# President Report:

President Renfroe spoke on several topics at Branch 38 training session:

The deadline for the receipt of TA ballots has been moved to January 27, once ballots are received, it will take between 4 days to a week, to be tallied and certified. If approved, they will begin the process of calculating back pay. If disapproved, they will begin talks and go into arbitration.

They are currently working on a joint process for route adjustments.

Contract compliance, both National parties agree there is a problem, we will need to continue to enforce the contract with grievances while the problem is worked on by higher parties.

Union Official training for Shop Steward, better train to protect the carriers.

Safety is a point of emphasis. There is too much violence against letter carriers. Congressman Brian Fitzpatrick will be reintroducing a bill, the bill has bipartisan support and contains several areas.

Working on a National Standard across the country Heat Safety Standard. This proposed national standard is the ultimate solution to achieve that protection for letter carriers and other workers who are exposed to heat while on the job.
