Introduction:

Regardless of which side of the cross you stand on, a proper spiritual diagnosis is essential because Satan's greatest deception of all is convincing people that they are Christians when in fact they are not. That is by far Satan's utmost deception because it's eternal. That's why 2 Corinthians 13:5 says, "Examine yourselves to see whether you are in the faith; test yourselves." What could be more devastating than standing before Jesus someday and hearing the words, "I never knew you; depart from me" (Matthew 7:23)?

Scripture tells us that God's kingdom is only made up of people who understand that they are spiritually bankrupt, who mourn that condition, who are gentle or meek, who hunger and thirst for righteousness and holiness, who are merciful, pure in heart, peacemakers, and who have been persecuted for His sake. The supernaturally transformed kingdom citizen embodies these divine characteristics. That is known as the beatitude attitude. The beatitudes demonstrate the divine qualities that Jesus claims all members of His kingdom must exhibit. Jesus tells us that theirs is the kingdom of heaven; they shall be comforted, they will inherit the earth, they will be satisfied or filled, they shall receive mercy, they will see and know God, and they will be called the Sons of God. "For theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Matt 5:10. There are no exceptions. Anything short of that is Satan's lie, and the world is filled with people who have fallen for that lie.

If that description of a kingdom citizen does not describe your Christian experience, there is no need to despair. You now comprehend the expectations of a truly saved life. Until then, you must seek and beg for God's miraculous gift of salvation, which will cultivate the divine beatitude attitude that our Lord describes. God has given us free will, and therefore He will not force it on anyone who does not want it. So, you must cry out to God and beg for salvation in desperation.

However, if you have determined that you are a Christian who has the divine attitude and characteristics of a kingdom citizen, then well done! You have been born and delivered into the spiritual kingdom. Jesus said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." John 3:3. Understand that God has planted a precious and holy seed in your heart, and it requires your protection, feeding, watering, and cherishing. The goal is to grow that seedling into a mighty tree, which will then produce much spiritual fruit. The supernatural fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, gentleness, goodness, faithfulness, humility, and self-control.

So be a good and faithful Christian, and understand that you are now part of the School of Christ Jesus. The Bible is your divine text book, and the world is your classroom. The Holy Spirit, who indwells you as a temple, serves as your resident truth teacher and personal interpreter, as He is

the author of the kingdom manual known as the Bible. Class is now in session, and skipping school will lead to being a clueless and therefore useless Christian. Also, be very careful who you choose as your spiritual mentor, because feeding on spiritual junk food (false teachings) will create a malnourished Christian.

Now, what follows is for everyone, regardless of which side of the cross you stand on. Of course, non-Christians will be limited without the indwelling Holy Spirit. However, the Christian must understand that in order to spiritually grow and mature, it is essential to obtain daily spiritual nourishment (soul food) from the Word. In order to grow in strength, a Christian must daily exercise their spiritual muscles in the world. Therefore, to become like Christ, a Christian must immerse themselves every day in God's Word and engage in spiritual conduct. God provides the circumstances of life, and blending those circumstances with the input of the Word brings about the maturation of the saints.

What is the ultimate purpose of this eBook? Its goal is to assist you with achieving a new level of Christlikeness every single day. In other words, "that we all, with an unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. Day 14

A.W. Pink poses this question. "How may I know my election? Firstly, the divine power of the Word of God penetrates my soul, shattering my self-complacency and leading me to renounce my self-righteousness. Second, by the Spirit's having convicted me of my woeful, guilty, and lost condition. Third, by having revealed to me the suitability and sufficiency of Christ to meet my desperate case and by a divinely given faith, causing me to lay hold of and rest upon Him as my only hope. Fourth, by the marks of the new nature within me. A love for God, an appetite for spiritual things, a longing for holiness, and a seeking after conformity to Christ. Fifth, by the resistance that the new nature makes to the old, causing me to hate sin and loathe myself for it. Sixth, by avoiding everything that is condemned by God's Word and by sincerely repenting of and humbly confessing every transgression. Failure at this point will most surely and quickly bring a dark cloud over our assurance, causing the Spirit to withhold his witness. Seventh, by giving all diligence to cultivate the Christian graces and using all legitimate means to this end, thus the knowledge of election is cumulative." End quote. It is characteristic of a true believer to obey Jesus Christ. The mark, result, and response of a truly redeemed individual is obedience. Day 15

