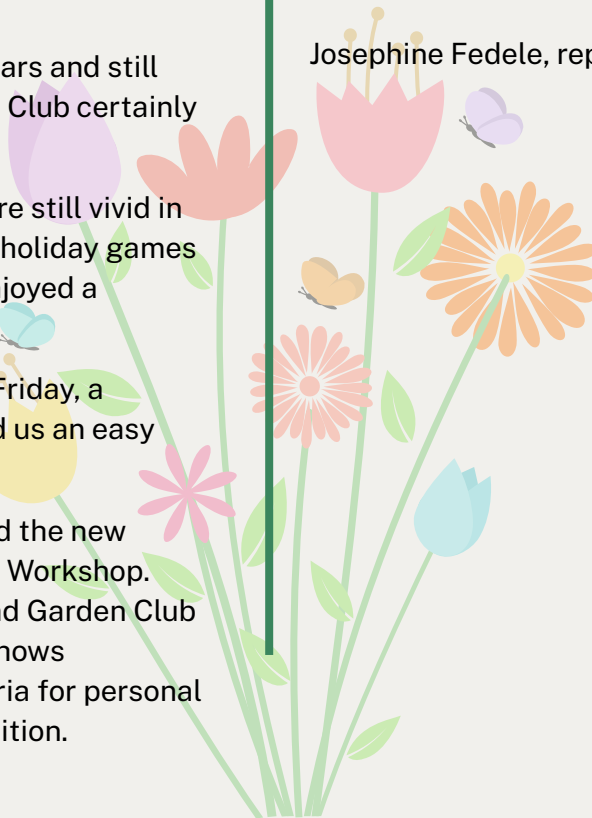
On Earth Day, April 22 we will all enjoy a motorcoach trip to New York Botanical Garden. The Orchids will be the main characters in the Show.

The Blue Star Memorial

The Blue Star Memorial Program honors all men and women that serve in the U.S. Armed Services. This program began with the planning of 8,000 Dogwood trees by the N.J. Council of Garden Clubs in 1944 as a living memorial to Veterans of WWII and has expanded to a National system of Memorial Markers along the highway system and in other appropriate locations. The Blue Star Memorial located at Fort Wadsworth is a District one project. Several times during the year, First district members get together for maintenance and upkeep of the site. The location of the memorial allows enlisted men and women in the different branches of the military to see that they are never forgotten as they enter and leave the base.

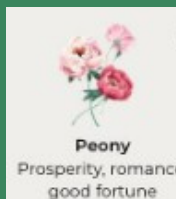
Book of Recognition

If you would like to honor a member by recognizing their ability and dedication to your club, you may do so by adding his/her name to the FGCNYS, Inc. Book of Recognition.

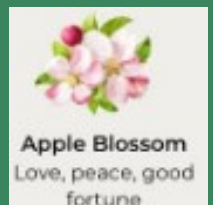
