February 14, 2016 – Sharing Love in Korea publicly launched as a nonprofit organization.

February 2017 – The first annual fundraising event held at Yongsusan Restaurant in Los Angeles.

July 2017 – The 2nd Summer Vision Trip Program took place with **Jeong Min Seo**, **Kyung Min Lim**, and **Jayoo Sung** (Sinaewon).

February 2018 – The second annual fundraising event was held at Yongsusan Restaurant in Los Angeles.

July 2018 – The 3rd Summer Vision Trip Program was held with **Taeyang Yoon** and **Daegeon Choi** (Sinaewon).

May 2018 – A sponsorship MOU was signed with **Emmanuel Children's Group Home** in Gimcheon.

November 2024 – A sponsorship MOU was signed with **Samshin Green Hills Children's Home** in **Buyeo**.

August 2025 – The 7th Summer Vision Trip Program held with **Yunji Choi** (Chun Yang Won) and **Gwanggyu Mo** and **Wooram Lee** (Sinaewon).

A Father's Faith and a Legacy of Prayer

I would like to offer a tribute to my beloved father, Rev. Choon Man Hong, who went to be with the Lord on November 30, 2025, at the age of 87. He was a faithful servant of God until his final breath, a man who truly lived what it means to be godly. His life reflected the words of Scripture: "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain" (Philippians 1:21). He loved the Lord God with all his heart, soul, mind, and strength, and he loved his neighbor as himself—faithfully living out God's greatest commandments.

More than 20 years ago, my parents introduced me to Sinaewon Children's Home during a family visit to Korea. Over the years, whenever I traveled back to Korea, I would stop by to visit the children, often bringing small gifts like candies. What began as simple visits eventually grew into something far greater. During our single girls' trip (with Ann, Caroline, and Nicole) to Korea in November 2015, a seed was planted—one that would later grow into Sharing Love in Korea (SL!K).

When SL!K officially launched, we began searching for sponsors. We reached out to close family members and friends, and when I asked my dad, he immediately and joyfully said yes. He became a sponsor to Kyungmin Lim, who was 16 years old at the time. In 2017, Kyungmin was selected to participate in our Summer Vision Trip, and my dad had the opportunity to meet him in person. On Kyungmin's very first night in Los Angeles, he stayed with our family. I vividly remember my dad gently and lovingly praying for Kyungmin before we shared dinner together.

That prayer never ended. From the day my dad became Kyungmin's sponsor until the day he went to Heaven, he prayed for Kyungmin every single day. My father was a faithful prayer warrior, and I believe that his constant prayers were the most meaningful and powerful gift Kyungmin received.

I recently saw Kyungmin again in Korea at Sinaewon's 70th Anniversary celebration, and my heart overflowed with joy and gratitude to God. Today, Kyungmin is a successful mechanic and manager at the Mercedes-Benz Korea Truck Division. At 26 years old, he is thriving—

and glowing. Even more beautiful is the impact he now has on others. Many of the younger boys at Sinaewon told me they want to become mechanics, just like their “big brother” Kyungmin.

I know that Kyungmin is who he is today because of God’s goodness and faithfulness. Yet I also know that God works through His people to encourage, uplift, and intercede for others—and He did exactly that through my father. My hope and prayer is that, like my dad, many of our sponsors will one day meet the children they support. But even more importantly, I pray they will faithfully remember to pray for these children—children who do not have parents present to offer the love, guidance, and support they need.

Many of you know that my mom went to be with the Lord on December 20, 2014. Now my dad is reunited with her in Heaven, in the presence of our Lord Jesus Christ. I praise and thank God for this truth, yet I also carry a deep sorrow in my heart because I miss them both so dearly. For the first time in my life, at the age of 53, I truly understand what it feels like to be an orphan. I cannot begin to imagine the pain endured by children living in orphanages—some who never knew their parents, and others who suffered abuse at their hands. These children are incredibly resilient, yet they need immense love, care, and support.

I thank God that Sharing Love in Korea was established ten years ago to do exactly that. May we continue to love, bless, and faithfully pray for these precious children. Through God’s love, lives are transformed and broken hearts are healed.