Genuine Saving Faith

There are five things that neither prove nor disprove genuine saving faith. 1. Morality: outward morality is not necessarily true holiness. 2. Intellectual knowledge: knowledge of biblical truth does not equal salvation. 3. Religious Involvement: those who have a form of godliness but have no power. 4. Active Ministry: the Holy Spirit convicts men of sin, righteousness, and judgment and yet convicts many who never repent. 5. Assurance: Just because someone persuades you to be a Christian, it doesn't necessarily mean you are a Christian. These five, in and of themselves, are not sufficient evidence of saving faith. However, the true tests of saving faith are: 1. Love for God: God is your chief happiness, and Christ is your chief joy. 2. Repentance: true repentance involves a constant confession and turning from sin, as well as a state of brokenness and grief over sin. 3. Genuine Humility: There is a meekness that disdains ever offending the Lord or bringing any reproach to His name. 4. Devotion to the Glory of God: You seek the glory of God in everything. 5. Selfless Love: You manifest saving faith in your love for others. 6. Separation from the world: "If the love of the Father is in you, you will not love the world." 1 John 2:15. 7. Spiritual Progress: You are experiencing spiritual growth and have a desire to be like Christ. And 8. Obedience: "If you abide in My word, then you are My real disciple." John 8:31. Day 16

Glorifying God in the Gray Areas

The Bible is quite clear about which activities are explicitly right and which ones are explicitly wrong. But what about those activities that fall in the middle and really pose a difficult problem when it comes to decision-making? When faced with a decision in one of life's gray areas, Christians need to consider these practical questions: Edification: Will this activity produce spiritual benefit? Enslavement: Will this activity lead to spiritual bondage? Exposure: Will this activity expose my mind or body to defilement? Esteem: Will this activity benefit others or cause them to stumble? Evangelism: Will this activity further the cause of the gospel? Ethics: Will this activity violate my conscience? Exaltation: Will this activity bring glory to God? Armed with those basic principles, every believer ought to be able to navigate the gray areas with integrity, protecting their consciences and testimonies without resorting to legalism, isolationism, and other unbiblical responses that can impede the progress of the gospel. Therefore, man is never more like God than when he forgives. "For if you forgive men their transgressions, your heavenly Father will also forgive you." Matt 6:14. However, God's forgiveness of us is based on our forgiveness of others. "If you do not forgive men, then your Father will not forgive your transgressions." Matt 6:15. If you don't forgive, God won't forgive you, and you will have violated the relationship and fellowship that you could enjoy with God. Then God is going to keep His distance from you and put His hand of chastening on you rather than His hand of blessing. "Whom the Lord loves, He disciplines, and every son He scourges." Heb 12:6. A believer is never more like God, more like Christ, than when he or she forgives, because that's the nature of God and the nature of Christ, which is most wonderfully applied to us in salvation. Thomas Watson said, "We need not climb up into heaven to see whether our sins are forgiven. Let us look into our hearts and see if we can forgive others. There is much power in an unforgiving attitude. It makes you a prisoner of your past; it gives you the all-pervasive disease of bitterness, and bitterness is not just a sin; it is an infection, and it will infect your whole life. It opens the door for demons, and it alienates you from the full, rich fellowship that God desires to have with you. It will pollute your life and steal its joy, and you will make yourself a victim of your own past. There is plenty of good reason, then, to be a forgiving person. The one who forgives is the one who loves the Lord Jesus Christ, loves the saints, loves the fellowship, loves true knowledge, loves the glory of Christ, and loves to be a blessing. How Can We Forgive?

