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ANTHO ACADEMY BECOMING ANTHO CHARITABLE TRUST / ANBIN THOZHAMAI ARAKKATTALAI (2018 - PRESENT)

Antho Academy was founded in 2018 with a vision to provide quality education and skills development to underprivileged children and communities. Recognizing the challenges faced by marginalized populations in accessing educational opportunities, the academy began as a small initiative aimed at empowering youth through education, vocational training, and personal development programs. The focus was on providing a solid foundation in subjects such as English, science, and mathematics, as well as offering skills-based training in areas like music, computers, arts, and life skills.



2018 - 2019: The Beginning of a Social Impact Journey

• Foundation and Core Values:

Antho Academy was established with the belief that education is a fundamental right for all children, regardless of their social or economic status. The academy's programs were designed to provide both formal and informal learning experiences, blending traditional education with holistic development initiatives.

• Initial Focus Areas:

During its initial phase, the academy worked primarily with children in underserved urban and rural areas, offering after-school programs, tutoring, and extra-curricular activities.



In addition to academic support, Antho Academy also emphasized character development, personal responsibility, and community engagement.

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2020: Expanding the Vision and Impact



• Anbin Thozhamai Arakkattalai:

Along with the rebranding to Antho Charitable Trust, the organization also adopted the Tamil name "Anbin Thozhamai Arakkattalai", which translates to "The Organization of Friendship and Love."



This name symbolizes the core philosophy of the trust: to work in close partnership with the community, driven by compassion, empathy, and collective action.



• The Emergence of Antho Charitable Trust:

By 2020, the founders and team at Antho Academy recognized the need to scale their impact and extend their services beyond the academy's walls. With a focus on community development, educational outreach, and social welfare, they officially restructured the organization, and Antho Charitable Trust was born.

The decision to transition into a charitable trust allowed for greater flexibility and a broader scope of activities, enabling them to seek funding, collaborate with like-minded organizations, and extend support to a wider range of beneficiaries.

2021 - 2022: Strengthening the Social Mission

• Expanding Programs and Services:

In 2021, Antho Charitable Trust launched several new initiatives:

- Educational Support Programs: The trust began sponsoring education for children in slums and underserved areas, providing free tuition, study materials, and scholarship opportunities.
- Women Empowerment Initiatives: The trust focused on empowering women through skills training and small-scale business opportunities, helping them become financially independent and contribute to their communities.



- Health and Hygiene Awareness: In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the trust started distributing hygiene kits, setting up medical camps, and conducting awareness campaigns on health and sanitation, particularly in rural and flood-affected areas.

- Community Engagement:
 - The trust also established partnerships with local communities, schools, and grassroots organizations to ensure that their programs were aligned with the needs of the people. They worked directly with families, offering counseling services and ensuring that education was accessible to the most marginalized children.

2023: *Diversification and Continued Growth*

In 2023, Antho Charitable Trust became actively involved in flood relief efforts, particularly in cities like Chennai, which are vulnerable to annual flooding. The trust raised funds and mobilized resources for immediate relief, including the distribution of food, clean water, and medical supplies, as well as long-term rehabilitation efforts for affected communities.



- **Environmental Initiatives:**

Recognizing the growing concern for environmental issues, the trust also launched an Environmental Education Program focused on climate change awareness, tree planting, and sustainable practices. The trust organized workshops and tree planting drives in urban slums and rural areas, teaching children and youth about the importance of environmental conservation.

- **Skill Development and Vocational Training:**

The trust continues to support skill-building initiatives for both youth and women. These programs are designed to enhance employability and entrepreneurial capabilities, with an emphasis on technology, arts, and eco-friendly business ventures.

- 2024: Expansion and partnerships with corporates and other NGOs to broaden the scope of charitable initiatives.



