3. Arraigo Social Visa

Already living in Spain without papers? This pathway recognizes your community ties and offers a chance to legitimize your stay.

- Prove 3 years of uninterrupted residence
- Obtain a job contract or social support from local associations
- Grants a one-year residence permit, extendable thereafter

Why it works

Arraigo Social turns grassroots connections into legal status. If you've built friendships, worked under the radar, or volunteered in your barrio, this visa rewards your commitment.

- 1. Map your income source: active remote work, passive funds, or community integration.
- 2. Align with lifestyle goals: fast-track renewals, family inclusion, or full legal reset.
- 3. Prepare your documents early: bank statements, medical insurance, hire a translator if needed.
