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Sewing Machine Basics

Preparing Your Sewing Machine

Before we dive into sewing, let's review what you need to do to get your machine ready.

No need to stress there's no requirement to memorize every button or setting at this moment.

We will concentrate on the essentials that will help you sew with confidence.

In this section, you will discover:

- How to prepare your machine for sewing.
- How to load thread onto the spool.
- How to wind and insert the bobbin.
- How to get your machine ready to start sewing

💡 We won't go into detailed machine parts or settings here.

Most machines are similar, and this guide is meant to help you understand the process not overwhelm you.

Preparing Your Machine

- Making sure your machine is plugged in and placed on a flat surface
- Checking that your presser foot is up
- Making sure your needle is properly installed
- Getting ready to thread the machine and load the bobbin

Setting Up Your Thread (Spool & Bobbin)

This step helps your machine sew smoothly and prevents tangles or skipped stitches.

Take your time there's no rush.

On this step, you will:

- Learn where the thread spool sits on your machine
- Place the thread correctly so it feeds smoothly.
- Understand how the thread should unwind.
- Prepare the thread for the bobbin winding step.

What Is a Bobbin?

One from the bottom
(the bobbin)



The bobbin is a small spool that holds thread for the bottom of your stitches.
Your sewing machine uses two threads to sew:

Step 1: Find Your Bobbin

Most beginner machines use a clear plastic bobbin. Make sure you're using the correct bobbin type for your machine.

 **Tip: Using the wrong bobbin can cause tangling or thread jams.**

How to Wind the Bobbin

Step 1: Place the Bobbin on the Bobbin Winder

- Put the empty bobbin onto the bobbin winder pin.
- Push it gently until it clicks or locks into place.

Step 2: Guide the Thread to the Bobbin

- Pull the thread from the spool.
- Follow the guide on your machine that leads to the bobbin winder.
- Wrap the thread around the bobbin a few times by hand.

Step 3: Engage the Bobbin Winder

- Push the bobbin winder to the side (this tells the machine you're winding, not sewing).

Step 4: Use the Foot Pedal

- Gently press the foot pedal.
- Let the bobbin fill evenly don't rush.
- Stop once the bobbin is full (don't overfill).

Beginner Tip:

If the thread looks uneven or messy, stop and start again. This is normal and happens to everyone.

What Is A Spool?



One from the top
(the spool)

The spool holds the thread that feeds from the top of your sewing machine.

This is the thread you see and guide through the machine before it connects with the bobbin underneath.

Your sewing machine uses two threads at the same time:

- One from the top (the spool).
- One from the bottom (the bobbin).

Both have to be set up correctly for smooth stitching.

Now It's Time to Thread the Machine

Before we start sewing, we need to set up the top thread correctly. This helps your machine run smoothly and prevents tangles or skipped stitches. Take your time there's no rush.

Step 1: Secure the Thread Spool

- Place your thread spool onto the end the spool pin at the top of your machine
- Make sure the spool sits flat and can turn freely.

Step 2: Add the Spool Cap (If Your Machine Has One)

- Slide the spool cap onto the end of the spool pin to hold it he thread in place.
- The flat or slightly curved side should face the thread spool.
- This keeps the spool from wobbling or jumping while the machine is running.

👉 Not all machines use a spool cap if yours doesn't, that's okay. Just make sure the thread is secure.

Step 3: Guide the Thread Toward the Needle

- Once the spool is secure, gently pull the thread and follow the guides on your machine.
- Most machines have arrows, numbers, or small hooks showing the path the thread should take.
- Take it slow and move the thread through each guide in order don't skip any.

💡 Beginner Tip:

If you're unsure where the thread goes next, pause and look for arrows or numbers on your machine. They're there to help you.