God commands us to forgive. "If you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins." Matt 6:14. But how can you dispossess yourself of some of these attitudes of anger, hostility, unforgiveness, and revenge? Begin by seeing the one that you will not forgive as the creation of God. In other words, love that person and forgive them for that of God which is in them. For every one of us is created in the image of God, and though that image is scarred and marred, if I look at a believer who is a Christian, he is therefore holy, and he bears something of the moral image of God. I can then forgive him for that which is of God in them. Or, if I look at an unbeliever who is unholy, he still bears the natural image of God, and I can forgive them for that of God, which is in them. If I can only see the image of God in someone, it will replace my anger and my lack of forgiveness with reverence. Jesus says, "Love your neighbor as yourself." Mark 12:31. What does that mean? You are certainly eager to forgive yourself, so love your neighbor as yourself and forgive them. It is exactly that undeserved affection for yourself that makes you aggravate the faults of others who offend you. On the other hand, if you are humble, unselfish, and self-denying, you will see yourself as such a lowly person that no offense against you could be considered significant. Every time somebody offends you, that is a trial or a temptation. If you pass it and you forgive them, it is a trial producing strength. The central theme is Jesus Christ. The specific recipients are His bondservants, namely believers. The prophetic characters are the things that must shortly take place. Its supernatural delivery comes through angels. Its human agent is John, and it promises spiritual blessings for all who read it. It is the only book that makes such a

Forgiveness is not possible in the flesh because the flesh wants vengeance. Forgiveness is not possible under the law because the law wants justice. But forgiveness is possible in the spirit by the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, working with your spirit, your inner man, and your new nature. If you do worry as a Christian, it is a sin because that worry arises from a failure to understand God, His sovereign love, His sovereign care, and His sovereign resources. What is Wisdom?

There are two kinds of wisdom. There is earthly wisdom and heavenly wisdom. Keep in mind that wisdom is the test of true, saving, and living faith. True wisdom means knowing God in a life-changing relationship. True wisdom is the outworking of a life-changing knowledge of God. The entry into wisdom is through faith in God through Jesus Christ. We are saved into wisdom. Once we come into wisdom, then Scripture becomes the source of wisdom. The Holy Spirit becomes the teacher of wisdom. And if we lack any wisdom, we can what? Ask of God. Day 27

The Superiority of Christ

There must be a new covenant to remove the obstacle. 6. Christ comes, provides a new covenant, and removes the obstacle. 6. The promise is fulfilled for those who believe. Those are the steps. The good news is that the new covenant was ratified by the sacrifice of Jesus Christ, and it provided the full salvation that men had been waiting for since the fall of Adam and Eve. Children from fatherless homes are three hundred percent more likely to deal drugs and carry weapons. This is a holocaust. Children will get their view of God from the Bible, but children will get their view of a man and what a man is from the Father. Evil abounds absolutely everywhere, and how men respond to its presence determines the survival and well-being of a society. No culture will ever rise above the character of its men: fathers. The sum of it comes in Romans 5:19, "For as by one man's disobedience, many were made sinners, so by the obedience of one shall many be made righteous." And you have here a marvelous analogy where Adam becomes the illustration of how one man's deed can affect many. Through Adam, all men are alienated from God, just as through Jesus Christ, all men can be reconciled to God. That's his whole point. Paul answers our question as to where death came from. In Adam, you have been given sin, condemnation, and death. In Christ, you have offered obedience, righteousness, and life. Adam reigns over the kingdom of sin and death. Christ reigns over the kingdom of righteousness and life. Everything lost in Adam is gained, and much more is gained in Christ. We are looking then at the influence of one man so that he dominates a whole flow of human beings by his one act. Because of Adam's disobedience, all men are condemned, and paradise was lost. But because of Christ's obedience, all men are offered pardon and paradise regained. Why is the world like it is? It's right here. This is the key to understanding everything. It tells us why man is the way he is, and it tells us why death is the dominant monarch. It also tells us why human history has gone the way it's gone. What is the fix? Repent and believe! The Greater Work of Redemption

