

Roman Church became the biggest by 3 reasons.

2. Islamic Invasion—An Arab merchant named Mohamed founded the Islamic religion in 622 AD.




3. Charlemagne was crowned by Leo III on Dec. 25th, 800 AD.




5s' or 5 Solas

Prof. Peter Beyerhaus:

II. Roles and Influences of UBF (1)

There 4 stages and these became the Role Model of UBF

1 st Stage: "Come and See."
2 nd Stage: "Come and Follow me."
3 rd Stage: "Come and Be with me."
4 th Stage: " Remain in Me. "

II. Roles and Influences of UBF (1)

1) Revival of Bible Study and Disciple Making Ministry in Korean churches

UBF 1:1 Bible study and spiritual discipleship training challenged young Korean college students, planted hope and vision in their heart, to conquer the whole world with the gospel. (Exodus)






II. Roles and Influences of UBF (2)

2) Laymen movement: Raising laymen as church leaders for local evangelism and for world mission


"Bible Korea, World Mission" through laymen movement

Rev. David Yoo:

He summarized UBF's strengths and identified points to be complemented as the following:

First, UBF is a practical discipleship training.

Second, a clear identity as Jesus' disciples

Third, mission by faith following the principles of self-supporting mission.

He said, "if local churches (modality) and mission organizations (sodality) can work together, the Gospel will be spread faster and God's Kingdom will expand larger."

III. God's Vision for the UBF Next Generation

Judges 2:10: "After that hole generation had been gathered to their ancestors, another generation grew up who knew neither the Lord nor what he had done for for Israel."

Without education next generation leaders, there is no hope or vision for future generations.

1. Raising Global Christian Leadership for world mission ministry
