disruptive new element has entered the fray, and a tenuous period of harmony has been disturbed.

This need not be a negative thing. This great discord may help you better understand your ideals. Difficult conversations are being had, and issues can be confronted up front.

REVERSE

You refuse to engage in difficult conversations for fear of disturbing the status quo. In this position, the Five of Wands indicates that you are hesitant to accept conflict as a necessary part of growth and would prefer to avoid it altogether. Though you maintain a fragile peace, you continue to step lightly for fear of tearing open old wounds, and refuse to stand up for yourself.

UPRIGHT

You emerge from the fray to find yourself victorious. The Six of Wands tells how you have persevered from recent difficulties and come out on top. You have maintained a positive reputation despite having had many difficult conversations and engaging

in various conflicts. Though the grounds upon which you've tended your relationships have been well trodden, your relationships continue to bloom and stand tall.

REVERSE

Your progression toward your goals is thwarted. Success is postponed, and you must work much harder than you realized to hit your milestones. You encounter failure where you expect success. The Six of Wands also points to a moment where you find yourself humbled. Confidence is shaken. You may feel like the result of your work is not worth the tremendous effort you have put into it.

You rise to meet your challenges. The Seven of Wands indicates competition and the continued maintenance of the status you have achieved. Though you may face difficulties, you choose to stand firm. There is no adversity with which you cannot engage, regardless of whether you win

or lose. You are sure of your goals, and there is no negotiating them.

REVERSE

The struggle proves to be too much, and you are overwhelmed from the effort of defending yourself. You are plagued with self-doubt and feelings of inadequacy. This loss of position is a blow to your self-esteem, and your confidence is shattered. You have yielded to the will of others despite your ethical or moral reservations.

You are energized and ready for your next steps after a long period of waiting. There is sudden inspiration and motivation, and this burst of energy will help you move forward. The Eight of Wands can also indicate travel or momentum. You may have

broken through a creative block, and you feel as though you are finally going places.

REVERSE

Though you want to move on to the next stage in your goals, it feels like an uphill battle. There is restlessness and willingness to move, but there is also a lack of direction. This causes impatience and distraction, which further exacerbates your delays.

The Nine of Wands represents resilience in the face of weariness. You have been working your way toward your goals for a very long time, and fatigue is setting in. Difficult lessons have been learned, and you continue down your path unhindered, dutifully moving forward through sheer force of will. There is no giving up when your goals are so close.

REVERSE

Your setbacks have proven to be too much, and you feel broken under the weight of your responsibilities. The journey has been long and unfulfilling, and you cannot remember the point of all the struggle. You feel unsupported in your efforts. This may be a good opportunity to redefine your notion of success. If you feel like you have been set up to fail, try to determine what would help make your goals more manageable.

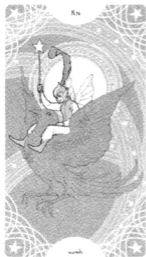

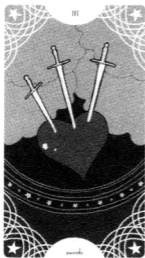

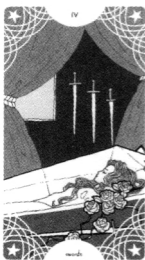