We should refer to Jesus much more frequently as our Redeemer, thus exalting this wonderful aspect of His saving work. Thomas Watson said this: Quote: "Great was the work of creation, but greater was the work of redemption. It costs more to redeem us than to make us. In the one, there was but the speaking of a word. In the other, there was shedding blood. The creation was the work of God's fingers. Redemption is the work of His arm." End quote. It's true. Redemption is the greater work. Our Lord Himself directed us to the centrality of His redeeming work when He said the Son of Man has come "to give His life a ransom for many." Mark 10:45. Redemption is more specific than salvation. It speaks of the heart and soul of salvation. It focuses on the means by which salvation is achieved. Redemption has to do with the purchase by payment of a price. Redemption then focuses on how God bought us from our bondage to sin and how God paid the price. It views man's condition as that of a prisoner, a prisoner to hopeless iniquity, and sees God coming to set the prisoner free by paying the full required price. Sin calls for justice. We're just another nation, like many nations that have come and gone through human history. We bear no eternal covenant with God as a nation. America is not a Christian nation, as such. We have no covenant to protect ourselves. We have no eternal promises on a national level that God somehow must keep. So, if Israel, which has those covenants and those promises, cannot be blessed unless they obey the law of God and repent for their disobedience, why would we assume that the standard for us would be any different? This is a simple principle. You subscribe your life to the truth of God, to the Word of God, and where you fall short, you repent, you seek His forgiveness, and you then put yourself in a place of blessing. Apart from a national penitence, a national brokenness, and a national contrition for having turned their backs on God, on His Word, lived in sin, and disdained to worship the true and living God, there is no basis upon which God would bless America. If we meet the conditions, God will be delighted to bless us. If we don't, He will be equally delighted to curse us. You can be sure of one thing: God is always consistent with His holiness. If we can just bring about some kind of morality and, better yet, some kind of commitment to God, then we will be blessed. Morality and religion will not invite or secure the blessing of God. They never did, and they never will. A more moral and religious America does not advance in divine favor one inch. A more moral and religious America will not escape divine judgment any more than Pharisaic Judaism in Jesus' time escaped the devastating judgment of God in 70 A.D. There's only one thing God blesses, and that is that He blesses saving faith in and love for His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. That's the only thing He blesses. Anybody who does not believe in and love the Lord Jesus Christ is among the cursed. Today, the public morality issue consumes many professing Christians. But moralism was never the message of the Old Testament prophets. It was never the message of the Messiah. It was never the message of the New Testament apostles and prophets. It has never been God's message to the world, because when all is said and done, listen to what Isaiah 64:6 says: "All your righteousness is filthy rags." He, along with a third of the holy angels who rebelled and fell, composed the demonic forces. Those demonic forces do all the evil that they can possibly perpetrate against the purposes of God and against God Himself. They give us the reason why there are so many false religions. He knew what it was; it drowned the entire world. To have, as He did, the perfect knowledge of His Father's wrath, the perfect knowledge of His own sinless purity, and not to be filled with a desire to escape the coming judgment would bring His holiness into question. What is the cup from which He had to drink? It is the imputation of the guilt of all who would ever believe in Him. It is to be punished for all the sins of all the people who would ever believe through all of human history as if He were guilty. The punishment is incalculable. It is the cup of the hour of darkness. He is sorrowful, but His is a sorrow we don't understand. It is a holy sorrow, the sorrow of revulsion of the one who is perfectly pure and about to be made sin for us. This is the revelation of His glory in the garden. The very beginning of the Sermon on the Mount tells you the whole point of the Sermon on the Mount, and that is that we should know real blessedness, real happiness, real joy, real gladness, and genuine divine reward. And then from there on, he goes to talk about how it is that that becomes possible and what kind of lifestyle it is that produces this kind of happiness. This is the very antithesis of Christian hope. This is utterly unacceptable. But Christ is risen, and if Christ is risen, then what? Then just the opposite is true. Everything is in reverse: gospel preaching is valuable, faith is priceless, the apostles spoke the truth, sin is forgiven, the dead in Christ are with Him, and Christians are the most glorious people in the world if Christ is risen, but the whole thing hinges on that. The resurrection of Jesus Christ proves that He conquered sin, death, and hell. What do you have to do to appropriate His resurrection life? Romans 10:9 says, "Confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord, and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, and you will be saved." If you want to see your life transformed, if you want your life to come into harmony with God's glory and His will, it's a matter in your own heart of commitment. The Uniqueness of Christianity