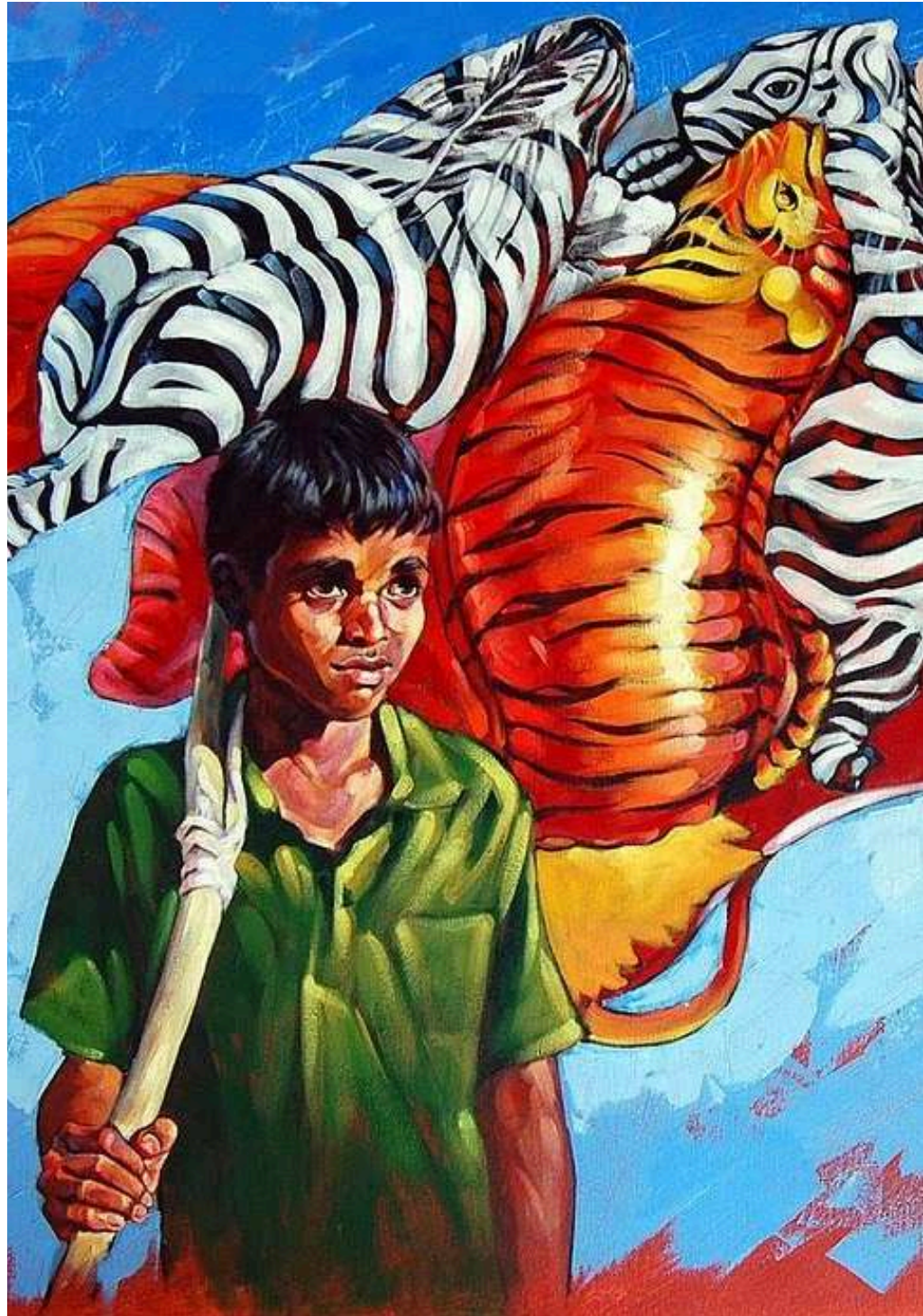
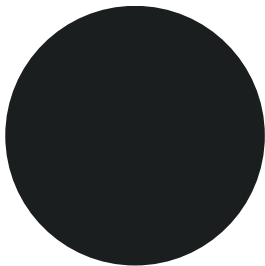
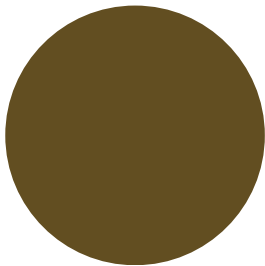
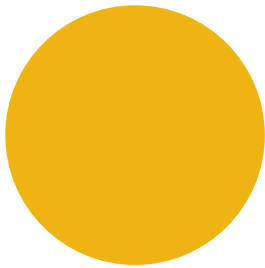
Conclusion:

ANTHO CHARITABLE TRUST OBJECTIVES

1. To create awareness of cleanliness, hygiene and sanitation in rural areas and urban slums and to construct free latrines.
2. To organize night and evening schools for socially and economically weaker students and to provide financial support for the volunteering teachers.
3. To provide financial and moral support, and machines for the destitute and vulnerable women and widows to create self-employment.
4. To provide medical and financial assistance for blood donation camps and surgeries for medical relief and treatments.
5. To run hostels for the students and grant scholarships for study & research apprenticeship.
6. To Organize training programs on short filmmaking, E-commerce, Share Market and also an import-export business.
7. To execute Water, Sanitation and hygiene projects in rural and urban areas.
8. To provide facilities for food, shelter and medical assistance and education to orphan children, economically weaker sections, destitute women, old persons and the deserving and needy public.
9. To conduct awareness through a visual presentation on various issues like literacy, women empowerment, environment, health, community development, child rights, and other social issues.
10. To provide palliative care services to abandoned and economically weak elder persons.
11. To provide youth career guidance, coaching classes for competitive exams, and financial assistance to poor students.
12. To provide relief to needy people in areas affected by natural calamities and others.
13. To render preventive, curative and rehabilitative health care services to the community.
14. To Establish and run sports and music academies, conduct sports competitions and give prizes in kabaddi, cricket, football, music instruments and other sports through which the youths will be well guided to divert themselves from the habit of smoking, drug addiction and drinking.



15. Taking poor students to such places as educational tours, exhibitions, fairs, trade centres, libraries, and zoos., Making them participate in intellectual competitions and providing transport assistance (poor students).
16. Provision of "Sanitary napkins" in school halls, public places, and women's workplaces setting up sanitary napkin dispensers
17. Cleaning and maintenance of public places, rivers, ponds, and lakes.
18. To propagate and create awareness of the need for the conservation and survival of birds, sparrows, other species, and animals.
19. To work for the welfare of the tribal people.
20. To create awareness and promote Waste management in the community.
21. To provide equipment for workers disposing of composting and non-biodegradable waste.
22. Setting up water tanks in water scarcity areas and setting up water pandals during the hot season.
23. To Provide study materials including notebooks, books and stationery to poor students and provision food.
24. To inform the people about the welfare schemes brought by the central and state government.
25. To provide nutrition to girls who attain puberty and pregnant women in the community for their needs.
26. Take care of working women's children for education and maintenance.
27. To help in crisis times (death, disaster, poverty, accident, health issues).
28. To provide a medium for self-help and self-respect to the poor and marginalized people by helping them to realize their potential by providing necessary knowledge and understanding.
29. To establish and run homes for the aged, convalescent homes.
30. To call together or organize conferences, seminars and consultations for the participants in social work.
31. To acquire, maintain, construct, and build an institution, library and community hall, to carry out, promote, and execute any or all of the objects of the trust.
32. To establish and manage educational institutions providing formal and non-formal education, technical and non-technical through Government aid or others.
33. To purchase or take on lease lands for constructing buildings for purpose of running clinics, hospitals, orphanages and schools.



34. To provide computer education to underprivileged rural & urban slum students by way of various computer courses.

35. To provide job-oriented education & training in various fields.

36. To provide free education/vocational education to women, the differently-abled and the poor.

37. To establish and run educational institutions, schools, colleges and other educational coaching institutions in rural and urban areas of the Country.

38. To promote Educational, Cultural and Social Development of the poor and weaker sections of society.

39. To publish pamphlets, statistics, periodicals, books and other publications, circulate them and organize other activities to further any objects.

40. To assist any organization, individual or group of people in furtherance of the object of the Trust.

41. To preserve and protect the environment and propagate the significance of sustainable development for maintaining ecological balance.

42. To promote gender equality by empowering women.

43. To develop and mobilize Community and Natural Resources to give the right direction to people of the marginalized and economically weaker section of society for their sustainable overall development.

