Eco Action Day

The Social Action Group at York Unitarians have organised an Eco Action Day of Walking, Poetry and Eco Craft Making at St Nicks Environmental Centre in York to help raise awareness of the work they do there and to raise funds for them. If you would like to take part in this day on 29th March please contact Dee Boyle for further details (deeboyle@gn.apc.org). Members of York Interfaith Group are invited to join them on this special day. They are limited as to how many people can fit into the space in buildings on their site for the Eco Craft making, so please do book a place if you want to take part in those activities. There is probably no limit on people for the walks, but it will still be good to know numbers attending.

In the morning there will be an option of a long walk or a short walk which you can get sponsored for, or just give a donation. Along the walk there will be some rest places to hear poems by local poets about the area, the wild life and the environment. In the afternoon there is also an opportunity to take part in some eco craft making from whatever is available at the time, and to be able to take your creations home with you afterwards. Well behaved dogs on leads will be welcome, especially for the walks. Please bring a packed lunch with you. Drinks will be available at the centre.

Just in case of any major weather warnings, i.e. snow or storms / gale force winds etc., that are announced for the day that is selected, the event may need to be postponed but it will go ahead at a later date.

About St Nicks: St Nicolas Fields Environmental Centre, to give it the full title, is situated in Rawdon Ave, York YO10 3FW. They manage a thriving 24 acre nature reserve that is free to explore 24 hours a day 365 days a year. Their volunteer team help maintain and manage the reserve for the benefit of people and wildlife. They have recently expanded into managing green corridors around York. They also started to help the City of York Council & YIG last year with additional work on our Interfaith Tree site on the Clifton Ings and they hope to take a more active part in our 'Tree Care' sessions during the year.



Refugee Welcome Bags

We are once again asking for support with the Welcome Bags that we offer to all of the new refugees arriving in York. We try to make sure that each new family has a bag of items to enable them to cook themselves a meal and also have items for breakfast and any drinks required when they first arrive. If you or your faith groups would like some more bags to fill with items we would be most grateful for your help. The project is organised by York City of Sanctuary and the bags are provided by them. The bags can be collected and dropped off at the Unitarian Chapel once they are ready, and they arrange for them to be taken to Refugee Action York who give them to the refugee families. Bags can be picked up from the Unitarian Chapel on a Thursday morning between 10.30 and 11am or 12 and 12.30pm or on a Sunday morning before or after their service, which is at 11am to 12midday, and dropped off at the same place/same times. The new list of items suggested for each bag is:

Cooking Oil, Flour or a small bag of bread mix, rice, pasta or cous-cous.

Tins of chickpeas, red kidney beans, lentils & chopped tomatoes.

Or

Dried chickpeas, kidney beans, lentils

Vegetable stock cubes, box of cuppa soups or 2 tins of soup

Tea, coffee, breakfast cereal, long life milk, biscuits or a similar treat

Please make sure that all items are suitable for vegetarians so that they can be given to people from all faiths or cultures.