Defining men as they must be defined as sinners means measuring them against the law of God, by which the Spirit of God can then produce repentance, pointing out the glories of Christ, which can be elicited by the Spirit faith. Because of that faith and repentance, salvation comes. This has always been the theme of authentic preaching. The message is one of repentance, specifically aimed at those who know they are sinners. The Christian faith is not for good people. It's for sinners. The church is not for people who think they're righteous. It's for people who know they're not. That's why we're here. This is not a club for the righteous. This is a hospital for the sin sick. We understand that. And have you noticed that the more you grow in Christ, the more you love Him, the more you mature, and the more you grasp the great truths of Scripture, the more you understand how wretched you are? It is a sign of maturity to be unsettled and distressed about your sinfulness. So, we could say that the more mature a congregation is, the more they recognize their sinfulness. One can't even enter the kingdom of God without a recognition of sinfulness. The purpose of this Messiah's arrival was to provide salvation to those who fall into the categories of the poor, prisoners, blind, and oppressed. There will never be salvation, there will never be forgiveness of sin, and there will never be eternal life for anybody who thinks he's righteous. A Definition of Salvation

Salvation is deliverance. To be delivered is to be rescued. And the rescue involves taking the unqualified and making them qualified. Here we were in darkness, and now we are in light. Here we were in the kingdom of hell, or the kingdom of Satan, and now we are in the kingdom of God's beloved Son. We were slaves, but we have been redeemed. We were guilty, but we have been forgiven. And all of that fills up the meaning of the word delivered. So, salvation is a synonym for deliverance. Deliverance brings with it justification, sanctification, illumination, redemption, and forgiveness. We've been delivered. And now we are in a permanent state of having been delivered. What could you have done to qualify yourself and earn the inheritance? Nothing. What could you have done to make the unholy holy or to extract yourself out of darkness and draw yourself into light? What could you have done to get out of Satan's kingdom and into the kingdom of Christ? What price could you have paid for redemption? And what could you have done to achieve forgiveness? The answer is absolutely nothing. It was all God's plan. He would save unqualified, undeserving, poor, and unholy slaves from sin. Why? So that He would be thanked for it and receive all the glory. Punishment is a settled issue. We are in a no-condemnation status, and that is how it is for those who live in the Spirit. The Holy Spirit frees us from sin and death; He enables us to fulfill the law; He changes our nature; He empowers us for victory; He confirms our adoption; He guarantees our glory; and He intercedes for us. This adequate stand is in Christ. "Stand fast in the Lord." 1 Thes 3:8. Jesus Christ pervades our whole existence. We are in Christ. A total union with Christ. If a man attempts to live in the world apart from Christ, he has nothing to stand on. Everything is shifting sand. So, to begin with, a man must be in Christ because existence is a floating thing, and it's a great, mysterious variable until a man meets God. And then, all of a sudden, he knows why he exists, what living is all about, what loving is all about, what time is all about, what forever is all about, and what purpose is. But he doesn't know it until he meets God. The only way a man can ever meet God is through Christ. Jesus said, "No man cometh unto the Father except by me." John 14:6. And the only way you can ever know Christ is to hear about Him, read about Him in the gospels, see what He did, and believe it with your whole heart. What is the Good News?

You can receive forgiveness if you believe in the Lord Jesus Christ. The gospel is the only way that you can have your sins forgiven, and that's the only way you'll escape hell. What is the message that God gave in the Old Testament and in the New Testament? He forgives sin. This raises the question of justice. God says it's an abomination if you do something that violates justice. But God Himself has chosen to violate that law in the sense that He justifies the ungodly. How can God do that? How is it possible? And the answer is because He punishes His Son in place of believing sinners. He passed over sins, but in order to be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus, those sins had to be punished, and Jesus bore our sins in His own body. God sacrifices His only Son to accomplish His will of justifying the ungodly. This is the glorious message of the Christian gospel. Jesus came to offer forgiveness—everlasting, eternal forgiveness. God's wrath of abandonment is when He lets go of a society and lets it catapult full speed without restraint in the direction of its own sinful desires, devices, and choices. We often discuss how America's founding was based on Christian principles, with God at its core. But whatever it might have been in our founding, it's no longer the way it is. What are the reasons for the wrath of God? "The wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men." Rom 1:18. There comes a time in a nation when God has had enough, and He literally lets them go and turns them over to the sentence that they have passed upon themselves by their incessant sinful choices. They are deprived of restraining grace. The first thing you look for