44. To conduct a study on various social issues from time to time, gather data, and conduct research.

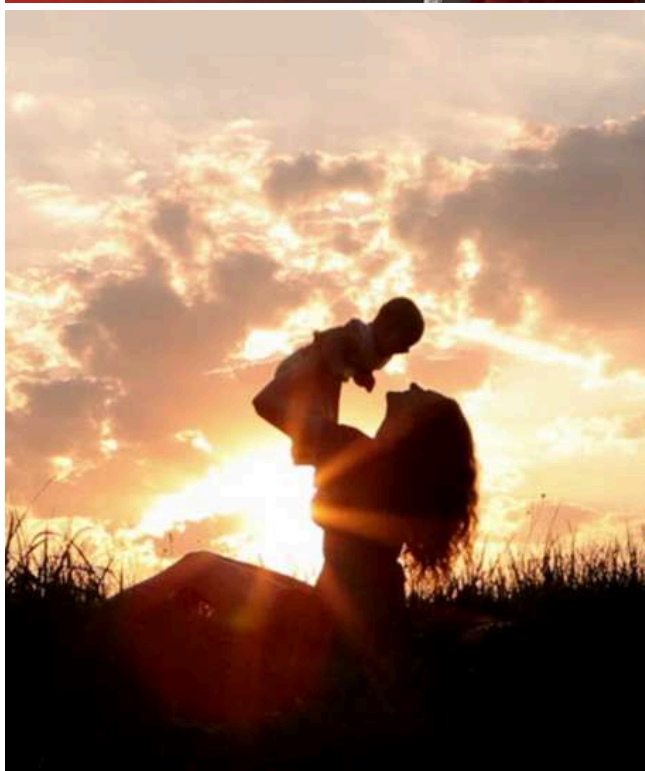
45. To communicate and coordinate with the Government, Local and public authorities on various issues related to development welfare and public interest on different subjects.

46. To form women groups, youth groups, self-help groups; old aged groups, adolescent groups, children groups/clubs, community leader's groups and a group of volunteers.

47. To acquire movable and immovable properties by purchase, lease, hire, exchange or otherwise and to put down, erect, alter and maintain buildings for carrying out the activities of the trust.

48. To accept donations, grants and other gifts and deal with the same for the trust.

49. To invest the trust Funds or deal with the same as the trustees may deem it, to carry on the objects of the Trust effectively.



50. To run a music academy in terms of teaching music and musical instruments, teaching Spoken English, Dance, arts and painting and other extra – curricular activities.

51. To enter into any arrangement with any Government authorities whether Central, State, Local, Municipal or otherwise in pursuance of the objects of the Trust to obtain from any such government authority all rights, concessions, and privileges that may deem conducive to the Trust's objects.

52. The income and funds of the trust shall be utilized for charitable purposes, its institutions, to carry out the objects of the trust and for the development of assets and properties of the trust. And no portion of it would be distributed in any manner to the members of the Board of Trustees.

53. To form various committees from time to time which may include the trustees and non-trustees to carry out the above-said Objectives, which will function under the guidelines of the Board of Trustees. The Chairman shall be the Chief functionary of all the committees.

54. To create and publish IEC materials and videos for the furtherance of any of the objects.

55. To do any other act or service to promote the above objects.

Talent Showcases and Concerts:

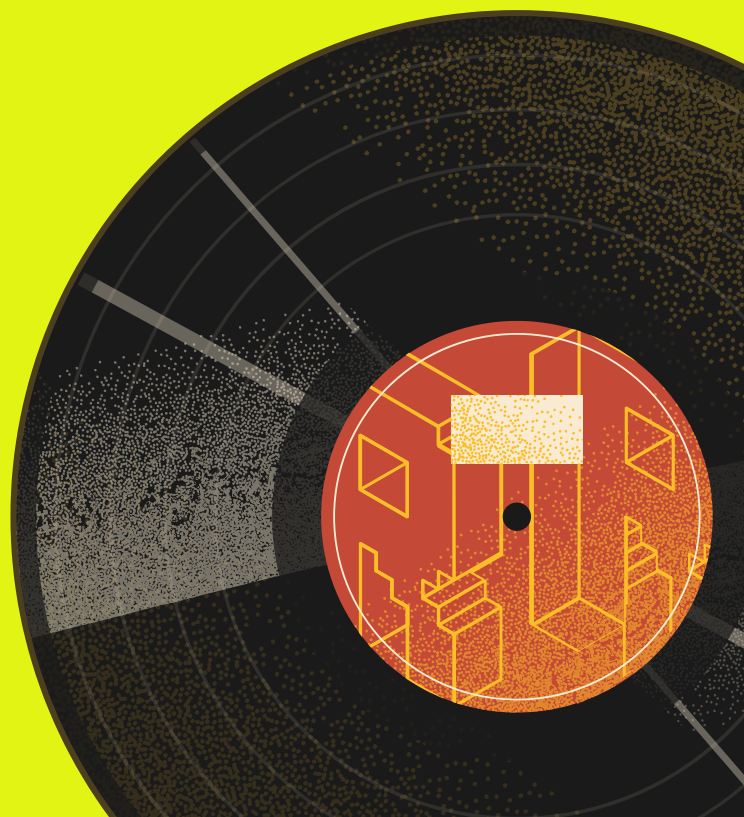
Organize annual concerts and talent showcases for students to perform and demonstrate their skills.

NIGHT SCHOOL AND STUDY CLUB PROJECT



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Night School and Tuition Program



Introduction

Antho Charitable Trust is dedicated to transforming the lives of marginalized communities by providing access to quality education, skill development, and empowerment programs. In many underprivileged areas, children and adults struggle to access formal education due to financial constraints, family responsibilities, and lack of resources.



Our Night School and Tuition Program aims to bridge this gap by offering flexible, evening-based educational opportunities for those who cannot attend regular daytime classes.

This project is designed to offer education to children, youth, and adults from underserved communities, enabling them to continue their education without disrupting their daily work responsibilities.

PROJECT COMPONENTS

NIGHT SCHOOL AND TUITION PROGRAM

1.Night School for Children and Youth

- Curriculum:
 - Basic Education (Math, Science, Language, Social Studies, English)
 - Life Skills Development (Communication, Critical Thinking, Problem Solving)
 - Personality Development and Confidence Building
- Schedule: Evening classes, usually from 4.30 PM to 9.30 PM, to accommodate students' work and family responsibilities.
- Infrastructure:
 - Local community centers, schools, or partner organizations that offer classroom space.
 - Learning materials (books, stationery, digital tools for online learning, if available).

2.Tuition and Academic Support Classes

- Target Audience: Students (from marginalized communities) who are lagging behind in their academic performance and need extra help in subjects such as Math, English, and Science.
- Curriculum:
 - Focus on subjects where students need additional support to catch up with their peers.
 - Personalized one-on-one tutoring and small group sessions to provide tailored learning support.
- Tuition Schedules: Flexible timing for evening and weekend classes to accommodate students' availability.
- Tutors: Experienced teachers or volunteer educators who are trained to work with children and adults from diverse backgrounds.

3.Adult Education & Skill Enhancement Workshops

- Curriculum:
 - Basic literacy (Reading, Writing, Arithmetic)
 - Vocational Skills (Computer Literacy, Language Skills, Soft Skills, Career Guidance)
 - Personal Development (Financial Literacy, Time Management, Stress Management)
- Schedule: Evening classes designed to work around the students' work or family commitments.
- Materials: Workbooks, digital resources, and practical workshops that enhance employability skills.



4.Volunteer and Teacher Engagement

- Teacher Recruitment: Engage local qualified teachers and volunteers who are passionate about education and community development.
- Corporate Volunteering: Encourage employees from partner companies to volunteer as tutors, mentors, or facilitators for the program.
- Training and Development: Provide teachers with training in handling the specific challenges of night school students, including motivational techniques and inclusive teaching methods.

5.Monitoring and Evaluation

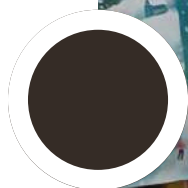
Christmas Sharing
