Dear Members,

Welcome to Fleurieu FM's 2nd quarter of 2024 newsletter to members, which means that we are already halfway through the year! This has been quite an eventful quarter for FFM.....

What has unquestionably been a highlight, is our successful acquisition of a new transmission tower for our Brown's Hill site. Where it stands on top of Brown's Hill near Port Elliott, this tower is very exposed to the strong coastal winds and maritime air erosion. Over the 20 odd years or so of its lifetime the structure had deteriorated to the point that we were concerned that the structure could even collapse one day. Such a disaster would literally have meant that we were instantly off-air. When we gratefully received grant funding from Bendigo Community Bank Fleurieu late last year for this project, we were unsure if the \$20K amount was going to be "enough" to cover all the costs involved. Now, in no small part due to the efforts of Ian Totty, Jim Bickers and Dale Scottney-Turbill (many thanks, guys!) who pulled out all the stops, we not only have the new tower on site ready to be erected, but the new concrete slab to secure it has already been installed and all proudly within budget!

Another big step in the 'right direction' was the approval of amendments to our Constitution by our members on 22nd May at the Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM). After much consideration, the EGM was called by the Board for the sole purpose of amending our Constitution, which had last been amended 11 years ago. Thank you to all members who, by an overwhelming majority, agreed with the Board's resolution that to make these changes was in the interest of the Association.

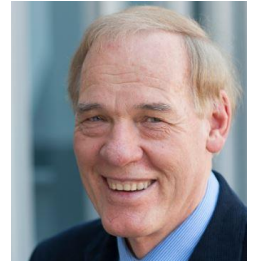

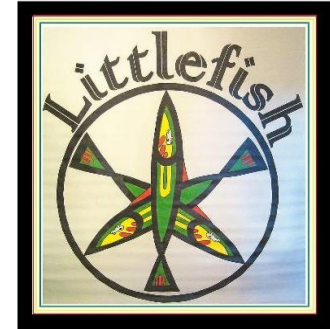

Littlefish are a local South Coast Band who have been performing original Reggae, Ska, Funk and Roots Rock tunes for over 15 years at venues right across South Australia. From the west coast as far as Streaky Bay and Port Lincoln to the back waters of Moorook along the Mighty



Murray. Littlefish have played local pubs and festivals right around Adelaide and the Fleurieu, including Dub in the Park – Kangaroo Island Surf and Music Festival – Cuppsfest – Tunarama and more.

Inspired by the socially and politically minded Revel music that is Reggae and Ska they have fused an unlikely yet entertaining brand of south Ozzy pub rock and internationally flavoured Roots music which gets people dancing and creates the Irie vibes they are renowned for.

RECIPE



Pork souvlaki

Ingredients

- 400g lean pork shoulder, cut into 2cm chunks
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- ½ tbsp dried oregano
- 1 lemon, zested and juiced
- ½ tsp hot paprika 100ml fat-free yogurt
- 1 small garlic clove, grated
- ½ cucumber, trimmed and grated
- 2 red peppers, deseeded and cut into chunks
- 2 Little Gem lettuce, leaves separated
- chilli sauce, to serve (optional)
- flatbreads, warmed, to serve (optional)



Method

- 1) Put the pork in a large bowl with the oil, oregano, lemon zest and juice and paprika as well as a good pinch of salt. Toss everything together to combine and leave to marinate for 10 mins.
- 2) Combine the yogurt, garlic and cucumber together in a bowl. Season with salt and set aside.
- 3) Heat the grill to high. Thread the marinated pork and the peppers on four metal skewers, alternating between the pork and peppers as you go. Place on a non-stick baking sheet and grill for 3-4 mins on each side, or until cooked through and golden brown.
- 4) Serve with the lettuce, yogurt mixture and chilli sauce, and flatbreads, if you like.