in a society if you're trying to discern whether God has abandoned that society is whether or not that society has gone through a sexual revolution so that illicit sex, adultery, and every form of immorality are accepted as normal in that society, and we're there. The second step in the progression: You know a society has been abandoned by God when it celebrates homosexuality, and we're there. Therefore, you follow the sexual revolution with the homosexual revolution, leading to the normalization of homosexuality in society. Then the final step comes: "God gave them over to a depraved mind." Rom 1:28. A depraved mind is one that's tested and found useless; therefore, it is disqualified for its intended use. The reasoning faculty has been corrupted by the influences that surround it, so they are without reason and without conscience, and we're there. This is what it means when God abandons a society. Sexual revolution, down one more step; homosexual revolution, down one more step; a depraved mind. You can't ever get out of it because the mind—the cultural mind—is gone. What can you personally do? Which Way to Heaven?

The biggest question that will ever be answered is, Which way to heaven? The most important decision that anyone will ever make is the one regarding their eternal destiny. According to the Bible, life here is a vapor that appears for a short time and then vanishes. It's like steaming off a cup of coffee—nothing more compared to eternity. Everyone will live somewhere forever, with no end. The place you live forever is absolutely critical. There are only two options: hell and eternal punishment, or heaven and eternal joy. The question then is, Which way to heaven? Jesus always asks for a choice. In the Sermon on the Mount, our Lord gives an invitation. It is a sermon about the way to heaven. This sermon demands a choice, an absolute choice, and a choice that renders finality—a choice that leads to a fixed forever in eternity. You want to come to heaven? There are two doors marked heaven: one goes there, and one does not. Throughout this entire sermon, there is a contrast between false religion and true religion, false worship and true worship, man-made religion and divine religion. It's a contrast between a religion that does not satisfy God and a religion that does. Reality tells us there are only two religions in the world. There is the religion of human achievement that says you can be good enough, holy enough, religious enough, and spiritual enough to get to heaven all on your own. And then there is the other option: the religion of divine accomplishment, the religion of faith, grace, mercy, and the Holy Spirit, which do not mix. That's the choice. The Lord Jesus offered a religion of faith and grace, dependent upon the Holy Spirit, a religion of divine accomplishment where salvation and acceptance into heaven depended on what God did, not what men did. There's only one way to be saved: there's only one person who is the Savior, and faith in that person is required to enter heaven. The entire gospel itself is a command: "Repent and believe in the Lord Jesus Christ." Mark 1:15. It's a choice to obey or disobey. Thus, it's a choice between eternal heaven and eternal hell. Why Christianity Seems Foolish

Unconverted people don't understand Christianity. In 1 Corinthians 2:14, the apostle Paul says a natural man—a man in his natural condition, an unspiritual man, a man outside the kingdom of God, an unregenerate man, an unconverted man or woman—does not accept the things of the Spirit of God. And it isn't just that they don't accept them; it is that they are foolishness to him. Now, this is a reality. Unconverted people look at the cross, the Christian gospel, and the Christian faith, and it appears foolish because they are spiritually dead in trespasses and sin. They are spiritually blind, blinded by Satan, and blinded by their own sinfulness. They are deaf to the voice of God. They are ignorant of their condition and God's truth, so the gospel appears to them to be foolish. Even when they study it, perhaps with some vigor, it might continue to look foolish to them because there are so many contrasts in the gospel message. The natural man cannot understand it, and it appears to him to be foolish, contradictory, unreasonable, and illogical. Why? Because he is spiritually dead. However, believers understand everything I just said. Why? Because he who is spiritual is that one who has come out of that natural condition into a spiritual life by virtue of the mighty work of God in his or her soul. For those of us who have experienced God's work, gained life, had our blinders removed to see, our ears unobstructed to hear, and our minds opened to comprehend, we possess, as 1 Cor 2:16 says, the mind of Christ. To have Christ's mind means to think the way He does. And we know exactly how He thinks because He's revealed what He thinks in His book. Therefore, as the Word of Christ dwells in you richly, you have the mind of Christ. Thus, it's the gospel that saves, gives life, and brings transformation. And when the transformation comes, all of these mysteries in the Bible become clear because we receive the mind of Christ. So, we know how God thinks, and we know how Christ thinks, because the pages of Scripture reveal it. What God says is a reflection of what God thinks, and that is precisely what Scripture is.
